

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Welcome Archbishop Coyne! - We are very happy that Coadjutor Archbishop Christopher James Coyne is with us this weekend to celebrate the 4:00pm Mass on Saturday as he begins to get to know the Archdiocese. In addition to what has already been published in this space see page 4 for some more information about Archbishop Coyne who will eventually succeed Archbishop Blair as the Archbishop of Hartford.

Anointing of the Sick This Weekend - The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be celebrated after all Masses this weekend. Mass will take place as usual and then after the closing hymn is finished (the Altar Servers will process out without the celebrant) those wishing to stay and receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will move to the front of the **new wing** (at Sacred Heart just come to the front of church) and be seated in EVERY OTHER row so that the priests can easily come to you for the laying on of hands and the actual anointing with the Oil of the Sick which will take place on your foreheads and the palm of your hands.

Access the Sound System at St. Paul's Through Your Mobile Phone - With the upgrades that we have made to the sound system at St. Paul's, you can now use your mobile phone to pick up what is coming through the sound system through an app on your mobile phone. For those who have Bluetooth-capable hearing aids or who use earbuds, follow these steps to hear the sound system through your phone.

STEP 1: When you come into the church at St. Paul's go to **Settings** on your phone and from **wifi** select *SP Guest* and enter this Password: **WifiForGuest!**

STEP 2: Download the **WaveCAST** app from the Apple App Store for iOS devices including an iPhone or download the **WaveCAST** app from the Google Play Store for Android devices.

STEP 3: Open the **WaveCAST** app and select **ST PAUL HEARING ASSIST** and audio should start automatically through your phone when the sound system is in use. Use your phone's volume controls to adjust the volume level.

Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Mass Schedules -I share this well in advance for your planning purposes for your family Christmas gatherings. Since Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday this year, there will be an adjustment to the weekend Mass schedule on Dec. 23 & 24. The Sunday Vigil Mass on December 23rd will be held as usual at 4:00 pm. The December 24th Sunday morning Mass schedule will consist of just three Masses at St. Paul Church at 7:30am, 9:00am and 10:30am. On the morning of Dec. 24, there will not be a Mass at Sacred Heart Church nor a 12 Noon Mass at St. Paul. On Christmas Eve in the evening, three Masses will be celebrated at St. Paul's at 4:00pm, 6:00pm & 10:00pm. On Christmas Day at St. Paul, Masses will be celebrated at 8:00am, 10:00am and 12 Noon. Mass will also be celebrated on Christmas Day at Sacred Heart at 9:30am.

Our school community had a great time last week celebrating Halloween with a costume parade, Boo Bash, Middle School Dance and Trunk or Treat!





Here is an overview of what our Confirmation students are learning this morning:

Grade 9 - Who is Jesus?

Opening Prayer: Jesus, you have said, "I am the way and the truth and the life" (John 14:6). We ask you for the strength to follow you, the wisdom to know you, and the grace to live the life you wish to share with us. We want to know you. Open our hearts and minds to all that you want to show us about yourself in our time together.

After their video lessons, in their smallgroup discussions, students will discuss who Jesus is, the evidence for Jesus, and why Jesus came to us.



Grade 10 - "Are you talking to me?" (Getting to Know God Through Prayer)

For today's opening prayer, students are reminded that "since prayer is a simple conversation with God, being able to pray informally, from the heart, is very important." This morning students will take turns thanking Jesus for one or two things, and asking Jesus for one or two things that he or she or a loved one needs.



After their video lessons, in their small-group discussions, students will discuss what prayer is, how to pray, and what happens when we pray.



PASTORAL COUNCIL—OCTOBER MEETING MINUTES

The Pastoral Council met on Monday, October 23, 2023. In attendance were Fathers Joe and Martin, Mary Corrigan, Bud Volz, Betty Lasker, Roland Baikal, Maura Chasse, Dwight Davis, Ron Levandowsky, Fayne Malloy, Ed Schmitt, Nancy Timbrell and Jill Conaway.

Council members received updates on previously held and future activities within the parish. The Eucharistic Revival with Steve Angrisano was very positively received by parishioners, the Confirmation students, and students in our school. Father Joe hopes to be able to offer more of this type of activity.

Jill Conaway, principal of St. Paul's School, presented a report highlighting the September enrollment numbers. As of September, there were a total of 238 students in PK3 to grade 8. There is an ongoing outreach through social media and news outlets in an effort to increase enrollment in grades 1 to 8. Currently school families with siblings in the upper grades are being afforded priority for preschool and Kindergarten slots. The Pre-K3 and Kindergarten classes for next year have waiting lists.

Jill went on to acknowledge the new hires this year as well as reiterating the generous donations the school has recently received. These donations resulted in the school being outfitted with all new classroom furniture, the resurfacing of the playground, new cafeteria tables and upgraded technology in some classrooms.

Up and coming events include the Parishioner Appreciation Social on October 29th, Italian Night on November 4th, Anointing of the Sick following each of the Masses on November 4th and 5th, a Coffee And after the next Children's Mass on Nov. 19th, Memorial Masses for the parish, Ladies Guild, Knights of Columbus and the school, Greccio, lighting of the parish green, and Breakfast with Santa, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus. Father Joe announced that each family in the parish will be receiving, by mail, a schedule of the Masses and activities throughout the Advent and Christmas season as well as a letter explaining the parish's end of the year appeal.

Nancy Timbrell reported on St. Clare's Food Pantry and the increased number of families that it is currently serving. Through the generosity of food and monetary donations from parishioners, over 150 individuals/families have benefited from the ministry. This Thanksgiving the parish is sponsoring 30 families in town with the fixings for a traditional holiday dinner. As a result of the generous monetary donations that have been made, each recipient will also receive a \$25 gift card that can be used to purchase items of their choosing.

The Social Action Committee will once again be putting 800 angels on our Angel Trees. There will also be 50 "sox" on the tree with the opportunity to donate items that will help support New England Underground that assists those escaping the tyranny of trafficking.

Robin Veronesi submitted a written report to the council highlighting that there are currently 572 students enrolled in the Religious Education Program. This is the highest number the parish has had since the 2019-20 school year (pre-COVID). Robin recently attended the National Community of Catholic Leaders Convocation. Participants worked together to develop practical strategies and approaches to shape catechesis in parish communities that address the challenges faced today and to provide a foundation for the future.

Each of the four sub-committees of the Pastoral Council, Spiritual Life and Worship, Parish & Community Outreach, Youth, Family and Community Life, and Evangelization and Faith Formation, gave a quick summary of their accomplishments and action plans for the up and coming year. Details of planned events will be published in the bulletin.

Each of the Adult Faith Formation Groups, the Scripture Study, Adult Confirmation and RCIA, the Men's Groups and Women of Faith are up and running with active participation by many parishioners.

Father Joe indicated that the Finance Committee will be meeting on Wednesday, Oct. 25th at which time they will receive the first quarter fiscal report of the parish. The parish continues to be in excellent financial shape with income and expenses within our proposed and actual budgets.

Father continued by sharing that approximately \$45,900 was grossed at this year's Berlin Fair. Expenses are totaling within the \$22,000 to \$23,000 range placing our profit margin at over \$20,000, within the budget projections. Final numbers are still being tabulated.

The next Pastoral Council meeting is scheduled for Monday, November 27th in the church hall. All parishioners are invited to attend.


