

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Fr. Joe is on vacation, so there will be no Pastor's Column this week. In place of his column, we will share details about the National Eucharistic Revival that is currently underway.

In June, as you may recall, we began a year of renewal to reinvigorate our belief and understanding as Catholics in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

As Catholics we understand *Real Presence* to mean that in the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest.

Christ is truly present -- body, blood, soul, and divinity -under the appearances of bread and wine, the glorified Christ who rose from the dead.

> I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world. John 6:51

National Eucharistic Revival VISION:

To renew the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

National Eucharistic Revival MISSION:

To inspire a movement of Catholics across the US who are **healed**, **converted**, **formed**, **and unified** by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist —and who are then sent out on mission "for the life of the world".

Scandal, division, disease, doubt. The Church has withstood each of these throughout our very human history. But today we confront all of them, all at once. Our response in this moment is pivotal.

In the midst of these roaring waves, **Jesus is present**, reminding us that he is more powerful than the storm. He desires to heal, renew, and unify the Church and the world.

How will he do it? By uniting us once again around the source and summit of our faith in the celebration of the Eucharist. The National Eucharistic Revival is the joyful, expectant, grassroots response of the entire Catholic Church in the U.S. to this divine invitation.

This three–year initiative launched in 2022 on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, or Corpus Christi. Renewal began at the diocesan level, inviting diocesan staff, bishops, and priests to "a renewed personal encounter with Jesus Christ"—particularly the transforming power and mercy of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.

After this year of preparation, the Year of Parish Revival began in June 2023—also on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. The year has been marked by historic initiatives, such as the first-ever National Eucharistic Pilgrimage. Grassroots creativity is springing up all over the country as love and devotion to Jesus in the Eucharist blossoms in the pews!

Then, in July 2024, America will gather for the first time in 83 years for a National Eucharistic Congress. This historic moment will launch the United States into a Year of Mission, sending on-fire Catholics out to share Christ's love "for the life of the world." We will continue to spread the Revival movement throughout the Church's 2025 Jubilee Year and beyond."





Scripture Study

As you progress along on your spiritual journey, is this the time to explore the Bible more fully?

The Scriptures are at the heart of our Catholic faith and every effort to know the Bible is an



effort to understand our faith. The Bible has the potential to deepen our relationship with God and transform our lives!

The next study for St Paul Scripture Study Ministry, which will begin the week of September 11 is The Book of Exodus (Part 1). Exodus is the central event of the entire Old Testament. Part 1 takes us through the first fifteen chapters of Exodusfrom slavery to the call of Moses, from plagues to crossing the Red Sea, from captivity to freedom in the Sinai. We discover that God hears those who are beaten down and liberates those who are in need of his justice. We follow the curriculum of Little Rock Scripture Study (littlerockscripture.org). It is designed to have the participant do a personal reading of the assigned chapters, reflect on it with some suggested questions, then meet with a small group to pray and share those reflections. The Scripture readings at Mass will take on a whole new perspective as you come to know the books authors and their intended audience, the connections between the Old and New Testaments and God's plan for our salvation. We truly hear the Word of God. Is this your time?---Plan to attend the informational meeting for this study on Wednesday, August 30th at 7:00 PM in the church hall. See page 7 for details.




Connecticut Catholic Men's Conference
