



PASTOR'S COLUMN

Sunday of the Word of God - "When the Sacred Scriptures are read in the Church, God himself speaks to his people, and Christ, present in his word, proclaims the Gospel" (GIRM, no. 29).

In 2019 Pope Francis instituted the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time (today) as "Word of God Sunday" to highlight and bring to the forefront of our minds the importance to know, study and reflect on Sacred Scripture, the Old and New Testaments, the Word of God. In many ways it is complimentary to *Corpus Christi* Sunday when we highlight the centrality of the Eucharist. St. Jerome, the great biblical scholar said, "Ignorance of the Scriptures is ignorance of Christ."

One of the more routine, and maybe least thought about gestures that we do at Mass, is as the Gospel is introduced by the Deacon or Priest. He says, "A reading from the Holy Gospel according to ______, and we say "Glory to you, O Lord." While we say those words we also make three (3) signs of the Cross with our thumb on our forehead, lips, and heart (chest). Quietly to ourselves we are to say: May the Word of the Lord be on my mind, on my lips, and in my heart. But why do we do this? We are not to be passive in hearing the word of God. I am called to engage it with my mind, profess it with my lips, and allow it to mold my heart to be like the Lord's which means I allow the word of God to influence my will and thus my actions, attitudes, etc.

So what can we do to help ourselves to allow the word of God at Sunday Mass to have that kind of effect in our life? As simple as it might sound, it begins with listening, listening attentively. We can help ourselves listen by doing what Pope John Paul II suggested in his Instruction Dies Domini (The Lord's Day) concerning the Sunday readings: those who take part in the Eucharist should reflect beforehand upon the word of God which will be proclaimed. He adds that if we do not, "it is difficult for the liturgical proclamation of the word of God alone to produce the fruit we might expect" (no. 40). You can do that by making an effort to read that week's scripture readings BEFORE coming to Mass. Some parishioners have personal subscriptions to Magnificat, or The Word Among Us, or other similar publications, but the readings are also available online for free. I think the most convenient sight is https:// bible.usccb/org which brings you to each day's readings. By doing this, it is a bit like tilling the soil in your garden before you plant some seeds. In this case, you prepare your soul to receive the Word of God.

Having heard the word of God through attentive listening we then might be in a better place to allow the Word to influence our actions and give us more confidence to share it with others. Do you feel the Lord calling you to learn even a little bit more? Then I encourage you to join our **Scripture Study Group** which has about 50 to 60 active participants that meet in smaller groups of about eight people or so. Last fall, they finished their study and reflection on the first part of the Book of Exodus and in early March will begin a brief four session study on the second part of the Book of Exodus that will wrap up on April 25. National Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children - In all Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 is to be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. Much like Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, we are called to observe this day with penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/or giving alms. So treat this Monday like you would Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by fasting and having only one full meal and two smaller ones, or donate to a place that supports women who bring their unborn children to birth and offer up those sacrifices for the defense of all human life from womb to tomb.

The Connecticut March for Life will be held on Wednesday, March 20, 2024 in Hartford. There will be a rally at the Capitol at Noon followed by the March for Life around Bushnell Park. More information on the CT March for Life can be found at https://marchforlife.org/connecticut/.

His Sacrifice, and ours! - The 2023 Archbishop's Annual Appeal, His Sacrifice, and ours!, concluded on December 31. The total pledges and donations from 516 St. Paul parishioners in 2023 was \$114,653.64!! This was 106% of our parish goal of \$108,000! Archbishop Blair recently wrote to express his gratitude. Please communicate my heartfelt gratitude to your parishioners for their generous response, and be assured of my prayers and best wished for you and for everyone at St. Paul Parish. May God grant you a blessed 2024."

An examination of the results tell us that the average gift was \$222. I offer a special nod to the 21 parishioners who made a gift to the Appeal for the first time and to the 56 who renewed their giving last year after not making a gift in 2022.



Word of God Sunday-January 21st

Pope Francis designated the Third Sunday in Ordinary time as "Sunday of The Word of God" in an apostolic letter in 2019. In his letter, he stated that "the Bible is the book of the people". "It is God's Word for each and every one of us--and for all of us together as one Body". The Pope also stated that this designation will be celebrated all year long because "God's Word is a priority and a light for our path every day--not just on the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time"!

It's not too late to make your most important New Year's resolution-to open the Bible and read God's word. Reading the Bible can sound overwhelming to many of us because it's such a big book—where do I start? I propose that we begin with chapter 1 of John's Gospel because it is appropriate for Word of God Sunday.

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made. In Him was life, and the life was the light of men. (John 1:1-4)

The Apostle John reminds us that Jesus, the only begotten son of God, has existed with God from the beginning of time. In fact he uses Word as a synonym for Jesus Christ as he begins his Gospel. John knew his readers, at the end of the first century, would be familiar with the Word or Logos in the Greek translation so he chose Word to communicate who Jesus Christ is—the communication of God to humankind. We could not have come to know God as we do today had it not been for His Word. That Word, Jesus Christ, was—and is—God's Word to us.

Our scripture study groups will continue studying The Book of Exodus, Part 2 in March. Sharing and reflecting on the scriptures in small groups of around 8 people is the hallmark of our study program here at St. Paul's. There will be articles in the bulletin in February and an informational meeting on February 20th, so stay tuned to learn more. In the meantime I encourage you to spend time in the Bible and see how God reveals himself to you.




