



PASTOR'S COLUMN

Lenten Evening of Reflections - Our Lenten Evenings of Reflection will be held this week, Tuesday through Thursday, March 5, 6 and 7. This is an opportunity to make some time to pray and reflect during the season of Lent. *The usual 5:00 pm Mass on these days is moved to 6:30 pm.* See page 5 for the schedule for each evening. All are welcome to join for all or some of the evenings. Each evening's reflection is independent of the other as is each day's Mass. There will be a coffee and desert reception following the service on Thursday in the Church Hall.

Scrutinies - Our RCIA candidates, who began their faith journey back in October, are now in the final stage of preparation to receive all or some of the Sacraments of Initiation. Last week I shared with you that on the first Sunday of Lent our catechumens, Hannah Dornfried and Renee Roach, were sent forth from our parish in a Rite of Sending to Archbishop Blair where he conducted the Rite of Election for them and all other adults in the Archdiocese who are to be Baptized. Confirmed and receive the Eucharist for the first time at the Easter Vigil on March 30th. They wrote their names in the Book of the Elect and are now referred to as the Elect. Beginning today, on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent, the Elect will participate in three scrutinies (rites for self-searching and repentance). On page 5 you can read a little bit more about the scrutinies and the Rite that accompanies each of the scrutinies. While this Rite will only take place at the 9 am Mass, all parishioners are asked to keep the Elect in their prayers. Keep David Forsythe in your prayers also, who as a Candidate from our parish has already been baptized. He will be Confirmed and receive the Eucharist for the first time at the Easter Vigil.

Mercy Mondays - Confessions are heard every Monday evening during Lent from 7 to 8 pm at St. Paul's. Every parish in the Archdiocese is also offering times for the Sacrament of Reconciliation on each Monday during Lent. Check with them for time and place.

Lent and Almsgiving - Prayer, fasting and almsgiving are the three pillars of our Lenten practices. Like fasting and prayer there are many different ways for us to practice almsgiving. Locally, as a parish, we have our ongoing collections for St. Clare's Food Pantry, see page 5 for the items that are currently needed. Our Lenten Collection runs through Palm Sunday and supports those served by the Prudence Crandall Center and Family Promise of Central CT. This collection is not food, but other basic necessities that are needed. See page 8 for the those items that are needed. There are posters and containers at the entrances to the church where you can drop off your donations at both worship sites. The next two items broaden our almsgiving to the

Archdiocesan level, the **Archbishop's Annual Appeal**, as well as nationally and internationally, through the **Catholic Relief Services** collection.

Do This In Memory of Me - The Archbishop's Annual Appeal (AAA) got underway last week. I thank you for your kind attention as you watched the video and heard me speak about the Appeal last week. By now everyone should have received a mailing from Archbishop Blair requesting your support this year. If you have not, please call the Parish Office. There are also additional information packets at the entrances near the bulletins. I am confident that if we can reverse the decline in the number of donors to the AAA, we will certainly be successful in doing our part to help so many in need. The AAA is one way to share our blessings with our neighbors and express thanks for the blessings which God has bestowed upon us. Your gift to the 2024 AAA will help continue many vital ministries, services, and programs that help so many in need. All funds contributed to the AAA are used exclusively for the purposes outlined in the Appeal literature, which can be found at https://archdioceseofhartford.org/appeal/. No Appeal funds are ever used for legal fees or settlements. Thank you for your past support, recall that every gift is important and that every gift makes a difference because of the people who are helped by your generosity.

Catholic Relief Services (CRS) Collection - CRS, headquartered in Baltimore, is an arm of the US Catholic Conference of Bishops. It provides aid to the poor and vulnerable. Your support of the CRS Collection next weekend (March 9/10) helps support Catholic Church organizations that carry out international relief and solidarity efforts. Programs include relief and resettlement for victims of persecution, war, and natural disasters; development projects to improve living conditions for the poor; legal and support services for poor immigrants; peace and reconciliation work for people suffering from violence; and advocacy on behalf of the powerless.

What are the "Scrutinies"?

These very special rites are celebrated on the middle three Sundays of Lent, at liturgies where the Elect are present. The Elect are those in our midst who are preparing for Baptism. Part of their journey to the font is that they have been received among us, the Rite of Acceptance, and they have been enrolled in the Book of the Elect in the Rite of Election.

Even if these rites are not celebrated at the liturgy we attend, or not celebrated in our parish or congregation at all, it can be wonderful to reflect upon the journey these Elect are making during Lent, as an inspiration and source of renewal for us in our journey.

These are ancient rites and they may, at first, seem strange to us. But they are profoundly rooted in our human experience. We need to examine (scrutinize) how we are, the areas of our lives where we are tempted, or seriously sin - in what we do and what we fail to do. We really need healing and the strength that can come from the support of our sisters and brothers.

Invitation to Silent Prayer

One of the most powerful moments of the Scrutinies is how they begin. After the homily, the Elect are invited to come forward with their sponsors and to kneel down. Then, the whole assembly is invited to pray for them in silence. It is a very solemn moment. This community has cared for these elect for some months now on their journey. We have sent them to reflect more and more deeply on the Word of God, and expressed to them our longing for the day on which they would join us at the table of the Lord. Now we pray for them in this sacred silence, deeply asking God to protect them and heal them in the weeks ahead.

Intercessions for the Elect

We then pray out loud together for the Elect.

Prayer of Exorcism

Then, we pray that they might be freed from the power of the Evil One and protected on their journey.

The Laying On of Hands

In a silent ritual deliberately reminiscent of the rite used for ordination in the Sacrament of Holy Orders, the priest or deacon lays his hands for a brief moment on the head of each of the Elect. It is a solemn act of calling down the Spirit of Jesus to be with them and protect them.

Dismissal of the Elect

The Elect are then sent forth to reflect upon the Word and this powerful gesture of love on the part of this community, that cares for them so deeply, with the love of Christ.
