



PASTOR'S COLUMN

Ash Wednesday Mass Schedule Lent begins this Wednesday, February 14th. Masses on Ash Wednesday will be celebrated at 7 am, 8:45 am (School Mass - ALL are welcome), 12 Noon, 5:00 pm and 7:00 pm.



A reminder: Ash Wednesday is a day of Fast and Abstinence.

See page 7 for a full explanation and our entire schedule for Lent.

World Marriage Day - This 2nd Sunday of February, in advance of St. Valentine's Day on Wednesday, is *World Marriage Day*. The day had a grass roots beginning in Louisiana in 1981 as "We Believe in Marriage Day" and was celebrated on St. Valentine's Day. Two years later it was moved to the second Sunday of February and renamed *World Marriage Day*. In 1993 Pope John Paul II imparted his Apostolic Blessings on World Marriage Day.

The covenant of marriage is a promise of spouses to be faithful to each other "for better, for worse; for richer, for poorer; in sickness, in health" but it is also a sign of God's faithfulness to and never-ending love for every married couple and their families. As Catholics we have all benefitted from the sacred covenant of marriage which is the foundation of our families, of society as a whole, and of the Church. Families are domestic churches where faith and love are shared, nurtured, and deepened. It is the place where each one of us then finds his/ her own vocation in life as a single person, priest or religious, or as one who is married. Therefore, we join in prayer for all married couples. May they be strengthened, nourished and sustained by God's love and grace and also by this parish community of St. Paul's. So we pray this prayer to Saint Valentine: Dear Saint and glorious martyr, teach us to love unselfishly and to find great joy in giving. Enable all married couples to bring out the best in each other. Let them love each other in God, and in God, love each other. Amen.

Stations of the Cross - Are you familiar with the Stations of the Cross? When was the last time that you took notice of them on the walls of our churches? From the earliest of days, followers of Jesus told the story of his passion, death and resurrection. When pilgrims came to see Jerusalem, they were anxious to see the sites where Jesus had been including the way he took up to Calvary. Following in the footsteps of the Lord along the *Via Crucis* (Way of the Cross) or *Via Dolorosa* (Sorrowful Way), became an important part of the pilgrimage visit. The stations, as we know them today, came about when it was no longer easy or even possible to visit the holy sites.

Lent is a very appropriate time to pray the Stations of the Cross, though they can be prayed any time during the year. By praying the Stations we make a little pilgrimage along the Via Dolorosa being reminded of just how much Jesus went through on his way to Calvary and just how much he loves us. I invite you to join us in praying the Stations during Lent. Once again this year we will pray the Stations each Friday of Lent at 7 pm at St. Paul Church. The school children come over at 2:00 pm to pray the stations on Friday afternoons Feb. 23, March 1, 8, and 15 and on Thursdays Feb. 15 and March 21. Everyone is most welcome to attend these Stations, just know that they are geared to the children. I encourage you not to pass up these opportunities to contemplate, and enter into the mystery of Jesus' love for you.

Lenten Evenings of Reflections - We will have a three night series of reflections for Lent on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, March 5, 6 and 7. The speakers this year will be three Franciscan Sisters of the Eucharist from Meriden. In this year of the Eucharistic Revival, each Sister will delve into a different focus on the Eucharist. The evening will begin at 6:30 with Mass celebrated by one of the Friars who will offer a brief homily on that day's readings. Following Mass, a Franciscan Sister of the Eucharist will lead that evening's reflection. All are welcome to join us for all or some of the evenings. Each evening's reflection is independent of the others.

Mercy Mondays with Holy Hours - Beginning Feb. 19th the six Mondays during Lent will once again be Mercy Mondays. Confessors will be available from 7 to 8 pm. Pope Francis in his 2016 Lenten Message for the Jubilee Year of Mercy wrote: "God shows himself ever rich in mercy, ever ready to treat his people with deep tenderness and compassion . . . " As priests hearing your confession, we will do our absolute best to be His ministers of that deep tenderness and compassion. In addition, these Mercy Mondays will also be Holy Hours where you can come and spend some time in the presence of our Eucharistic Lord. Come and use the time as you choose. Pray quietly, read some scripture or part of a book, use the time however the Lord leads you to use it. A reminder that these Mercy Mondays are held throughout the Archdiocese so you can go to most any parish in the Archdiocese and you will find a priest hearing confessions on Monday evenings. It is best to check on the time though with the other parish.

Adult Confirmation-Program—Spring 2024

Are you an adult who never received the Sacrament of Confirmation? If so, our Adult Confirmation Program (ACP) will prepare you to be Confirmed in the Spring of 2024. The reception of all of the Sacraments is about helping us journey through this life to life eternal. The Sacrament of Confirmation is a confirming and strengthening of our Baptisms. Through the Sacrament you are sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit and Confirmation provides additional graces to help us live out our adult lives as faithful followers of Jesus and strengthens our bond with the Church. Those who are asked to be a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor at Confirmation must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation in order to take on those responsibilities. Likewise, those to be married in the Catholic Church should be Confirmed. We are implementing this six session ACP so that adult Catholics who were never Confirmed can be fully initiated in the Catholic faith.

Catholics who are at least 18 years old and have already been baptized and received their 1st Holy Communion may participate in the ACP. If married, you must be in a valid Catholic marriage. If married outside the Catholic Church (meaning in a civil ceremony or in a non-Catholic Church without the appropriate permission) and would like to discuss how you can have your marriage recognized in the Church, contact one of the Friar-priests and they will be happy to discuss your situation with you. Your preparation for Confirmation can be done simultaneously with preparation to have your marriage convalidated in the Church, but the convalidation must be concluded before the Confirmation ceremony. Generally speaking, this can often be accomplished.

This six week ACP program, begins on March 3, 2024. Sessions will be held on Sunday mornings, 10:15-11:45am. Registration deadline is Monday, February 26.


