

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Happy Independence Day! - Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord. (Psalms 33: 12) On Thursday we will celebrate our 248th birthday as a nation, just two years short of our semiguincentennial. As a teenager in 1976, I remember well the nation's celebration of our Bicentennial. I grew up learning to be proud of our country even with its warts and troubles. The Bicentennial was just a few years past the very turbulent late 60's amidst much turmoil surrounding civil rights, the deaths of RFK and MLK, as well as the unrest that preceded the end of the Vietnam War. Somehow the nation came together in 1976 under the leadership of Gerald R. Ford, the first and only President who was never elected to be Vice President or President that was brought about by the resignation of both a Vice President and President for different crimes. I pray that somehow the semiguincentennial will be such a catalyst to get the country out of its present funk, but I would like it to happen sooner. The country has gone down a different road more recently as various factions are doing their best to remove the Divine from our nation and certainly its Judeo-Christian roots and values. This is certainly not helping our current situation as a nation.

So in the midst of time for a parade, a jaunt to the beach, 18 holes, a good old fashioned cookout, a baseball game and the night sky full of fireworks, or illuminations as John Adams called them, to round out the day, let us not forget to remember from whom all blessings come and the role that God and moral values played in the founding document of this nation. Our society is straying far from the vision of our forefathers; some who were not overly religious men, but who nonetheless were wise enough to appeal to a higher power on which to stake their claim for independence. Jefferson wrote and the 56 Signers affirmed: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness." At the end of the Declaration, they again affirmed their "firm reliance on the protection of Divine Providence" as they pledged to each other "their lives, their fortunes, and their sacred honor."

It was Benjamin Franklin who said the following while addressing George Washington, the President of the Constitutional Convention, in Philadelphia in 1787: "I have lived, Sir, a long time, and the longer I live, the more convincing proofs I see of this truth: that God governs in the affairs of men. And if a sparrow cannot fall to the ground without his notice, is it probable that an empire can rise without his aid?... I therefore beg leave to move — that henceforth prayers imploring the assistance of Heaven, and its blessings on our deliberations, be held in this Assembly every morning before we proceed to business, and that one or more of the Clergy of this City be requested to officiate in

that Service." Knowing too what Franklin knew, let us pray once again and ask for God's blessings and guidance upon the USA. Let us not acquiesce to the call of some to eliminate God from our culture and nation. Without God, who has blessed our country with such abundance, we will be no nation at all.

Prayer for the USA

God our Father, Giver of life, we entrust the United States of America to your loving care.

You are the rock on which this nation was founded. You alone are the true source of our cherished rights to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness.

Send your Spirit to touch the hearts of our nation's leaders.

Open their minds to the great worth of human life and the responsibilities that accompany human freedom.

Remind your people that true happiness is rooted in seeking and doing your will.

Reclaim this land for your glory and dwell among your people.

Give us the grace and humility to know
what is not right with America.
Give us the gift of your Holy Spirit
for the moral and spiritual renewal we need
to meet the problems that we face.

Through the intercession of Mary Immaculate,
Patroness of our land, bless us and guide us always
and increase our respect for all life.
We ask this through Christ Our Lord. Amen.

PASTOR'S COLUMN (continued)

Pallium, a Latin word that means a mantle or cloak, is worn over the chasuble and is made of lamb's wool. It is a white band measuring about 2 inches in width. Two equally wide bands, about 12 inches long containing small silk-covered

lead pieces, extend one in front and one on the back. Six black crosses adorn the pallium and are placed in the front and back, on each shoulder, and on the ends of the pieces hanging in front and back. The palliums are, as Pope Francis has said previously, "a sign of communion with the church of Rome" and of an arch-

bishop's responsibility as shepherd of a local church.

Pope Francis, while continuing the tradition of blessing the palliums on the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul, does not put the pallium on the new archbishops himself. Rather he has directed that that be done in the cathedral of the Archdiocese. Archbishop Coyne will have the pallium placed on him by Cardinal Christophe Pierre, Apostolic Nuncio (the pope's ambassador) to the United States, on Monday, October 14 at 11:00 am at the Cathedral of St. Joseph. Everyone will be invited to attend.


Archbishop Coyne has asked that this Sunday, though it is June 30 and the 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time, that we celebrate the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul this weekend and join together in prayer for him and his ministry among us as our shepherd. This is nice for us as a parish as we get to celebrate our patronal feast on a Sunday.






