

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Appreciation Reception Recap - Two weeks ago the parish hosted over a 100 parishioners to share some food, drink and fellowship while acknowledging all of the good works that they had done throughout the year. God indeed blesses us with so many parishioners who are willing to share that most precious commodity, time, as well as a wide a variety of gifts. It is indeed in those moments that we best represent the one Body of Christ. Different gifts, different talents, but all in service of the one Body of Christ. My thanks goes out to the entire Pastoral Council for sponsoring and organizing this event. Special thanks to Mary Corrigan for chairing our Afternoon of Appreciation. I also want to recognize Michael's Catering of New Britain who handled the food and provided a delicious array of food.

Readers and EMHC - Congratulations and thanks to all our new and renewed Readers and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC) who are being formally commissioned at all of the Masses this weekend. In October we held a training and afternoon of renewal for our veteran Readers and EMHC and those who were new to these ministries. In the name of all of us I thank these parishioners for answering the Spirit's call to these ministries and sharing with all of us the gifts and talents that God has shared with them. This brings the total number of EMHC to 55 and Readers to 32.

Anointing of the Sick - Last weekend about 274 people received the Sacrament of the Sick after all of the Masses. While we were happy to share the grace of this Sacrament with so many, know that the priests are always available to anoint when needed. If you know you are going in for major surgery either call the parish office or see a priest after Mass if you need to be anointed. If a loved one has become weaker or advanced in illness or has been newly diagnosed do not wait to call for a priest to come and anoint you or a loved one. It is best for the sacrament to be administered while the person being anointed can participate in the rite. Recall too that if someone is admitted to the hospital the family has to inform us since the hospitals do not share that information because of HIPAA regulations.

Lighting of the Advent Wreath - Advent begins in three weeks on December 3rd. At the beginning of each weekend Mass we will light the candles on our Advent Wreath. Once again this year we would like to invite parishioners to participate in the lighting of the Advent Wreath. This is open to everyone. We especially encourage families with children to participate. This will be done at each weekend Mass for all four Sundays of Advent. You may sign up online or by stopping in the sacristy before or after Mass. The signup link is posted on the main page of our website.

Charity Starts at Home - If you know of a family in the parish or in the neighborhood who is in need of help please let us know. You can put their name and address on a piece of paper and drop it off at the office or put it in the collection basket or mail it in to the parish office.

Angel Giving Tree - The Angel Giving Tree will be set up before Masses next weekend (Nov. 18/19). You are invited to take an angel(s) from the tree and buy the item(s) listed so that the recipient(s) will be able to share a bit of joy in receiving a gift at Christmas that they would not otherwise receive. This outreach to the less fortunate is part of the good work that our Social Action Ministry undertakes. A small tree will also be set up at Sacred Heart. Sacred Heart Church is open for private prayer on Sundays from 8 am to 12 pm, Wednesdays from 5:00 to 8:15 pm, Fridays from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm, and on Saturdays from 9:00 to 11:00 am. There will also be some angels on line as of November 19th. All gifts need to be received by December 10.

Thanksgiving Schedule - The Parish Center office will be closed Wednesday, Thursday and Friday (Nov. 22-24) for the Thanksgiving holiday. There will be one Mass Thanksgiving Day at 9 am and one Mass the day after Thanksgiving at 8am.


