

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Second and Third Scrutiny - Our two Elect, Hannah Dornfried and Renee Roach will participate in the Rite for the Second Scrutiny this week and the Third Scrutiny next week. In the bulletin last week was an explanation of the Scrutinies and the Rite that accompanies them. Please continue to pray for our Elect as they prepare to receive all of the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil as well as our Candidate David Forsythe who will be Confirmed and receive his 1st Holy Communion at the same time.

Laetare Sunday - On this fourth Sunday of Lent, Laetare, Rejoice, Sunday the Church expresses hope and joy in the midst of our Lenten fasts and penances. The vestment color is rose giving us a glimpse of the joy that awaits us at Easter. In a sense we take a brief pause and fortify ourselves for the rest of Lent and all of the events of Holy Week. All of our prayers, fasting and almsgiving are meant to turn our hearts and souls more fully to God. An integral part of that turning is admitting, repenting and confessing our sins so as to receive an abundance of God's mercy. This thought leads me into the next item.

Lent and Forgiveness - The Opening Prayer for last Sunday's Mass said in part "O God, author of every mercy and of all goodness, ... look graciously on this confession of our lowliness, that we, who are bowed down by our conscience, may always be lifted up by your mercy." Lent and forgiveness certainly go hand in hand. Lent will lead us to Good Friday when Jesus was lifted up on the Cross and suffered and died so that our sins could be forgiven. No matter how much our conscience is bowed down Jesus is there to lift us up with his mercy. And why is that? The answer is in today's gospel: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." (John 3:16)

I invite you to pray the following verses from Psalm 51.

Have mercy on me, God, in your goodness; in the your compassion blot out my offense. Thoroughly wash away my guilt; and from my sin cleanse me. *R*. *Be merciful, O Lord, for we have sinned.*

For I acknowledge my offense; my sin is always before me. "Against you, you alone have I sinned, I have done what is evil in your sight." **R**.

A clean heart create for me, God; and a steadfast spirit renew within me. Caste me not out of your presence, and your Holy Spirit take not from me. **R**. Give me back the joy of your salvation; uphold me with a willing spirit. O Lord, open my lips; and my mouth will proclaim your praise. **R**.

In the first part of Psalm 51, the sinner asks deliverance from sin, not just a past act, but its emotional, physical, and social consequences. The second part of the psalm seeks something more profound, nearness to God, living by the spirit of God. Jesus gave us the Sacrament of Reconciliation for exactly these two purposes: the forgiveness of our sins, but also to draw us into a deeper relationship with Himself. I invite you not to let this holy time of Lent to pass by without receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Jesus never turned away one who came asking to be forgiven and nor shall we; whether it has been a few weeks, a few months, a few years, or a few decades now is the acceptable time, now is the time to accept the Lord's invitation and to "Be Reconciled" to God. Visit our website for information about all of our opportunities for you to go to confession this Lent.

Holy Week and Easter Schedule - Our full schedule for Holy Week and Easter can be found on page 5 of today's bulletin. Please make plans to attend on these holiest days of the year. Please note that once again this year we have spread out the Mass times on Easter Sunday a bit more. In addition to the Easter Vigil Mass at 8 pm, the Masses on Easter at St. Paul will be at 7:00 am, 8:45 am 10:30 am and 12:15 pm. Easter Mass at Sacred Heart will be at 9:30 am.

Easter Memorials – The Easter Memorials will be published in the Easter Bulletin. To be included in that bulletin, the Memorials must be received in the office by Mon., March 18. Memorials received after that date will be printed in a subsequent bulletin. Easter Memorials can also be submitted online.

1st Confessions - On March 2nd, we celebrated Jesus' love and forgiveness with about 91 third graders. There was the usual tinge of nervousness ahead of time, but then lots of smiles afterwards. Special thanks goes out our Religious Education catechists Suzanne Ciarcia, Lisa Moscaritolo, and Kara Satalino as well as Kari Buchholz, the 3rd grade teacher

at Saint Paul School. Thanks also to Fr. Michael for the time that he spent with the 3rd graders and to especially Robin Veronesi, our DRE, and her assistant Linda Beaudoin. Thanks also to Fr. Mark from St. John's in Cromwell for helping us hear their confessions.
