

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Condolences - Please remember in your prayers the soul of Robert Fritz, the father of our Bulletin Coordinator and Publisher, Maura Gaffney, who died on August 17 in New Jersey. May his soul rest in peace and may the Lord's consolation accompany Maura, her siblings, and all who grieve the loss of Bob in their lives just 13 months after they lost their mom.

Are You Someone or Do You Know Someone Who . . . has expressed an interest in becoming Catholic? Or was baptized Catholic as a child, but has not celebrated the Sacraments of Eucharist or Confirmation?

If so, the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA, formerly known as RCIA) is a wonderful opportunity to come together in a small group to learn more about the Catholic faith. The OCIA sessions focus on the teachings and experience of the Church and prepares individuals to celebrate the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, that they have not yet received, at the Easter Vigil on April 19, 2025 so as to grow in their faith and become closer to God.

Maybe you were baptized, but never received First Holy Communion and Confirmation. Maybe you know someone who was baptized in another faith tradition, but has expressed interest in becoming Catholic. Maybe it is someone who has only just begun to think about a life of faith. I encourage all parishioners to think about and pray about someone who you think might be interested in the OCIA program. If you are not sure how to approach the person feel free to speak to one of the Friars.

Adults from all faith traditions or no religious background at all, are welcome to participate. We have some people for the program already. The sessions will be held on Thursdays beginning October 10. For information about the details of the OCIA program please contact Fr. 

You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition." He summoned the crowd again and said to them, "Hear me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person: but the things that come out from within are what defile. "From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within and they defile."





Amy G., a religious education coordinator in N.J., wrote the following article, offering responses to reasons why people hesitate to become catechists. It appeared on Joe Paprocki's website "Catechist's Journey" www.catechistsjourney.org. Joe is a National Consultant for Faith Formation at Loyola Press. A few areas have been edited to provide information specific to Saint Paul's religious education program.

"I'm hesitant to become a catechist because..."

"...I don't know if I can handle a group of kids. I don't know if kids will like me."

Everyone is nervous going into a classroom on their first day of teaching (Some of us were nervous for our first several weeks of teaching). The good news is that the children already know how to behave in a classroom from being at school; however, they will sometimes act up. Children thrive when there are clear expectations for their behavior and clear consequences for when they step out of line. If you are friendly, fair, and firm with your students, classroom discipline comes easier.

"...I don't know if I'll be able to answer kids' questions."
Our textbooks are very easy to use and the answers to most questions you will be asked will come from the text. However, sometimes, kids come up with really excellent questions that are not all that easy to answer. There is absolutely nothing wrong with saying, "I don't know, but I'll find out and tell you next time we meet." Then, after class, you can just walk down to the Religious Ed Office and ask us for the answer.



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (CONTINUED)

"...I'm not sure that I have anything to share."

Teaching religion is not just about passing on facts for memorization. In addition to helping the children learn about God, the catechist must help the young people in his or her class to get to know Jesus Christ through His Church; to foster in them a relationship with Jesus. If you're thinking about serving God as a catechist, you probably have a relationship with Our Lord already.

"...I'm not sure that I know just what the Church teaches. I'm afraid I'll say something wrong."

Our textbooks are in conformity with the Catechism of the Catholic Church. That means that everything in our textbooks is in line with what the Church teaches. The key here is never to guess at what the Church teaches. If you don't know, just say, "I'm not sure, let me get back to you" and ask the Religious Ed Office.

"...I don't have any formal training to teach and I've never taught before."

Our texts come with a variety of activities you can use in each lesson and they give you a hand with how to plan lessons. I heard a priest once say, "God doesn't call the qualified; He qualifies the called." At our parish, we qualify those who are called to the ministry of catechesis by holding teaching training at the beginning of the year and providing online training modules.

"...I don't know if I have the time."

Being a catechist is definitely a time commitment. And it's not just the hour that you're here in the classroom. For your time with your students to go well, you need to prepare before you walk into the classroom for at least an hour. Maybe preparing and teaching 12 classes doesn't fit into your schedule right now. There are also opportunities to serve as a teacher's aide or a substitute teacher to get a feel for what this is like.

ADULT CONFIRMATION PROGRAM

Six Session Program Begins September 22, 2024.

Are you an adult Catholic who never received the Sacrament of Confirmation? If so, St. Paul's Adult Confirmation Program (ACP) will prepare you to be Confirmed in the Fall of 2024. The reception of all of the Sacraments is about helping us journey through this life to life eternal. The Sacrament of Confirmation is a confirming and strengthening of our Baptism. Through the Sacrament you are sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit and Confirmation provides additional graces to help us live out our adult lives as faithful followers of Jesus and strengthens our bond with the Church. Those who are asked to be a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor at Confirmation must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation in order to take on those responsibilities. Likewise, those to be married in the Catholic Church should be Confirmed.

Who is eligible? Catholics who are at least 18 years old and have already been baptized and received their 1st Holy Communion may participate. If married, you must be in a valid Catholic marriage. If you were married outside the Catholic Church (meaning in a civil ceremony or in a non-Catholic Church without the appropriate permission) and would like to discuss how you can have your marriage recognized in the Church, contact one of the Friar-priests and they will be happy to discuss with you your situation. Your preparation for Confirmation can be done simultaneously with the preparation to have your marriage convalidated in the Church, but the convalidation must be concluded before the Confirmation ceremony. Generally speaking, this can often be accomplished.

When will the program be held? Sunday mornings at the Parish Center from Sept. 22 through Oct. 27.

What do the sessions entail? Each session will offer instruction on a particular topic through a variety of means, as well as time for reflection, prayer and a time for questions.

What Information must I supply? You must complete a registration form and provide proof of your Baptism and 1st Holy Communion if you received those sacraments at a parish other than St. Paul's. If you are married you also need to provide proof of the marriage.

When and Where Would I be Confirmed? The Archdiocese of Hartford will schedule an Adult Confirmation Ceremony for a date in November at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford.


Who will lead the program? Josh Kay, our Director of Youth Ministry and Adult Catechesis, will lead the sessions.



SCRIPTURE STUDY—INFORMATIONAL MEETING

An Information/Registration Meeting for our upcoming Fall 2024 Scripture Study program will be held <u>THIS WEEK</u> on Tuesday, August 27 at 7pm in the St. Paul Church Hall. All are welcome!

Our St. Paul Scripture Study Ministry brings together parishioners in small groups of 8-10 people to read, reflect on and pray with the Scriptures so as to better discern the Word of God in our lives. The groups are involved in two studies each year: one begins in March and the other begins in September. Each study delves into either a book of the Bible or a Biblical theme and entails 5-6 bi-weekly meetings that take place either in the Parish Center or the Sacred Heart Rectory. We follow the curriculum of Little Rock Scripture Study (littlerockscripture.org).

Our next study will be **The Letter to the Hebrews**. This study involves a little reading on your own and participating in small group meetings about twice a month in the parish center beginning the week of September 9. Hebrews is more like a sermon than a letter. It reviews the history of Israel to demonstrate how Jesus Christ fulfills and even surpasses all the hopes expressed in the Old Testament. It presents Jesus as the unique High Priest who is simultaneously the one who offers sacrifice to God and is himself the sacrifice. It describes the exaltation of Jesus Christ as superior to all that came before, whether prophet, priest or angel. Jesus is presented as our High Priest whose compassion for us is rooted in his humanity, but whose sacrifice is all sufficient because he is without sin.

Why not join us and learn more at the Informational Meeting at the Parish Center on Tuesday, August 27 at 7pm.

The readings at Mass take on a whole new perspective as we come to know the books' authors, their intended audience and the connections between the Old and New Testaments.


