

#### Religious Education Registration and Catechists Needed -

The deadline to register for this year's classes was July 31st. If you have not yet registered your child(ren) see page 5 and please do so promptly. We are still in need of three (3) more catechists in grades 4, 5 and 8. Please seriously consider sharing the gift of faith with our children. Again see page 5 to let us know of your interest.

Saint Paul School - The first day of classes for the new school year is coming quickly on Thursday, August 29th. Currently the school has a projected enrollment increase of about 9% (22 students) for the coming school year. Most grades are at or near capacity, but there is room in the 1st and 2nd grades particularly. For admission information and current school news, visit ourschool.stpaulkensington.org. She will be happy to introduce you to the many great opportunities that await you and your child at Saint Paul School.

Adult Confirmation Program - We are offering a six session Adult Confirmation Program for adult Catholics, 18 years of age and older, who have been baptized and received 1st Holy Communion, but have not been confirmed. Those who are asked to be a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor at Confirmation must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation in order to take on those responsibilities. Likewise, those to be married in the Catholic Church should be Confirmed. The program will run for six (6) consecutive Sundays beginning September 22nd from 10:15 am to 11:45 am. This allows the participant to attend Mass either before or after the session. Those who complete the program would receive the Sacrament of Confirmation on Wednesday, November 6th at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford. also email Joshua Kay at j.kay@stpaulkensington.org or call the St. Paul Parish Office at 860-828-0331. The deadline to register is Monday, September 16.

Is the OCIA (RCIA) for You or Someone You Know? - A very important program that begins each year in the parish is our OCIA program (Order of Christian Initiation for Adults), formerly called RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults). It begins in October, this year on October 10th. The first word in the title of this program was changed from Rite to Order to remind all involved in the program, and all of us, that growth in our faith is not a one and done, but rather that it is ongoing.

The OCIA program is for those:

- \* Adults who have never been baptized
- \* Adults who have been baptized in another Christian tradition and want to become Catholic
- Adults who were baptized Catholic, but have had little or no instruction in the faith or have not received the Sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation.

It takes nearly ten years from the time a man enters until he is ordained a priest, and a just a few years less than that for the Friar-Brothers to complete their initial formation. **Summer Maintenance and Repair Projects -** In the two weeks between the end of Summer Camp and school starting up next week, we are trying to complete a few projects around the campus. At the school, and funded through the school's budget, four sets of outside stairs are being replaced. The 60+ years of winter weather had taken enough of a toll that given their deterioration it was time to replace them. Next month the playground fencing will be repaired which is also a school expense. Over the last two summers we had sealed cracks in the parking lots and completely resealed and re-striped all of the St. Paul parking lots. As a result, we just have some cracks to seal in the parking lots this year. This is one of the many projects that your monthly Maintenance and Repair donations help to cover. Thank you!!!

# ADULT CONFIRMATION PROGRAM

Six Session Program Begins September 22, 2024.

Are you an adult Catholic who never received the Sacrament of Confirmation? If so, St. Paul's Adult Confirmation Program (ACP) will prepare you to be Confirmed in the Fall of 2024. The reception of all of the Sacraments is about helping us journey through this life to life eternal. The Sacrament of Confirmation is a confirming and strengthening of our Baptism. Through the Sacrament you are sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit and Confirmation provides additional graces to help us live out our adult lives as faithful followers of Jesus and strengthens our bond with the Church. Those who are asked to be a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor at Confirmation must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation in order to take on those responsibilities. Likewise, those to be married in the Catholic Church should be Confirmed.

Who is eligible? Catholics who are at least 18 years old and have already been baptized and received their 1st Holy Communion may participate. If married, you must be in a valid Catholic marriage. If you were married outside the Catholic Church (meaning in a civil ceremony or in a non-Catholic Church without the appropriate permission) and would like to discuss how you can have your marriage recognized in the Church, contact one of the Friar-priests and they will be happy to discuss with you your situation. Your preparation for Confirmation can be done simultaneously with the preparation to have your marriage convalidated in the Church, but the convalidation must be concluded before the Confirmation ceremony. Generally speaking, this can often be accomplished.

When will the program be held? Sunday mornings at the Parish Center from Sept. 22 through Oct. 27.

What do the sessions entail? Each session will offer instruction on a particular topic through a variety of means, as well as time for reflection, prayer and a time for questions.

What Information must I supply? You must complete a registration form and provide proof of your Baptism and 1st Holy Communion if you received those sacraments at a parish other than St. Paul's. If you are married you also need to provide proof of the marriage.

When and Where Would I be Confirmed? The Archdiocese of Hartford will schedule an Adult Confirmation Ceremony for a date in November at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford.

Who will lead the program? Josh Kay, our Director of Youth Ministry and Adult Catechesis, will lead the sessions.

What is the cost? Just your time and participation. There is no monetary cost.

How do I register? Complete our simple online form or send an email to Josh Kay at j.kay @stpaulkensington.org or call the parish office at 860-828-0331.



# SCRIPTURE STUDY—INFORMATIONAL MEETING

An Information/Registration Meeting for our upcoming Fall 2024 Scripture Study program will be held on Tuesday, August 27 at 7pm in the St. Paul Church Hall. All are welcome!

Our St. Paul Scripture Study Ministry brings together parishioners in small groups of 8-10 people to read, reflect on and pray with the Scriptures so as to better discern the Word of God in our lives. The groups are involved in two studies each year: one begins in March and the other begins in September. Each study delves into either a book of the Bible or a Biblical theme and entails 5-6 bi-weekly meetings that take place either in the Parish Center or the Sacred Heart Rectory. We follow the curriculum of Little Rock Scripture Study (littlerockscripture.org).

Our next study will be **The Letter to the Hebrews**. This study involves a little reading on your own and participating in small group meetings about twice a month in the parish center beginning the week of September 9. Hebrews is more like a sermon than a letter. It reviews the history of Israel to demonstrate how Jesus Christ fulfills and even surpasses all the hopes expressed in the Old Testament. It presents Jesus as the unique High Priest who is simultaneously the one who offers sacrifice to God and is himself the sacrifice. It describes the exaltation of Jesus Christ as superior to all that came before, whether prophet, priest or angel. Jesus is presented as our High Priest whose compassion for us is rooted in his humanity, but whose sacrifice is all sufficient because he is without sin.

Why not join us and learn more at the Informational Meeting at the Parish Center on Tuesday, August 27 at 7pm.

The readings at Mass take on a whole new perspective as we come to know the books' authors, their intended audience and the connections between the Old and New Testaments.
