



PASTOR'S COLUMN

Holy Week - The Church's Liturgies of the last three days of Holy Week, known as the Sacred Triduum, are the touch stone of our faith. They reveal fully God's love for us through the Paschal Mystery, that is the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus. These are also days for us to show how deeply committed we are to Christ. Through our active participation in the beauty and uniqueness of the Church's Liturgies this week we embark on a spiritual pilgrimage. For those who are less familiar with these liturgies I have included an over view below. The Holy Week schedule is on page 5. I invite you to come and pray so as to enter into the deepest mysteries of our faith.



Chrism Mass - In Rome and in every (arch)diocese throughout the world, the local bishop, will celebrate the Chrism Mass. Traditionally the Chrism Mass was held in the morning on Holy Thursday. While that is still the case in some places, more often it is held earlier during Holy Week for practical reasons. Here in Hartford, Archbishop Leonard Blair will celebrate the Chrism Mass on Tuesday, March 26th at 11:00 am at the Cathedral of St. Joseph. All are welcome to attend. Our St. Paul middle school students will be in attendance.

The Chrism Mass gathers the faithful of the diocese at their mother church with their shepherd at which time the three oils used during the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Anointing of the Sick and Holy Orders are blessed or consecrated, in the case of the Chrism, and then distributed to all of the parishes in the diocese. Since the bishop is the only minister in the diocese who may consecrate chrism, this Mass highlights his ministry and our union with him. While he will not be able to baptize and confirm every person in the diocese, nonetheless he will be symbolically present in the Chrism which the priests and deacons will use. When the oils are brought back to the parish they are placed in dignified containers and stored near the baptismal font in an ambry. At St. Paul the ambry is on the pillar near the statue of Mary.

In recent years, the Chrism Mass has also acknowledged the ministry of priests since it was at the Last Supper that Jesus instituted the Sacrament of Holy Orders. The priests renew

their commitment of service at the Chrism Mass. Please pray for your priests currently assigned here and all those who have served at Sacred Heart and St. Paul in the past.

Holy Thursday - The first thing to notice this night is that when you enter church the tabernacle will be empty and will remain that way until after Communion at the Easter Vigil. At this evening Mass, which begins at 7 pm, we celebrate the Lord's Last Supper and Jesus' institution of two Sacraments. Eucharist and Holy Orders. Intertwined deeply in the meaning of both of these Sacraments is Jesus' great mandate, that as He had washed the feet of the Apostles so too were they to do. This liturgy includes a re-enactment of the washing of feet of the Apostles. We are all called to serve rather than be served. The oils that were blessed and consecrated at the Chrism Mass will be brought up in procession. Following the meal Jesus went off to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray and took three apostles with himself. At the end of our Holy Thursday Liturgy we will process with the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose which will be the altar below the statue of Mary. You are invited to remain and pray in adoration and thanksgiving before the Blessed Sacrament until 10:00 pm when we will pray Night Prayer together which will take about five minutes.

On **Good Friday** the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion will take place at 3:00 pm. The church is so different this day. Altars have all been stripped bare, the tabernacle is empty. The liturgy this day has three parts, the first being the Liturgy of the Word which includes the account of the Passion from Saint John's Gospel and concludes with petitions for all believers and non-believers. Then in the 2nd part of the Liturgy we will be invited to venerate the Cross, the extraordinary symbol of divine mercy. On this day the Cross of Christ is lifted before the world as a banner of hope for all, who in faith welcome its mystery into their lives. In the last part of the Good Friday Liturgy Holy Communion is then distributed from hosts consecrated the night before since no Masses are celebrated on Good Friday. At 7:00 pm **Stations of the Cross** will be celebrated at St. Paul Church.

On **Holy Saturday**, the Church vigilantly watches silently at the tomb and reflects on the death of the Lord and the pain, loneliness and discouragement that so often accompany death. We think of Mary who saw her son crucified and buried.

On Holy Saturday night during the solemn Easter Vigil, which begins at 8 pm, "the mother of all vigils" the silence will be broken and the mood changes with the joyful song, "Exsultet, "Rejoice!" The Easter Vigil begins in darkness; a fire is lit and blessed; the Paschal Candle is marked and lit; tapers are lit and passed and we will transition from darkness into light.

PASTOR'S COLUMN (continued)

Once again the victory of Light over darkness, of Life over death, will be proclaimed and the Church will rejoice in meeting her Risen Lord. Christ's triumph over death will be proclaimed and the promise of everlasting life springs eternal. During the Easter Vigil Hannah Dornfried and Renee Roach, who have been in our RCIA program since October, will receive all three Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion) while David Forsythe, who has also been in the RCIA program, will receive the Sacraments Confirmation and Holy Communion. In addition, the following students will receive one or more of the Sacraments of Initiation: Jaxon (Grade 2), Cameron (1), and Kaiden Legget as well as Madison Sommer (2) will be baptized; Elijah Charette, son of Renee Roach mentioned above, (4) will be baptized and receive his 1st Communion as will Osher (5) and Yogez (7) Yerushalmy; Nicole Rios Escobar (6), Jim Gajewski (6), and Brandon Post (5) will receive their 1st Communions. Please remember all of them in prayer this week as they prepare to receive these sacraments.

Confessions - Confessions will be heard this week on Monday and Tuesday evenings from 7 to 8 pm and on Good Friday from 10:30 to 11:30 am and from 4:30 to 5:30 pm. *Confessions will not be heard on Holy Thursday or Holy Saturday.*

Parish Center Easter Schedule - The Parish Center will be closed on Good Friday and Easter Monday and will re-open on Tuesday, April 2nd at 9 am.

Living Stations of the Cross - Our school children will enact "The Living Stations of the Cross" on Holy Thursday at 1:45 pm in the Parish Green parking lot. Parishioners are welcome to attend. Seating is not provided, so bring a folding chair. If inclement weather, Stations will be held in the gym.

Holy Land Collection - This is a world wide collection whose purpose is to help protect and preserve the sacred places and shrines in the Holy Land. Since 1333 Franciscan Friars have been staffing and maintaining these sacred sites and serving the pastoral needs of the minority Christian community who live there as well as the thousands who visit to deepen their spiritual lives. This collection will be taken up on Good Friday.

Święconka - The Blessing of the Easter Baskets - With roots dating back to the early history of Poland *swięconka* is one of the most enduring and beloved Polish traditions on Holy Saturday. As Lent ends, along with its various disciplines including fasting, baskets containing a sampling of Easter foods are brought to church to be blessed on Holy Saturday. Easter baskets will be blessed at St. Paul's at 9:30 am (Parish Green Gazebo, or in the school gym if the weather is bad), and 1 & 2 pm (St. Paul Church). The main foods blessed are an egg which is shared by all on Easter morning, and a lamb molded of butter or pastry.

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved. and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

This butter-lamb and blessed Easter egg have a place of honor on the Easter table. The foods in the baskets have a symbolic meaning: eggs - symbolize life and Christ's resurrection; bread - symbolic of Jesus, The Bread of Life; lamb represents Christ, the Lamb of God; salt - represents purification; horseradish - symbolic of the bitter sacrifice of Christ; ham - symbolic of great joy and abundance. Of course you do not need to be Polish or Slavic to participate in this custom. This is a wonderful tradition to keep, or start, and to teach our children about these Easter baskets as well.

Do This in Memory of Me! - As of March 15, 230 parishioners have made donations and pledges totaling \$57,745 towards this year's Archbishop's Annual Appeal which is 48% of our \$120,000 goal. **Please remember all gifts, no matter the amount, are important and helpful!**

Final Thoughts - There is nothing more important this week than coming to church for the Holy Week Services and going to confession if you have not yet done so. Have a very Blessed Holy Week. - Fr. Joe

Confession and "Easter Duty" Catholics beyond the age of discretion are obliged to confess all mortal sins at least once a year and are recommended to do the same with venial sins (Canons 989 & 988.2). All Catholics are also obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year and specifically during Easter time ("Easter Duty"), that is between the Feasts of Easter (March 31) and Pentecost (May 19). (Canon 920).

"Whose sins you forgive they are forgiven them." John 20:23

Confession to a Priest

Q. One of my friends asked me why I have to go to a priest to confess my sins when God already knows what I've done. Why can't I go to Him directly?

The first thing to consider is whether or not it is good to go directly to God when we confess our sins. This is most certainly a good idea. In fact, it has always been recommended as a good daily practice just before bed. So I definitely recommend that you examine your day each night and thank God for the good things and ask forgiveness for any sins. Going directly to God each night will undoubtedly help you to grow closer to Him.

As Catholics, we also believe that it is essential to regularly confess our sins to God through the ministry of priests. In other words, we believe that when we go to confession and confess our sins we are actually seeking God's forgiveness, not the priest's. The priest stands as the minister of this wonderful gift of forgiveness.

So why do we do this? For one simple reason. Because we believe it's what God wants. You might recall in John's Gospel, Chapter 20, that Jesus bestowed the Holy Spirit upon his first bishops, the Apostles, and told them, "Whose sins you forgive they are forgiven them." Why would Jesus give the Apostles such an incredible ability if He did not want them to use it? Most certainly He had something important in mind when He said this. Jesus' words and actions always have great significance. By commissioning His Apostles to go and forgive sins we understand that this is the ordinary way that Jesus wants to bestow His forgiveness upon us all. And He did not intend this only for them. Rather, we can see in the Acts of the Apostles and from the earliest times of the Church that this sacred power was passed on from these first Apostles to others. It was passed on to new bishops as well as to those who assisted the bishops in the early Church, the priests.

So it's essential that we, as followers of Jesus, be open to His gift of forgiveness in the way that He chooses to give it to us. Since He is the source of forgiveness, He can choose how to give that gift to us.
