Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick - We will celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick after all weekend Masses next weekend, October 12 & 13. The Sacrament is not just for those who are imminently dying. If you are suffering with a chronic condition, serious medical problem, preparing for surgery, and/or the effects of aging, you are invited to stay after Mass next weekend to be anointed. The service (about 15 minutes) will be done for all at once with each person being anointed individually.

Who can receive this Sacrament? All of the Sacraments, including the Anointing of the Sick, assure us of God's accompaniment through life. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is considered a sacrament of healing and addresses the human reality that as humans we experience sickness, accidents, aging, and disease. While we pray for physical healing, we know that



we will all eventually die. The most important healing is spiritual healing. In this case, Jesus offers us courage and strength to carry our cross of suffering as he carried His. This excerpt from the Catechism of the Catholic Church (1499-1532) explains who can receive this sacrament:

"The Anointing of the Sick is not a sacrament only for

"The Anointing of the Sick is not a sacrament only for those who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for [them] to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived. If a sick person who received this anointing recovers [their] health, [they] can in the case of another grave illness receive this sacrament again. If during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious, the sacrament may be repeated. It is fitting to receive the Anointing of the Sick just prior to a serious operation. The same holds for the elderly whose frailty becomes more pronounced." If you are still unsure, don't hesitate to ask one of the Friars. After each Mass on Oct. 12 & 13, all to be anointed will be asked to come to the front of the new wing and be seated in EVERY OTHER row so that the priests can easily come to you for the laying on of hands and the anointing with the Oil of the Sick. As a reminder, you can always approach one of the priests after Mass to ask to be anointed, especially if you know that you have surgery coming up. You can also call the parish office and arrange for a priest to come to administer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick for yourself or a loved one. Human frailty is a part of the reality of life; our loving God is with us through this sacrament to strengthen us when our minds or bodies grow weak. Come and receive the grace the Sacrament offers you.






