

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Parish Youth Ministry - Joshua Kay, our new Director of Youth Ministry, introduced himself a few weeks ago during all of the Masses at St. Paul and will do so at Sacred Heart this weekend. The semester break college dinner was held successfully last week. As an insert in today's bulletin is information for our *Life Teen* program for all high school students as well as *Edge*, which is the program for middle school students. I encourage all of our youth to come and see if this is something that you might like. Invite your friends to join you. To the parents of these youth, please encourage your children to participate. In that they rely on you for transportation please make this sacrifice on their behalf and to support our endeavors to reach out and provide programs that will be a help to them in all aspects of their young lives. Saint Paul School Open House - In conjunction with the beginning of Catholic Schools Week on Sunday, January 28th, our school will have an Open House for prospective students and their families from 11:00 pm to 1:00 pm. We will begin Catholic Schools Week at the 9:00 am Mass. Please help spread the word and encourage young families to come and see the quality of the education that their child will receive at Saint Paul School.

Mass Attendance and Winter Weather - Last weekend was our first snow of the season and the first significant snow in almost two years. In anticipation of the snow on Sunday, many many parishioners who normally attend Mass on Sunday came to the 4 pm Mass on Saturday. It was almost as full as it was on Christmas Eve! That was a good and thoughtful decision on their part. Depending on the timing of storms, that adjustment to your regular schedule might not always be able to be made. So I share this with you as a reminder concerning the obligation to attend Mass when weather conditions make travel hazardous. While the obligation to attend Mass each weekend and Holy Day of Obligation must be taken very seriously the other side of the coin is our use of prudence when the weather or illness might impede our attendance. Canon Law of the Catholic Church (1247) states that on Sundays and other Holy Days of Obligation, the faithful are obliged to participate in the Mass. However, the law does not expect the impossible nor can the fulfillment of the obligation be overly burdensome or dangerous. So while the Masses will almost always take place at St. Paul because the Friars live next door, and the Mass intention has to be satisfied, that does not mean that you should risk life or injury to attend. This is all the more the case for weekday Masses when there is no obligation to attend. In the case of the Mass at Sacred Heart, should conditions not make it safe for one of the Friars to travel that Mass would be canceled.

If you cannot attend, spend some extra time in personal prayer and/or watch Mass on TV or through our website. Be sure to be prudent and safe in your decisions.

Thanks! - As noted above, many came to the 4 pm Mass last Saturday, and while attendance was sparse on Sunday, I do want to thank the altar servers and their parents, Readers, EMHC, ushers, and music ministers who were able to attend and with their assistance all of the Masses carried on normally. I am grateful for your dedication and service and I am certain the Lord is as well.

+Most Rev. Joachim Giermek, OFM Conv. - On Friday, January 5th, one of our Franciscan Friars of the Our Lady of the Angels Province, Fr. Joachim Giermek, died peacefully at the age of 80 in Ellicott City, MD after a long illness. Born as Thomas on April 2, 1943 in Buffalo, NY, Fr. Joachim in 2001 was elected the Minister General of the Conventual Franciscan Friars thus becoming the 118th successor of St. Francis of Assisi. Just as Pope Francis is the successor of St. Peter, Fr. Joachim was the successor of St. Francis. Fr. Joachim was in his 81st year of life, 63rd as a Friar, and 55th as a priest. Eternal rest, grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace. Amen.

Moveable Feast Dates - I know we just finished the Christmas season, but in just one month Lent will begin. Ash Wednesday is February 14th which means that Easter will be March 31st, which is about a week earlier than last year. And how is the date for Easter determined? Easter is the first Sunday, after the first full moon, after the first day of spring (the vernal equinox). The earliest Easter can be is March 22 and the latest is April 25. So Easter is on the early side of the calendar this year. We did not have a white Christmas, but will Easter be white?! No, that is not a prediction, just a musing!

St. Valentine's Day Alert - As noted above, for those planning to make St. Valentine's Day special with a nice dinner out that evening, please note that February 14th this year is also Ash Wednesday and thus a day of fast and abstinence.

Christmas Collection - I would like to highlight, acknowledge and give thanks to everyone who made a special monetary gift to the parish through your Christmas offering! The in-pew collection was \$20,027. When the online (\$2,784) and the donations dropped off at the office or sent through the mail (\$9,736) are included the total for the Christmas collection as of Jan 8th was \$32,547. These special gifts at Christmas are very important to the parish and are so very much appreciated. **Thank you!! Your generosity is a wonderful testimony of your faith!**
