



First Sunday of Advent



"Let the Church always be a place of MERCY and HOPE, where EVERYONE is WELCOMED. LOVED and FORGIVEN."

PASTOR'S COLUMN

O Come, O Come Emmanuel - Advent is the time when we prepare to remember Jesus' first coming as well as to prepare for His second coming. It is a season of Hope. These first weeks of Advent continue the theme we have had the last few weeks of the liturgical year. That is, the coming of Jesus again at the end of time. Then in the latter part of Advent we recall all of the marvelous events that led up to Jesus being born one like us. This year our time of Advent is very short. The 4th Sunday of Advent is Christmas Eve and so we only have three weeks and one day of Advent this year! So how do we best use this time of Advent to be watchful and ready as our Gospel today advises us?

Do not allow the hustle and bustle to completely take over your life. Take a deep breath and be more attentive to your personal prayer. To give you a bit of assistance, the ushers will be passing out a copy of the Magnificat Advent **Companion** booklet to each parishioner as you leave Mass this weekend. I hope you will find it useful. A very simple prayer to use for Advent is "Come, Lord Jesus." Come, Lord Jesus in the moments I am tempted to leave you out of the most hectic part of my day. Come, Lord Jesus when my hope wains and I do not trust in your promises and try to rely too much on myself. Come, Lord Jesus when I... Consider a few concrete things that you can do get your spiritual house better prepared to welcome Him? See the next item and avail yourself to His love and mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. If we can make good use of Advent, short as it is this year, we will certainly be better prepared to celebrate the day of his birth in Bethlehem on December 25th.

Mercy Mondays - Pope Francis said: "Have you thought about God's patience, the patience he has with each one of us? That is his mercy. He always has patience, patience with us, he understands us, he waits for us, he does not tire of forgiving us if we are able to return to him with a contrite heart." (Angelus, 3/17/2013) The Sacrament of Reconciliation helps us realize the truth of this observation by Pope Francis. No matter the length of time away, the sins committed, the repeated nature of some sins, God's mercy has no limits and no sin need go unforgiven. So I invite you to make a good confession before Christmas. Four confessors will be available on Mondays, December 4, 11 & 18 from 7 to 8 pm. I remind you that we also hear confessions every Saturday from 8:30 to 9:30 am and again from 3 to 4 pm. On the Mercy Mondays we will also have Eucharistic Adoration. These Holy Hours are in addition to the Tuesday Holy Hours (4 to 5 pm).

Angel Giving Tree - The response, once again this year, to this initiative of our Social Action Ministry has been very heartwarming. There are more angels to be taken, but there is just one week left as all gifts need to be received by next Sunday, December 10th.

Feast of the Immaculate Conception - Friday, December 8th



is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception and a Holy Day of Obligation. The patron of our nation is Mary under her title of the Immaculate Conception, so ask Mary to intercede for our country in special way this week.

There will be a Vigil Mass at 4 pm on Thursday, December 7.

On Friday, December 8 there will be Masses at 7 am, 8:45 am (School Mass-all are welcome), 12 Noon, and 7 pm.

There will **not** be a 5 pm Mass on December 7 & 8.

Would You Like to Come to Mass with Me? - Hopefully you have already received in your home my Christmas letter and a copy of our full Advent and Christmas liturgical schedule. An additional copy of the Liturgical Schedule is included as an insert in today's bulletin. I suspect that we all know someone who does not attend Mass any longer. It might be a family member or neighbor who has been away from the Church for awhile. Maybe it is someone who is just going through a difficult time and is struggling in their faith. Maybe the Lord wants to use you to reach out to them with His love and words of welcome. Invite them to come to Mass with you and sit with them. You could also share with them our schedule and let them decide what Mass they would like to attend if coming together with you is not possible. Additional copies of the schedule are also available near the bulletins. Take as many as you need and freely share them.

Retirement Fund for Religious - Next weekend there is a second collection for the Retirement Fund for Religious. There is a bulletin insert this week explaining the collection. The Franciscan Friars who staff St. Paul Parish are among the religious communities who benefit from this collection. Please support the collection as your means allow as an expression of gratitude for the ways you may have benefitted from the ministry of religious priests, brothers and sisters over the years. 




