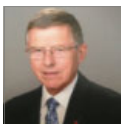

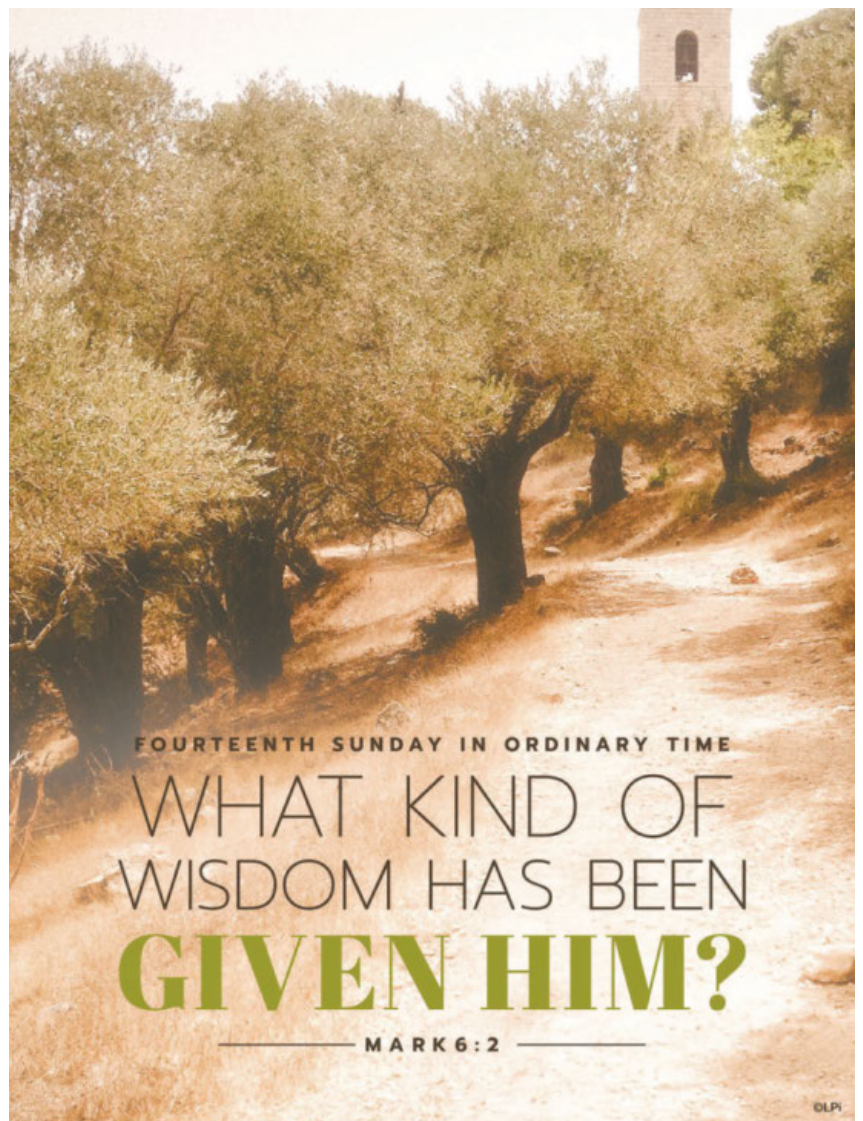

Early Deadline - The publishing deadline for this bulletin was July 1.

Mission Collections - During the course of the year as a parish, we are asked to support three Mission collections a year. July 1 began our new fiscal year and the timing of these three collections is going to be different this year. Ordinarily the Mission Co-op collection happens in July. In fact, you have an envelope dated July 28 for that collection in your current packet of envelopes. However, the missionaries assigned this year are not able to come at that time. So we are going to pivot and use that weekend and make the Franciscan Mission collection the first one for this year. (It was the last one for last year back in March.) So you will use the Mission Co-op envelope on July 28, but it will be for the Franciscan Mission Collection.

Parish Prayer List - Over time the Parish Prayer List as found weekly in the bulletin has grown so much that the point size of the font has gotten smaller and smaller to accommodate all of the names. It has been the case for many years that names would stay on for one month unless there was a request to leave them on longer. On page x of the bulletin is the prayer list and how the list will be managed going forward to keep it more manageable. Permission from the person whose name is being added to the list should be secured before submitting their name for the list. Thank you in advance for your help and cooperation.

Summer Concert on the Parish Green - Ever since the parish bought the old Kensington Grammar School (KGS) and developed the associated property into the Parish Green it has been a goal to make even more use of it, especially in the summer. It is such a great space for gatherings. So this year we are going to host a Summer Concert on the Green on Thursday evening, July 18 from 6 to 8 p.m. The local band *Locomotion* will play from 6:15 to 7:45 pm. **Thanks to the Manafort Family and Manafort Brothers Incorporated, this is a free event.** The concert is being held in cooperation with the Town of Berlin to make this a broader community event. The help and cooperation of town officials and the police department has been invaluable in bringing the event to fruition. The 8th graders of St. Paul School, our local Boy Scout troop, and Upbeat from Berlin HS will provide soda, water, gaterade, snacks and pop corn. There will also be an ice cream truck, but there will not be any other food available. There will be some port-a-potties for your convenience. No seating will be provided, so bring a lawn chair or a blanket. We hope we will not need it, but the rain date is August 1.

Blue Mass - Historically in the Catholic Church a Blue Mass recognizes and honors the sacrifices made by those who serve in law enforcement and other emergency response

professions. It is also meant to show support and gratitude for these individuals and their families. It is called a Blue Mass because of the prominence of the color blue in the uniforms that are often worn by police and fire personnel. **Our parish will host a Blue Mass on Sunday, September 29 at 1:00pm in place of the regular 12 Noon Mass that day.**

This will allow for those who attend the 10:30 Mass to leave and then the arrival of those who are attending the Blue Mass, fire apparatus and the formation of the procession, etc.. Elaine Pavasaris is chairing a healthy Blue Mass committee that is working hard on organizing the Mass and the reception that will follow. All parishioners are not only welcome to attend, but are encouraged to do so to show support for these men and women who serve our community. Parishioners who are from police and fire departments outside of Berlin are also invited to participate in this Mass. More information will follow in the coming weeks from the committee. St. Clare Food Pantry - The bi-weekly food distributions continue throughout the summer every other Friday at Sacred Heart Church in East Berlin. Thank you to all who support the pantry throughout the year. It is during the summer months that the shelves start thinning out a bit so thank you very much to all who support the pantry year round. Since the supply has been low lately and the need remains high (on average about 140 people come for food), we have been using some of the cash donations to purchase food so that there is enough to distribute. You can drop off food at any of the church entrances when coming for Mass, but the best and easiest place to drop off food when not coming for Mass is the elevator entrance. Thanks to all who continue to volunteer and all who donate food and cash that enable us to help so many in need.

Do This in Memory of Me! - It is not too late to give to the 2024 Archbishop's Annual Appeal. As of June 28 the appeal has received over \$8.2 million in pledges and donations toward the goal of \$10 million. The Archbishop's Annual Appeal helps provide the critical funding needed to feed the hungry, shelter the homeless, counsel those in despair, offer much-needed assistance to the unemployed, and make medical care available to those without health insurance. So if you have yet to make a gift to the AAA please do so. Your gift to the 2024 Appeal will help to continue the many vital ministries, services, and programs that reach out to so many in need. As a parish as of June 28th 509 households have made a gift.

This just a few donors below last year's total of 516 and is 86% of the average number of donors (586) over the last six years. As a parish we have surpassed our dollar goal, **THANK YOU**, but as you read above the AAA is still \$1.8 million short of its goal. Remember every gift is important and every gift matters because of those that benefit from your generosity.

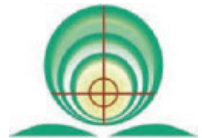
