



Adult Faith Formation - Please see page 8 for information about the **Adult Confirmation Program** that begins on Sunday, September 22nd and is geared toward Catholics who have already been baptized and already receive Holy Communion, but have never been Confirmed. In order to be a godparent or a Confirmation sponsor, the person must have been Confirmed.

The second adult Faith Formation Program is the OCIA, formerly known as RCIA. This journey of faith is designed for those who are exploring the Catholic faith for the first time as well as for Catholics who are trying to deepen their sacramental life in the Church. Diaconate Program - Last year you will recall that one of our parishioners, Francis Volz, aka Bud, was accepted as an Aspirant into the Permanent Diaconate Program for the Archdiocese of Hartford. With his acceptance, Bud began a five year formation program toward becoming a Permanent Deacon. He is one of 15 men in this class, and Bud and all of the others have moved on to the second year of the program. His second year begins this week with a concentration in Sacred Scripture beginning with the Old Testament. Please keep Bud in your prayers as he continues his formation.







ADULT CONFIRMATION PROGRAM

Six Session Program Begins September 22, 2024.

Are you an adult Catholic who never received the Sacrament of Confirmation? If so, St. Paul's Adult Confirmation Program (ACP) will prepare you to be Confirmed in the Fall of 2024. The reception of all of the Sacraments is about helping us journey through this life to life eternal. The Sacrament of Confirmation is a confirming and strengthening of our Baptism. Through the Sacrament you are sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit and Confirmation provides additional graces to help us live out our adult lives as faithful followers of Jesus and strengthens our bond with the Church. Those who are asked to be a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor at Confirmation must have received the Sacrament of Confirmation in order to take on those responsibilities. Likewise, those to be married in the Catholic Church should be Confirmed.

Who is eligible? Catholics who are at least 18 and have already been baptized and received 1st Holy Communion may participate. If married, you must be in a valid Catholic marriage. If you were married outside the Catholic Church (meaning in a civil ceremony or in a non-Catholic Church without the appropriate permission) and would like to discuss how you can have your marriage recognized in the Church, contact one of the Friar-priests and they will be happy to discuss with you your situation. Your preparation for Confirmation can be done simultaneously with preparation to have your marriage convalidated in the Church, but the convalidation must be concluded before the Confirmation ceremony. Generally speaking, this can often be accomplished.

When will the program be held? Sunday mornings at the Parish Center from Sept. 22 through Oct. 27.

When and Where Would I be Confirmed? The Archdiocese of Hartford will schedule an Adult Confirmation Ceremony for a date in November at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford.

Who will lead the program? Josh Kay, our Director of Youth Ministry and Adult Catechesis, will lead the sessions.

What is the cost? Just your time and participation. There is no monetary cost.


