

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Catholic Schools Week & Saint Paul School Open House: Catholic Schools Week begins today with the 9:00 am Mass where students will fill some of the liturgical roles. Also, a student will speak briefly after Communion at each of the Masses. The school will hold an Open House from11:00 am to 1:00 pm. Encourage others to come and check out Saint Paul School. Even though the school was opened 66 years ago, the school has been kept up to date and modern with the tools that the students of today need as they are prepare to go onto high school. Students receive personalized attention in the classroom in a safe and caring atmosphere. Most importantly, though, they receive a Catholic education where our Catholic/Christian values are reinforced in school.

Saint Paul School 2nd Collection - This weekend there is a 2nd collection in support of Saint Paul School. This is a local collection and so ALL of the proceeds go directly to our school. Please be as generous as your means allow.

Save the Dates - Our Parish Lenten Evening of Reflections will be held on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evening, March 5 - 7. Three sisters from the Franciscan Sisters of the Eucharist in Meriden will lead the Reflections. Each of the three sisters will lead a different evening. In this Eucharistic Revival year, the talks will have a Eucharistic theme. Mass those evenings will be at 6:30 pm followed by the talks. A complete schedule will come later.

Annual End of the Year Donations - Since my last update a few weeks ago, another 36 donors have made gifts totaling \$4,166. So as of January 22nd, 380 donors have made their Annual End of the Year gift to the Parish which to date totals \$78,699!! The average gift is \$207. As of the same date last year, there are 15 fewer donors with the total is just over \$200 ahead of last year. Thank you very much to all who have made a gift!! It is not too late to make a gift, so please consider doing so if your means allow. *ALL gifts are important and appreciated.* The Donor Honor Roll will be published in the February 18 bulletin.

Cash Donations to St. Clare Food Pantry - Over the course of the year, more than a few people make cash donations to our Food Pantry. Because of this generosity we were able to distribute additional food beyond what was donated by those who bring food to the pantry. Those contributions continue to be very generous. The St. Clare volunteers purchased over \$2,000 worth of various basic food staples to supplement the weekly donations. This was needed because of the increased number of people coming every other week for food. The biweekly average is around 125 with some weeks even exceeding that number. In addition to the regular food staples, with the help of Big Y, we were able to purchase 180 turkey breasts before Thanksgiving and a similar number of hams

prior to Christmas. The combined cost of the turkey breasts and hams was over \$5,600. The other way that we make use of your generosity is through the distribution of gift cards. Before, during and after the holidays, \$8,750 in gift cards will have been distributed. So altogether more than \$16,000 of your cash donations was used to purchase the food and gift cards. Additional food will be purchased in the coming weeks to supplement your food donations. We can do these extras because of your generosity. Thanks to all our parishioners who so faithfully and generously support our St. Clare Food Pantry!! Please never hesitate to let us know of someone who might be in need of help.

Dates Set for Confirmation and 1st **Communion -** Three years ago Archbishop Blair decided that ALL Confirmations in the Archdiocese would be held at the Cathedral of St. Joseph going forward. This year our 10th graders will be Confirmed on Saturday, April 20 at 10:00 am. There will be students from other parishes at that same Confirmation at the Cathedral. Prior to COVID, our 1st Holy Communion candidates received for the first time at one of the weekend Masses. After having done this in separate Masses on a Saturday morning or afternoon the last three years, the students will once again receive their 1st Holy Communion at a regular weekend liturgy on the weekends of May 4/5 and May 11/12.

Holy Family Passionist Retreat Center - The Passionist Retreat Center in West Hartford offers many opportunities for retreats during the year. They have given me a \$325 voucher for any <u>man</u> who has never made a retreat there. Call or send me an email and I will pass it on to you.

What to do with Old Palms? - You may bring your old palms to church the next two weekends so that they can be burnt and used for ashes on Ash Wednesday. Just leave them in the vestibules before coming into the church itself. You may also burn them on your own and put them in your garden or a flower bed, but since the palms are blessed, they should **not** be discarded in the trash.

Ash Wednesday Schedule - For your planning purposes, Masses on Ash Wednesday, February 14th will be celebrated at 7 am, 8:45 am (School Mass - ALL are welcome), 12 Noon, 5 pm and 7 pm. Ashes will be distributed at all of the Masses.

Helping Hands - A couple weeks ago we sent out letters to over 300 parishioners who have reached their 80th birthday informing them about our *Helping Hands Ministry* which provides support to our senior citizens, some of whom are alone or homebound or separated from their loved ones. *Helping Hands* does this by assisting with some of their needs like making a run to the pharmacy or some grocery shopping.




