



Back in Kensington - While I was away I learned of some very happy news! Francis Volz, most of you know him as Bud, was accepted as an Aspirant into the Permanent Diaconate Program for the Archdiocese of Hartford. Bud will begin a five year formation program in September. In his first year as an aspirant, he will meet along with the other 14 men who have also been accepted into the program. Each candidate is evaluated after the Aspirancy year for their fitness for the next four years of Formation. We thank Bud for opening himself to the Lord's call. He is a wonderful candidate who has so much to offer the Church. Please keep Bud in your prayers as he begins his Aspirancy year. We pray for him as he endeavors to further discern the Lord's call, to grow in his spiritual life, and complete the associated academic requirements.

From the picture in last week's bulletin, you may think I was either at the shore or in Baltimore, or both, but not so. Rather, I was on the shores of Lake Erie at one of our Friaries just south of Buffalo. My timing of going to Buffalo coincided with one of our Friars being ordained a priest and another who made his solemn (final) profession of vows. Both occasions were wonderful celebrations. I did not catch any ball games since Toronto's AAA team, the Buffalo Bisons, were on the road while I was there. I did have occasion to console some friends who are Yankee fans.

Are You Someone or Do You Know Someone Who . . . has expressed an interest in becoming Catholic? Was baptized Catholic as a child, but has not celebrated the Sacraments of Eucharist or Confirmation?

If so, the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is a wonderful opportunity to come together in a small group to learn more about the Catholic faith. The RCIA sessions focus on the teachings and experience of the Church and prepare individuals to celebrate the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, that they have not yet received, at the Easter Vigil on March 30, 2024 so as to grow in their faith and become closer to God.

Maybe you were baptized, but never received 1st Holy Communion and Confirmation. Maybe you know someone who was baptized in another faith tradition, but has expressed interest in becoming Catholic. Maybe it is someone who has only just begun to think about a life of faith. I encourage all parishioners to think about and pray about someone who you think might be interested in the RCIA program. If you are not sure how to approach the person feel free to speak to one of the Friars.

Adults from all faith traditions, or no religious background at all, are welcome to participate. The sessions will be held on

Thursdays beginning on October 12. For information about the details of the RCIA program please contact Fr. Raymond at 860-828-0331 or frraymond@stpaulkensington.org.

Summer is Done - At least from the meteorological perspective, summer is done this week with the turn of the page of the calendar to September. And with September many parish programs and ministries will be going full throttle very soon. That is certainly the case for the youth of the parish as Saint Paul School opened for the 66th time last Thursday, and the Opening School Year Mass will be Tuesday at 8:45am. If you wish to attend, which you are most welcome to do, please sit at the back of the old wing.

Our Religious Education Program is also under way this weekend with the first Confirmation classes. Parents with children in Religious Ed should note in particular the upcoming Parent Meetings on page 6. Of course, if you have not yet registered your child please do so ASAP. As I write this we have filled three of the five catechist positions that were open. See page 5 for how you can be a catechist this year!

Programs are also getting underway for adults of the parish. I draw your attention to three of them: The Little Rock Scripture Study, That Man is You and Women of Faith can help you grow in your faith and deepen your spiritual life.

Little Rock Scripture Study - For the past several years, up to 50 to 60 parishioners have met in small groups of eight or so here at the parish to read, learn, reflect, and pray with the scriptures. Last year, after a few semesters reading the Gospels and The Acts of the Apostles they ventured to the beginning of the Bible and the Book of Genesis. This year they have decided to work with the second book of the Bible, Exodus. I encourage all parishioners to consider joining this group to strengthen your faith and knowledge of the Word of God. There is an Information Night this Wednesday, August 30th at 7 pm. Coming to the information night is NOT a commitment to the program, just an opportunity to learn more about this opportunity to enrich your faith. In addition to evening sessions, if there is enough interest again this year, there will also be an afternoon group. See page 6 for details.

That Man is You - All men are welcome to participate in this extraordinary program. The group meets on Saturday mornings at 7:00am, wrapping up around 8:15am. Two 13-week sessions are held each year with the fall session beginning September 23rd. Details will be in next week's bulletin. forward to the upcoming school year and Growing Greatness at SPS!








RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS



Scripture Study

As you progress along on your spiritual journey, is this the time to explore the Bible more fully?

The Scriptures are at the heart of our Catholic faith and every effort to know the Bible is an



effort to understand our faith. The Bible has the potential to deepen our relationship with God and transform our lives!

The next study for St Paul Scripture Study Ministry, which will begin the week of September 11 is The Book of Exodus (Part 1). Exodus is the central event of the entire Old Testament. Part 1 takes us through the first fifteen chapters of Exodus—from slavery to the call of Moses, from plagues to crossing the Red Sea, from captivity to freedom in the Sinai. We discover that God hears those who are beaten down and liberates those who are in need of his justice.

We follow the curriculum of Little Rock Scripture Study (littlerockscripture.org). It is designed to have the participant do a personal reading of the assigned chapters, reflect on it with some suggested questions, then meet with a small group to pray and share those reflections. The Scripture readings at Mass will take on a whole new perspective as you come to know the books authors and their intended audience, the connections between the Old and New Testaments and God's plan for our salvation. We truly hear the Word of God.




