



The New Calendar Year is a time of new beginnings, goals, celebrations, and reflection, and New Year's Day is also one of the most special days in the Church – the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. One week after we celebrate the birth of Christ, we give thanks to His mother. This solemnity is also the final day in the Octave of Christmas and the World Day of Peace.

The Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, also known as Three Kings Day, falls on Sunday, January 5, 2025. In the Catholic tradition, Epiphany was always celebrated on January 6. Beginning with the 1970 liturgical year (which commenced on November 30,1969), the feast was moved in the United States to the first Sunday following January 1.

Epiphany begins on January 5th and lasts until the following Sunday, January 12th. So, keep your trees up!

This holy day marks the arrival of the Magi to worship the Baby Jesus and the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles as the Savior of the world.

Although little is known about the Three Wise Men, tradition provides us with their names: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. The Epiphany celebrates the moment Christ, the ultimate gift, was made known to the Three Wise Men and thus the Gentiles. Their journey is central to the Feast of the Three Kings, highlighting the global acknowledgment of Jesus as the Messiah.

Scripture Study


The St. Paul Scripture Study Ministry brings together parishioners in small groups of 8-10 people to read, reflect on and pray with the Scriptures so as to better discern the Word of God in



our lives. The groups are involved in two studies each year, one begins in February or March and the other begins in September. Each study delves into either a book of the Bible or a Biblical theme and entails 6-9 bi-weekly meetings that take place either in the St. Paul Parish Center or Sacred Heart Rectory. We follow the Little Rock Scripture Study curriculum (littlerockscripture.org). It is designed to have each person do a personal reading of the assigned chapters, reflect on it with some suggested questions, and then meet with a small group to pray and share those reflections. At the conclusion of each study, Father Michael provides the entire group with a wrap-up summary lecture in the Church Hall. The readings at Mass take on a whole new perspective as we come to know the books' authors, their intended audience and the connections between the Old and New Testaments.
