



PASTOR'S COLUMN

Welcome to Fr. Vasconcelos, OFM Conv. - As I mentioned last week, the Vocation Director for the Franciscan Friars, Fr. Manny Vasconcelos, OFM Conv., is with us this weekend and will have the homily at all of the Masses this weekend.

Confirmation at the Cathedral - Our 10th grade Confirmation students, 65 of them, received the Sacrament of Confirmation at St. Joseph's Cathedral on April 20th. We were one of six parishes represented that day. Archbishop Blair presided at the Confirmation and conferred the sacrament on about half of the 160 candidates who were confirmed including all of ours. He was assisted by Auxiliary Bishop Juan Miguel Betancourt, SEVM in administering the sacrament. Fr. Anthony Federico delivered a very personal and poignant homily to the candidates and their families.

It takes many people to help prepare our Confirmation students and so I offer special thanks to the following who served as catechists for our Confirmation students: Frank Cocozza, Jay Fazzino, Maura Gaffney, Annette Hines, Celine Hines, Liz Kelly, Christine Vale da Serra as well as Tony Kane and Jenn Nagel who were substitute catechists. May the Lord bless each of you for sharing the gift of faith with our young people.

Congratulations to all of the newly Confirmed, and we look forward to you, now fully initiated in the Catholic faith, to share the unique gifts that God bestows upon you to help make us better as a parish. As Fr. Anthony pointed out to you, your Confirmation is not a grad-



uation, but rather a commissioning for you to take a full and active role in the Church and specifically our parish. May the Lord bless your parents, godparents and sponsors for sharing the gift of faith with you.

First Communions Coming Up - Next weekend, May 4/5, at the 4:00 pm, 9:00 am and 12 Noon Masses and the following weekend May 11/12 (Mother's Day) at the 4:00 pm and 10:30 am Masses there will be 90 of our 3rd graders receiving their 1st Holy Communions. There will be reserved seating for them in the "old" wing noted by the banners on the ends of the pews. There will only be about ten pews (five on each side) at the back of the old wing available for general seating. Those receiving Holy Communion for the first time will

process in and will receive Holy Communion first at those Masses. These are very specials moments for our 3rd graders as well as for the parish. Please welcome all of them warmly and if they are seated where you normally sit, I am sure you will understand.

Archbishop Blair - As an insert in this week's bulletin is a letter from Archbishop Blair as his time as the Archbishop of Hartford is winding down, and by the time you read this, may have already ended. You may recall that last June 26th, it was announced that Pope Francis had appointed the Bishop of Burlington, VT, Christopher Coyne, as the Coadjutor Archbishop of Hartford. This was done at the request of Archbishop Blair in anticipation of his 75th birthday at which time all Bishops are required to tender a letter of resignation. Archbishop Blair celebrated his 75th birthday on April 12th. Upon the formal acceptance of Archbishop's Blair's resignation by the Holy Father, Archbishop Coyne will automatically become the 14th Bishop and sixth Archbishop of Hartford. Archbishop Blair has indicated that his residence going forward will be at St. Thomas Seminary in Bloomfield and he will continue to serve as he is needed in the Archdiocese. The water must be good in this neck of the woods as there will now be three retired Archbishops including Archbishop Cronin who is 96, Archbishop Mansell, 86, and two retired Auxiliary Bishops, Rosazza, 89, and Macaluso, 78. Archbishop Blair has been a priest nearly 48 years and in July will have been a Bishop for 25 years with the last ten having been the Archbishop of Hartford. Keep him and all of our retired bishops in your prayers.

Friar Franck Ordained a Transitional Deacon - I am sure that many of you remember Friar Franck-Lino Sokpolie, OFM

Conv. from his summer assignment at St. Paul's in 2017. Earlier this month, on April 6th, he was ordained a transitional deacon at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Little Flower in San Antonio by Bishop Gary Janak, an Auxiliary Bishop for the Archdiocese of San Antonio. Friar Franck professed simple (temporary) vows as a Franciscan Friar on July



21, 2016, and his solemn (permanent) vows on July 30, 2021. Friar Franck will spend the next year completing his studies in San Antonio for his Master of Divinity and preparing for his ordination to the priesthood. Please keep him in your prayers.





PASTORAL COUNCIL-APRIL MEETING MINUTES SUMMARY

The Pastoral Council met on Monday, April 15, 2024. In attendance were Fathers Joe, Michael, and Martin, Mary Corrigan, Bud Volz, Betty Lasker, Roland Baikal, Maura Chasse, Fayne Molloy, Elaine Pavasaris, Ed Schmitt, Nancy Timbrell, Deacon Julio, and guest Bob Fischer.

Bob Fischer gave a summary of the HomeFront organization as well as the plans for this year's Homefront Project. Bob explained that HomeFront is an American offshoot similar to Habitat for Humanity of which the parish has been involved in for over fifteen years. Individuals, who must meet income levels as well as a significant level of need, submit an application for consideration. They are asked to discuss the impact that the requested repairs will have on their ability to remain in the home. They also agree to live in the home for 5 years after the needed projects are completed. Evaluators from Home-Front visit the home and determine if the applicant is a good match for the program. Once a determination is made, Home-Front picks projects that are matches to the skill levels of the volunteer organizations. This year the St. Paul Parish group of volunteers will be working on a home in New Britain lived in by an elderly woman and her daughter who is disabled. Repairs to the home will include, but are not limited to, numerous replacement windows, staining the back deck, sealing the front door and various yard work projects.

Bob explained that major corporations such as Home Depot generously contribute materials each year. Our parish also donates \$3,000 annually to HomeFront to help cover miscellaneous expenses. This year's HomeFront is being led by Lynn Misteri. Volunteers interested in helping can contact Lynn.

Father Joe shared that the parish will no longer be participating in the St. Roch Raffle. What used to be one raffle run by St. Roch's parish has become two raffles. The St. Roch's raffle is now limited to parishes within the diocese of Bridgeport. The other, and larger raffle, has been separately incorporated as Catholic Parish Initiative, LLC with its by-laws, officers, and other expenses. Father felt it best to withdraw and plans to investigate the possibility of running our own raffle to make up for the lost revenue. More details will be forthcoming.

Father Martin shared that Father Manny Vasconcelos, from Our Lady of Angels Province, Vocation Office, will be visiting the parish from April 27-29. He will preach during the weekend Masses and will visit the school on Monday. His visit is in addition to the Archdiocese's ongoing efforts to promote vocations. Father Martin also noted that there is a focused effort to raise the consciousness of individuals to not only priesthood and religious life, but also married life. He noted the professional group that the Archdiocese has hired to provide parishes with success-proven instructional materials some of which have already been purchased. *Called by Name* weekend will occur in our parish the weekend of June 15/16 when parishioners will be encouraged to solicit names of individuals who they feel could possibly be called to a vocation as a priest or to religious life. More details will follow.

Deacon Julio provided a financial update on the church and the school, both of which are functioning in the black and according to budget benchmarks. The school's budget for the 2024-25 school year was unanimously recommended by the St. Paul School Board to the St. Paul Parish Finance Council which likewise unanimously approved it. It has since been passed on to the Archdiocese. There are currently 234 students enrolled in the school and the projected budgeted enrollment for next year is 244. As part of this budget the school has implemented a formal pay scale for St. Paul School teachers. Julio highlighted that the new salary scale is currently set at 75% of the Berlin Public School salary scale. This increase in salary is meant to recruit and maintain highly qualified, dedicated teachers. The parish is examining two capital improvement projects for the church which include replacing carpeting in the church and needed repairs for the bell tower.

Each of the four subcommittees of the Pastoral Council, Spiritual Life and Worship, Parish and Community Outreach, Youth, Family and Community Life, and Evangelization and Faith Formation summarized the progress each has made on their respective goals. Details of planned events will be published in the bulletin and on the church website.

Robin Veronesi submitted a written report to the council. She reviewed the events that had taken place during the Sacrament Season and listed the five Masses for students receiving their First Communion. These Masses will be on the weekends of May 4/5 and 11/12. The final classes for the religious education students in grades 1-8 will be held on April 21st and 28th. The next children's Mass is scheduled for May 19th.

Jill Conaway also submitted a written report to the council. In it, she updated the current enrollment and status of the current faculty. She indicated that, as on now, all current faculty have indicated their intent to return next school year. Thanks to the generosity of attendees at the recently held school auction, over \$17,000 was raised that will cover the cost of the teachers' technology wish lists with a reserve for future needs. The registration process in the new FACTS Student Information System (SIS) has gone well. Total proceeds from the auction will be in excess of \$63,000. Jill and Julio will be trained on the Grant and Financial Aid module and will begin going through applications after the May 1st deadline. Teachers will be trained on FACTS at the end of April.

Fathers Michael and Martin reported on the status of the Scripture Study and Men's and Women's groups respectively. All groups continue to have active members and will soon be wrapping their sessions up for the summer.

The next Parish Council meeting is scheduled for June 17th. All parishioners are welcome to attend.
