



PASTOR'S COLUMN

Archbishop Christopher J. Coyne - On Monday, October 9, Archbishop Blair was the Principal celebrant of a Mass of Welcome for Archbishop Christopher James Coyne as he was installed as the Coadjutor Archbishop for the Archdiocese of Hartford. The Cathedral was filled to overflowing with people standing in the aisles for the Mass. About a dozen Bishops from other (arch)dioceses were present as well as newly created Cardinal Christophe Pierre, the Apostolic Nuncio to the US, in his roll as the Pope's representative in our country. It was he who read the official document from the Holy Father appointing Archbishop Coyne to eventually succeed Archbishop Blair here in Hartford and released him from his responsibilities as the Bishop of Burlington, VT where he had been serving for nearly nine years.

On Sunday evening October 8th, there was a Vespers Service at St. Thomas Seminary in Bloomfield to which the deacons of the Archdiocese, their wives or widows, as well as all of the religious Sisters, Brothers and Priests of the Archdiocese were invited. It was at the reception afterwards that I had a brief moment to offer my greetings and best wishes and welcome on our behalf to Archbishop Coyne. He was most gracious in his words of appreciation for the ministry of the deacons and religious serving in the Archdiocese. He said he looks forward to getting to know us and looks forward to being in ministry with and for us. In a letter this week from Archbishop Blair he said that Archbishop Coyne welcomes an invitation to come and visit parishes, and so I will be extending that invite for him to come and visit St. Paul Parish.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick - As previously announced, we will celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick after all of the weekend Masses on November 4 and 5. All of the Sacraments, including the Anointing of the Sick, assure us of God's accompaniment through life. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is considered a sacrament of healing and addresses the human reality that as humans we experience sickness, accidents, aging, and disease. While we pray for physical healing, we know that we will all eventually die. The most important healing is spiritual healing. In this case, Jesus offers us courage and strength to carry our cross of suffering as he carried His. The Sacrament is not just for those nearing death. So who can receive the Sacrament? To try to answer that question I share this excerpt from the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (1499-1532).

"The Anointing of the Sick is not a sacrament only for those who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for [them] to receive this sacrament

has certainly already arrived. If a sick person who received this anointing recovers [their] health, [they] can in the case of another grave illness receive this sacrament again. If during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious, the sacrament may be repeated. It is fitting to receive the Anointing of the Sick just prior to a serious operation. The same holds for the elderly whose frailty becomes more pronounced." I hope this helps. But if you are still wondering never think twice about asking one of the Friars.

After each Mass on the weekend of November 4 and 5, all to be anointed will be asked to come to the front of the new wing (or simply to the front of Sacred Heart) and be seated in EVERY OTHER row so that the priests can easily come to you for the laying on of hands and the actual anointing with the Oil of the Sick. Depending on the number to be anointed the service will likely take about 15 minutes.

I remind all parishioners that you can always approach one of the priests after Mass to ask to be anointed, especially if you know that you have surgery coming up. You can also always call the parish office and arrange for a priest to come to administer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for yourself or a loved one. Human frailty is a part of the reality of life; our loving God is with us through this sacrament to strengthen us when our minds or bodies grow weak. Come and receive the grace the Sacrament offers you.

All Saints Day (November 1st) - Holy Day of Obligation -Looking ahead to next week and for your planning purposes. a reminder that Wednesday, November 1st is the Feast of All Saints and a Holy Day of Obligation which obliges all of the faithful to attend Mass on that day. The Mass schedule will include a Vigil Mass on Thursday, October 31st at 4:00 pm (note the earlier time). On November 1st Masses will be at 7:00 am, 8:45 am (School Mass - ALL are welcome to attend), 12 Noon and 7:00 pm. All Saints Day is the day we as Catholics celebrate all the saints, known and unknown. "We believe in the communion of all the faithful of Christ, those who are pilgrims on earth, the dead who are being purified, and the blessed in heaven, all together forming one Church; and we believe that in this communion, the merciful love of God and his saints is always [attentive] to our prayers." (Catechism of Catholic Church #962)

Memorial Masses - Our annual Parish Memorial Mass for all those who died over the last year will be held on All Souls Day Thursday, November 2nd at 7:00 p.m. The next of kin for all who died since October 2022 through September 2023 should have received a letter inviting all family and friends of the deceased to attend this Mass. If you did not receive a letter contact the parish office. ALL parishioners are invited to attend this Mass to pray for our beloved deceased and for those who mourn their passing.

The Ladies' Guild's yearly Memorial Mass will be held on Wednesday, November 8 at 6:30 pm and the Saint Paul School Memorial Mass is on Monday, November 13 also at 6:30 pm. On the days of these Memorial Masses, that is November. 2, 8 & 13, there will not be a Mass at 5:00 pm.






