



2024 Archbishop's Annual Appeal - The Archbishop's Annual Appeal (AAA), whose theme this year is **Do This in Memory of Me**, begins today. This year's theme was chosen as a way to remind us that it is through our actions that we are living out Jesus' command to love one another, and how His life and ministry inspires us to make our own sacrifices for those in spiritual and material need.

The parishioners of St. Paul have always been very supportive of the AAA. This is evidenced by the 516 parishioners who made gifts and pledges in 2023 totaling \$114,653.64 thereby surpassing our goal of \$108,000 by 6%. *Thank you to all who donated!* While that is very generous, the number of people donating to the AAA overall, and from our parish as well, has been in a bit of a decline, for a few years. To give a little perspective on this consider the chart below.

Since 2018 there are 120 fewer donors per year from our parish which equates to a nearly 19% decrease in donors. Last year for example, 119 people/households who made a gift in 2022 did not make a gift in 2023. That number was off set by 21 parishioners who made a gift to the AAA for the first time ever and another 43 who made a gift in 2023 after not making a gift in 2022 resulting in a net loss of 55 donors. At the same time, the average amount given each year has fluctuated a bit, averaging around \$117,000 per year. Our high was in 2021, but has decreased the last two years. I am not sure if pledge payments to the *Forward With Faith* Campaign has effected what parishioners are giving to the AAA.

As a parish we have many outreaches to the less fortunate that you support very generously throughout the year, including the current Lenten Collection. At the same time, we know that there are far greater needs out there than what we can provide as an individual parish. By combining our generosity with the nearly 30,000 other donors across the Archdiocese, great things can be accomplished in the name of Christ and the Church of Hartford. Nearly 10% of what is raised each year through the AAA is distributed to local charities.

I am happy to say that the Town of Berlin's Food Pantry was the recipient of one of those grants last year in the amount of \$1,750. Our school received \$25,000 in tuition assistance grants.

Our parish goal has been raised this year for the first time since 2017. Our goal for 2024 has been raised from \$108,000 to \$120,000 which at first seems like a lot as it is an 11% increase. However, it is only a 4.6% increase over what was donated last year, and as I mentioned above, we have averaged \$117,000 over the last six years. How can we reach and exceed the new goal?

- 1. I ask all parishioners who have never made a gift to the AAA to make one this year. *Every gift is important*.
- 2. I ask that those who have made a gift in the past, but not last year to renew their support this year. If we can regain even half of the 119 donors lost last year that would help so much. *Every gift is important*.
- I ask everyone who made a gift last year to do so again this year. Your consistency in giving will help make the AAA successful again this year because every gift is important.
- 4. I ask all those who are faithful donors every year to the AAA to consider when was the last time you increased your gift? Could you increase your gift this year by 5%? If you gave a \$100, can you give \$105 this year?
- Consider making your donation through a pledge with a series of payments before Dec. 31 instead of a one-time gift if that is helpful to you in making a gift.

In the chart above, the column that shows the increase in the average gift size while the number of donors has decreased indicates that it is the smaller donations that have been lost. So if you think that your gift does not matter, it does. Every gift matters and every gift is important! All that being said; I know that not everyone can make a gift and that is okay. If that is the case, please offer some extra prayers for the success of the AAA. You should have already received a letter from the Archbishop and if not it will be coming any day. Thank you again to all who so generously support the AAA!! It is Jesus who is our example of selfless giving.

1st Confessions - Keep our third graders in your prayers this week as they prepare for their first confessions on Saturday, March 2nd. They have been preparing at home and in class to receive the benefits of Jesus' love and mercy through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The children will come in two groups at 9:30 and 11:00 on Saturday. As a result, we will not be able to have any funerals on March 2nd.

PASTOR'S COLUMN (continued)

Rite of Sending Catechumens & Candidate to Continuing Conversion - Last Sunday at the 9:00 am Mass in a Rite of Sending, we formally sent our catechumens, that is those not previously baptized, Hannah Dornfried and Renee Roach to the Cathedral to participate in the Rite of Election conducted by Archbishop Blair. The Rite of Election closes the Period of the Catechumenate. At this rite, upon the testimony of sponsors and catechists and the catechumens' affirmation of their intention to join the Church, the Church makes its "election" of these catechumens to receive the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist) to which they will be admitted at the upcoming Easter Vigil on March 30th. In addition, we also sent David Forsythe to the Rite of Calling Candidates (those baptized in another Christian denomination, as is the case for David, or a baptized Catholic who never received any religious instruction). They now begin a Period of Purification and Enlightenment — the final, intense preparation for the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation. On the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent, the Elect will participate in three scrutinies (rites for self-searching and repentance) and the presentations of the Creed and Lord's Prayer take place. I ask all parishioners to remember Hannah, Renee and David in your prayers this Lent.

Lenten Evenings of Reflection - A reminder that our Lenten Evenings of Reflection will be held next week on March 5, 6 and 7. See the next column for the schedule for the evenings. We are looking forward to the Franciscan Sisters of the Eucharist leading those reflections. They will be with us next weekend to give a brief preview of their talks.

Mercy Mondays - Confessions are heard every Monday evening during Lent from 7 to 8 pm at St. Paul's. Every parish in the Archdiocese is also offering times for the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Mondays during Lent. Check with them for time and place.

Stay Here and Pray - In the time after the Last Supper and before Jesus was arrested, he prayed fervently in the Garden of Gethsemane and asked his apostles to do the same. On Mercy Mondays, the Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar. You can use this time for some quiet prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. So just come and be in the Lord's presence.

Stations of the Cross - The Stations of the Cross will be celebrated this week on Friday at 2:00 pm with the school children, but everyone is welcome to attend. We also have Stations at 7:00 pm on Friday evening. Both the afternoon and evening Stations are held at St. Paul Church.

Final Thoughts - Where does a winemaker get his gossip? Through the grapevine. You can consider that part of your Lenten penance! Have a blessed Lent everyone. - Fr. Joe

Gospel: John 4:5-42

Jesus came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of land that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there. Jesus, tired from his journey, sat down there at the well. It was about noon. A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?" - For Jews use nothing in common with Samaritans. - Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink, 'you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." The woman said to him, "Sir, you do not even have a bucket and the cistern is deep; where then can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us this cistern and drank from it himself with his children and his flocks?" Jesus answered and said to her, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water, so that I may not be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water." Jesus said to her, "Go call your husband and come back." The woman answered and said to him, "I do not have a husband." Jesus answered her, "You are right in saving, 'I do not have a husband.' For you have had five husbands, and the one you have now is not your husband. What you have said is true." The woman said to him, "Sir, I can see that you are a prophet. Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain; but you people say that the place to worship is in Jerusalem." Jesus said to her, "Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You people worship what you do not understand; we worship what we understand, because salvation is from the Jews. But the hour is coming, and is now here, when true worshipers will worship the Father in Spirit and truth; and indeed the Father seeks such people to worship him. God is Spirit, and those who worship him must worship in Spirit and truth." The woman said to him, "I know that the Messiah is coming, the one called the Christ; when he comes, he will tell us everything." Jesus said to her, "I am he, the one speaking with you." At that moment his disciples

returned, and were amazed that he was talking with a woman, but still no one said, "What are you looking for? or "Why are you talking with her?" The woman left her water jar and went into the town and said to the people, "Come see a man who told me everything I have done. Could he possibly be the Christ?" They went out of the town and came to him. Meanwhile, the disciples urged him, "Rabbi, eat." But he said to them, "I have food to eat of which you do not know." So the disciples said to one another, "Could someone have brought him something to eat?" Jesus said to them, "My food is to do the will of the one who sent me and to finish his work. Do you not say, 'In four months the harvest will be here'? I tell you, look up and see the fields ripe for the harvest. The reaper is already receiving payment and gathering crops for eternal life, so that the sower and reaper can rejoice together. For here the saying is verified that 'One sows and another reaps.' I sent you to reap what you have not worked for; others have done the work, and you are sharing the fruits of their work." Many of the Samaritans of that town began to believe in him because of the word of the woman who testified, "He told me everything I have done." When the Samaritans came to him. they invited him to stay with them; and he stayed there two days. Many more began to believe in him because of his word, and they said to the woman, "We no longer believe because of your word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the savior of the world."



Adult Confirmation-Program—Spring 2024

Are you an adult who never received the Sacrament of Confirmation? If so, our Adult Confirmation Program (ACP) will prepare you to be Confirmed in the Spring of 2024. Those who are asked to be a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor at Confirmation must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation in order to take on those responsibilities. Likewise, those to be married in the Catholic Church should be Confirmed. We are implementing this six session ACP so that adult Catholics who were never Confirmed can be fully initiated in the Catholic faith.

Catholics who are at least 18 years old and have already been baptized and received their 1st Holy Communion may participate in the ACP. If married, you must be in a valid Catholic marriage. If married outside the Catholic Church (meaning in a civil ceremony or in a non-Catholic Church without the appropriate permission) and would like to discuss how you can have your marriage recognized in the Church. contact one of the Friar-priests and they will be happy to discuss your situation with you. Your preparation for Confirmation can be done simultaneously with preparation to have your marriage convalidated in the Church, but the convalidation must be concluded before the Confirmation ceremony. Generally speaking, this can often be accomplished.

This six week ACP program, begins on March 3, 2024. Sessions will be held on Sunday mornings, 10:15-11:45am. Registration deadline is Monday, February 26.




