PASTOR'S COLUMN

Equality Begins in the Womb - Every October, the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month. As Catholics, we are called to cherish, defend, and protect those who are most vulnerable, from the beginning to the end of their lives, and at every point in between. During the month of October, the Church asks us to reflect more deeply on the dignity of every human life. "Equality Begins in the Womb" is a phrase that highlights the dignity of human life in the womb. It reminds us that human equality is not limited by time, circumstance, nor phase of life. Abortion is a direct violation of this equality. By showing the inherent beauty of human life through all stages of embryonic development, we can illustrate how every life is unique and a gift regardless of racial background, gender, or disability. Included as an insert in this week's bulletin is an article published three years ago on the occasion of the 25th anniversary of the publication of Pope John Paul II's encyclical Evangelium Vitae, The Gospel of Life. As we continue through this month and the activities that our Culture of Life Ministry has planned (see page 6), let us reflect on this most basic right, the right to life. Let us be committed to defending life at all of its stages. I hope you will read the insert and reflect on how you work to defend all human life. One very concrete way is to support the collections for the pregnancy centers as they assist women who make the decision to bring the life in their womb to birth. Let us stand in solidarity with these women.

Steve Angrisano's Visit - It was gratifying to see the old wing full for the Evening of Reflection with Steve Angrisano. He was very well received and his talk, combined with music and anecdotes seemed to just come together and had an impact on those in attendance. The rousing standing ovation at the end attested to a very fine evening. My experience was that he had an easy way of intertwining the music, talking points, and anecdotes that seemingly out of nowhere came a moment of impact. I think that is what we mean by the working of the Holy Spirit. Robin Veronessi as the DRE did a lot of research leading up to the decision to bring Mr. Angrisano in and even more work on the logistics of his visit, so Robin thank you ever so much. I also offer special thanks to Mary Corrigan and her crew who did a very fine job in arranging for the soup and sandwiches and all of the work for the light supper ahead of time. The Italian wedding soup and the nice selection of sandwiches were a big hit with those who attended. I am very glad that the parish can provide this kind of experience for our parishioners. Thank you to everyone who attended and all who regularly support the parish thereby making this evening possible.

Various Collections Are Underway - *Thirty Thanksgiving Food Baskets* are being assembled for families in Berlin.

The baskets will also include \$25 gift cards to purchase a turkey and other perishables as well. In addition to the food donations, you can also help by making a donation to cover part or all of one of those gift cards. All of these donations have to be taken to the Town of Berlin Food Bank by November 4. Three Pregnancy Centers and the women and the newborns that are brought to term will be served by your donations as part of the 40 Days for Life that our Culture of Life Ministry is sponsoring through November 5 (see pg 6). College Care Packages are also being assembled for our collegians who are away at college. The hard deadline on this collection is Wednesday, October 25 since the boxes will be packed that evening. Trunk 'O Treat is this coming Saturday, October 21, and you can help provide candy for the masked, caped, and otherwise costumed trick or treaters! Lastly, but not least, is the ongoing food collection for our St. Clare Food Pantry. Whatever you can do for one or more these collections is so helpful to those who benefit from them. No one is expected to do everything, but it is really nice when everyone does something. I am sure the Lord will be well pleased.

The event is meant to gather all parishioners who in any way assisted the parish in its various ministries and parish organizations during the past year. This is a self-invite event meaning no individual invitations were sent out. Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick - We will celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick after all weekend Masses on November 4 & 5. I will have some reminders in the coming weeks about the Sacrament and who is eligible to receive the Sacrament, but recall that the Sacrament is not just for those who are imminently dying. If you are suffering with a chronic condition, serious medical problem, preparing for surgery, and/or the effects of aging, I invite you to plan to stay after Mass that weekend to be anointed. The service (about 15 minutes) will be done for all at once with each person being anointed individually.

2024 Mass Book - Tier B is now open through November 30. 


