



PASTOR'S COLUMN

Mission Collections - Let's Try This Again - Last week I indicated in this space that the Mission Co-op collection was being moved. That part is still true, just not as far down the road as originally planned. Now the Mission Co-op collection will happen the weekend of August 3 and 4. The date on the envelopes is July 28. So you can hold onto it until August 3 and 4. The Franciscan Mission collection will move back to its original slot in the spring of 2025. Should you turn the Mission Co-op envelope in ahead of time, it will still go toward the Mission Co-op collection. The Propagation of the Faith office of the Archdiocese of Hartford has invited the Diocese of Kumbakonam. India to participate in the Mission Cooperative Appeal in our parish this year If that sounds a bit familiar, that is because the same Diocese was assigned to us last year. More will be shared about the Diocese and the priest who will be coming to ask for our support in the coming weeks.

Evening Mass on Thursday, July 18 - Because of the Concert on the Green (see the next item) the evening Mass this Thursday, July 18 will be held at 4:30 pm instead of the usual 5:00 pm. Should the concert be postponed, the Mass will still be held at 4:30 pm this Thursday.

Summer Concert on the Parish Green - Our first Summer Concert on the Parish Green is scheduled for this Thursday, July 18th from 6 to 8 pm. The local band, *Locomotion*, will play from 6:15 to 7:45 pm. Thanks to the Manafort Family and Manafort Brothers Incorporated this is a free event. No seating will be provided, so bring your own chair or a blanket. Locomotion will be set up under the gazebo. The 8th graders of Saint Paul School, our local Boy Scout troop, and Upbeat from Berlin High School will have soda, water, snacks and pop corn available for purchase. Unfortunately the ice cream truck had to back out. There will not be any other food available. There will be some port-a-potties for your convenience that will be in the driveway between the school and the Parish Center.

When something like this was first discussed before the pandemic, the idea was to make more use of the Parish Green, but also to have this as something the town could enjoy as well. The Town of Berlin and its leaders liked the idea and have been most helpful and cooperative in the planning process and the logistics to make this work. One of the major logistics is parking. The Town of Berlin Police Department has developed a plan for the event. Visit our website for map that indicates where parking will be allowed and restricted. The neighboring streets will have parking restricted to one side of the street. Alling Street will be closed off in front of the school and church. Both the school and Parish Green parking lots will be fully available. We hope we

will not need it, but the rain date is August 1. Should the weather be an issue, notice will be posted on our website and social media pages (Facebook and Instagram).

Members accomplish this through their attendance at the full Council meetings, but also by serving on two of the sub-committees (Spiritual Life and Worship, Parish and Community Outreach, Youth, Family and Community Life, Evangelization and Faith Formation).





PASTORAL COUNCIL—MEETING MINUTES

The Pastoral Council met on Monday, June 17, 2024. In attendance were Fathers Joe, Michael, and Martin, President Mary Corrigan, Vice-president Bud Volz, Secretary Betty Lasker, Roland Baikal, Maura Chasse, Dwight Davis, Fayne Molloy, Elaine Pavasaris, and Nancy Timbrell. Absent members were Ed Schmitt and Ron Levandowsky.

The election of officers for the 2024-25 season took place with Mary Corrigan and Bud Volz continuing to serve in their current roles as president and vice-president. Maura Chasse was nominated to serve as secretary, replacing Betty Lasker whose term on the council is ending. The members unanimously voted to approve the candidates in those respective positions. The Council recognized Roland Baikal and Betty Lasker as their terms come to an end. Current members were encouraged to submit names of potential parishioners to fill the four vacant positions that will be present in the fall. Nancy Timbrell's time on the Council is also ending following a final year as President emeritus.

Mary Corrigan reported that a good number of people attended the recently held Ministry Fair. Ed Schmitt's effort to invite all parishioners who have registered within the last year proved to be a successful draw for the attendance numbers. Some of these individuals signed up for various ministries; however, as Father Joe indicated, the fair is a chance to plant seeds with parishioners for either some volunteer service or the opportunity to take advantage of what the ministries have to offer.

Mary went on to recap the many achievements of the council this year and thanked all those who worked so hard to make the initiatives such a success. Two questions were asked regarding the status of the rectory at Sacred Heart and the possible consolidation of Masses at the parish. Father Joe indicated that, as of now, the rectory is being used for meeting space and there are no planned changes to the current Mass schedule.

Father Martin reported on the responses received from the *Called by Name* Initiative. Thirty-five viable names were submitted. He indicated that these individuals will be receiving communication from the Archdiocese regarding the potential calling to religious life. He emphasized that this is in no way a binding agreement. It is merely recommending an individual who might have a calling to priesthood or *religious life*.

Father Joe went on to report that the parish has met and gone over the goal set by the Archdiocese for the Archbishop's Annual Appeal. Although we have met our goal, Father continues to be concerned that the number of donors this year is far less than in the past. In an effort to update the information the parish has for the Helping Hands Ministry, 330 letters were mailed to parishioners who are over 80 years of age. The parish received 95 responses with 24 responding that could use some assistance. Some requested a call or a visit while others

needed help with grocery shopping or yard maintenance. Mark Duplin matched up the Helping Hands volunteers with these parishioners. In addition, the parish received some updated information on our seniors which, as Father indicated, is always important to have.

Each of the four subcommittees of the Pastoral Council, Spiritual Life and Worship, Parish and Community Outreach, Youth, Family and Community Life, and Evangelization and Faith Formation summarized the progress each has made on their respective goals. Details of planned events will be published in the bulletin and on the church website.

Robin Veronesi submitted a written report to the Council where she reported on the number of students receiving their First Holy Communion and Confirmation. She has submitted the schedule for the 2024-25 school year and is in the process of securing speakers for the Confirmation retreats. The children's Masses will resume in the fall. Robin, as the Safe Environment coordinator for the parish, is in the process of completing the annual Parish audit for the Archdiocese.

Jill Conaway submitted a report detailing the enrollment as of June 6, 2024 to be 234 students. Currently there are 263 students registered for the fall; however, inevitably this number changes over the summer, so a final number will not be known until school opens again on August 29th. The current submitted budget has been built around 245 students. The faculty will work this coming year on the self-study required prior to the next site visit from NEAS&C which is scheduled for the 2025-26 school year.

Josh Kay, the Youth Minister for the parish, submitted a written report on the Edge and Life Teen Programs outlining the mission, overview and short-term goals of each program. Both programs began this year in January. Activities for each will also be held throughout the summer. Josh is actively recruiting for more adult volunteers to participate in both the middle school and high school group. Josh also reported on the status of training and participation in the altar server group, adult Confirmation and the newly formed College Ministry.

Father Joe reported that the finances for both the parish and school continue to be in very good shape. The Finance Committee will be meeting in July prior to the budget being submitted to the Archdiocese by August 15th. Father went on to report that the carpet in the church at St. Paul will soon be replaced. Due to the generosity of two parishioners, the full cost will be covered by their donations, thus not affecting the parish's resources. The school has a water pipe on the first floor that will be repaired as well as the fencing around the playground area. The four sets of concrete steps around the school are scheduled to be replaced. Some other work on the exterior of the building is also needed, but initial bid was higher than anticipated. A part of this may be done instead of all of it.
