

#### **Scripture Study Update**

Our Scripture Study groups recently completed the Letter to the Hebrews. We had 52 parishioners participate within five study groups from September through mid-November.



Letter to the Hebrews celebrates the greatness of Jesus as the Son of God and as the great high priest. The letter goes back to the Old Testament to show how Jesus was the full revelation of the messianic prophesies and psalms. This eloquent letter was written by an unnamed author to encourage recently converted Jewish-Christians to endure in their faith in the face of persecution which they were up against in the first century.

Our next study will be a "themed study" entitled, "Women of the Old Testament". In Scripture, we encounter God and come to know God's people.

Women in the Old Testament, Part One, will take us on a journey through Israel's beginnings, Israel's captivity and freedom, and Israel's tribal period from the perspective of the earliest women of salvation history, such as Sarah, Deborah, and Ruth.

In Women in the Old Testament, Part Two, we will explore stories of women of the Bible such as Judith and Esther, whose complexities and gifts broke stereotypes and continue to reveal God to us.

Participants will use the commentary from Little Rock Scripture Study



and have access to online summary lectures. We will begin this study the first week of February, 2025. There will be an information/registration meeting in the church hall in January at which interested parishioners can learn all the details. Stay tuned to more information ahead in the Parish Bulletin.

Our Scripture Study groups designated volunteer readers, and they read the entire Letter to the Hebrews with Fr. Michael on November 19th.
