



Eucharistic Renewal - The Bishops of the United States have developed a three year program to reinvigorate our belief and understanding as Catholics in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. As Catholics we understand Real Presence to mean that in the celebration of the Eucharist. bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit and the instrumentality of the priest. The whole Christ is truly present -- body, blood, soul, and divinity -- under the appearances of bread and wine, the glorified Christ who rose from the dead. You may recall that we began this renewal effort at the parish level beginning with the Feast of Corpus Christi (Latin for the Body of Christ) the weekend of June 10/11 with a Eucharistic Procession at the conclusion of the 4pm Mass that weekend. On the national level, this year will conclude in July 2024 with a Eucharistic Congress held in Indianapolis, Indiana where it is expected about 80,000 people will assemble.

About a month ago in this column I announced that our next event on the local level to help renew us spiritually in our belief and practice will occur the weekend of September 30/ October 1 and Monday evening, October 2. During those days we will welcome Steve Angrisano who will lead a one evening parish retreat with a focus on the Eucharist. He will also be an integral part of the Confirmation retreat on Sunday afternoon. He will also engage the students in the school. Steve Angrisano is an internationally recognized Catholic composer, presenter and passionate music missionary. He has traveled around the world for over two decades sharing his unique blend of humor, story and song. Steve will introduce himself and his music at all of the weekend Masses. On Monday evening he will lead us in prayer, song and reflection with the Eucharist as the focal point of the evening. I hope you have already marked October 2 on your calendar and that you will join us that evening.

Beginning today and on each 2nd Sunday of the month through June, except December, the homilies that weekend will focus on some Eucharistic theme. One of the Friar-priests or Deacon Don will give the homily at all of the Masses on a given weekend. A series of topics will be addressed throughout the year. It is our hope that this concentrated focus on the gift of Jesus himself in the Eucharist will help each of us appreciate and value how central the Eucharist is in our life as Catholics.

New EMHC and Readers are Needed - The parish is in need of additional Readers (Lector) or Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EMHC) to serve in these ministries at Mass. There will be a day of reflection and training session for new members of these ministries on Sunday, October 15 from 1:15 to 5:15 pm in the St. Paul Church Hall. Candidates for these ministries must meet the qualifications noted below. If you are interested in being an EMHC or Reader please contact Fr. Joe or the parish office so that you can secure the permission needed to attend the program on October 15. Current EMHC & Readers who were not able to complete their renewal of these ministries in February will receive a letter shortly and should plan on attending the 10/15 training.

EMHC are properly formed, instructed and commissioned lay persons who are appointed for a given parish community to aid in the distribution of Holy Communion at Mass and to the sick and homebound when ordinary ministers of Holy Communion are unavailable. **Readers** (Lectors) are lay persons commissioned to proclaim the readings from Sacred Scripture at Mass, not including the Gospel. Readers should possess the skills necessary for effective oral proclamation which is essential for this ministry.

Qualifications for EMHC and Readers: The Archbishop of Hartford regulates the ministry of EMHC and Readers in collaboration with the pastors of the parishes of the Archdiocese. EMHC and Readers are to meet the following qualifications:

- 1. Be at least 17 years of age
- 2. Have received the Sacrament of Confirmation
- 3. Have a continuing relationship with the parish and regularly participate in the Eucharist (attend Mass each weekend).
- 4. Strives to live a life consistent with the teachings of the Catholic Church
- 5. If married, are in a valid Catholic marriage
- 6. Have the Pastor's permission
- 7. Complete an online Virtus Training session
- 8. <u>Readers</u> must possess the skills needed for effective oral proclamation



Now when his fellow servants saw what had happened, they were deeply disturbed, and went to their master and reported the whole affair. His master summoned him and said to him. 'You wicked servant! I forgave you your entire debt because you begged me to. Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?' Then in anger his master handed him over to the torturers until he should pay back the whole debt. So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart."



Opening of the 2024 Mass Book

Visit our website for the 2024 Mass Book information page. Here is an overview:

Tier A will open on Tuesday, September 19 and runs until Friday, October 6 for the following wedding and death anniversary requests:

- 1. For those who are celebrating their 25, 40, 50, 55, 60, etc. wedding anniversary in 2024. These couples may reserve one Mass on a day of their choosing (does not have to be the actual anniversary date).
- 2. One Mass intention on the occasion of the 1st anniversary of death of a loved one. The date of the Mass does not have to be the actual death anniversary.
- The donation for the stipend must be submitted at the time the Mass is reserved. If the donation is not received by October 6 the date will be released. (Continued on the reverse side)

Tier B opens on Wednesday, October 11. Due to the large number of Mass intention requests, and so that as many parishioners as possible can have a reasonable opportunity to arrange to have a Mass said for their loved ones, parishioners will be limited to three (3) reserved dates per living or deceased person. These reserved dates may be three (3) weekday Masses or two (2) weekday and one (1) weekend Mass. Only one Mass per family is allowed on a weekend date. This restriction will be in place through November 30. This will allow everyone seven (7) weeks to arrange the Masses they would like for next year. The offering for the Mass(es) is due at the time the date is reserved.

Tier C will begin on Friday, December 1 when the limitations noted above will be lifted. Your understanding and cooperation is most appreciated as we try to accommodate as many parishioners and as many Mass requests as possible.


