



PARISH NEWS

Today we celebrate the **Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord**. The word epiphany comes from the Greek and means "to reveal" or make manifest or show. God makes known to us that Jesus is His son. Our Feast today celebrates the manifestation of Jesus to the three Magi as related in Saint Matthew's Gospel.

However, Epiphany originally celebrated four different events: the Nativity of Christ; the visitation of the Magi, the Baptism of the Lord; and Christ's first miracle, the changing of water into wine at the wedding in Cana.

Each of these is a revelation of God to us. At the Nativity, the angels bear witness to Christ, and the shepherds, representing the people of Israel, bow down before Him. At the visitation of the Magi; Jesus' divinity is revealed to the Gentiles—the other nations of the earth. At Jesus' Baptism, the Holy Spirit descends and the voice of God the Father is heard declaring, 'This is my beloved Son, listen to him'. At the wedding in Cana, the miracle or turning water into wine reveals Jesus' divinity.

Next weekend, Jan. 12, we celebrate **The Baptism of the Lord**. This feast is a good moment for all of us to consider anew the meaning of our own baptisms and our call to be disciples and followers of the Lord. We all know the date of our birth, but do you know the date of your baptism? This may be a good time to consider how God might be calling you to use your gifts and talents for the benefit of His people both in the context of parish ministries and in the broader community. Maybe it is something for you to pray over this week.

Blessing of Homes

The Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord is traditionally a time when homes are blessed. What follows is a ceremony and blessing that you can use in your own homes.

- 1. Start with a Christmas Carol
- 2. Read from the Bible about the visit of the Magi in Matthew 2: 1-12.
- 3. Then the leader prays: The three Wise Men Casper, Melchior, and Balthazar journeyed to Bethlehem to find the Christ Child, and followed the star of God's Son, who became man. May the peace of Christ rest in our home. May our home be a dwelling of the Lord's mercy, love, joy, peace, and forgiveness. May all who enter our home experience Jesus Christ in all that we say and do throughout this New Year. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
- 4.A member of the family marks the doorpost of the primary entry points of the house with chalk 20+C+M+B+25.
- 5. Close the ceremony with another Christmas Carol.

The meaning of the doorpost markings 20+C+M+B+25 -

The letters are the initials of the traditional names of the three Magi: Casper, Melchior, and Balthazar. These letters also abbreviate the Latin phrase *Christus mansionem benedicat*, "May Christ bless the house." And of course, the beginning and ending numbers are the year. If you would like one of the Friars to come to bless your house, call the Parish Office to set that up or contact one of us directly.

# 5 Simple Spiritual Resolutions for the New Year

Have you thought about making a spiritual resolution for the New Year? Below are a few suggestions. Consider adding just one or two of these activities to your life in the new year!

- 1. Increase your Marian devotion. The way to turn back to God is the same way that God came to us—through the Blessed Mother. In 2025, commit yourself to increasing your Marian devotion so that she may lead you to deeper conversion; to a renewed following of God's will for your life; and to an increase of your faith and trust in Jesus Christ.
- 2. Make more time for spiritual reading. If you want to make progress in your walk with God in 2025, spiritual reading should be high on your list. Your best bet is to stick to the classics written by Catholic saints known for their practical spiritual wisdom such as Teresa of Avila, Francis de Sales, Therese of Lisieux, and John of the Cross.
- 3. Share your Catholic faith with others. With so many people far away from God today, the culture is ripe for evangelization. There is a real hunger for God and His Truth. Focus on doing simple things, such as being joyful in your walk with Christ and inviting people to come to Mass with you. You could also buy some sacramentals, get them blessed, and hand them out to people. If someone you know is going through a difficult time and you give them a Miraculous Medal or a prayer card out of a stash you keep handy, it might be the touch of God that they need in that moment.
- 4. Bring back regular penances. Living a penitential life, even outside of Advent and Lent, is the Catholic way of life. All of the Church's saints performed penances habitually, either internally or externally, great and small, for themselves and for others. Many Catholics do not know that Fridays outside of Lent are also days of abstinence and penance. While the Church law against eating meat on the Fridays outside of Lent was altered by the U.S. bishops—meaning, it can be substituted with some other form of penance—it was never removed entirely. Such penances give special reverence to the day of the week on which Our Lord died on the Cross. Remember that penances aren't meant to be pleasant at first, but the graces that come from them grow sweeter with time.
- Go an extra day to Mass during the week. Mass is not only the source and summit of our Faith—it is also the source and summit of our very life. This new year, think of ways you can arrange your schedule and activities so that you can make it to Mass either an extra day each week, or a few extra days a month. If you have trouble with this due to a packed schedule, pray and ask Our Lord to help you find the time.

# Scripture Study

The St. Paul Scripture Study Ministry brings together parishioners in small



groups of 8-10 people to read, reflect on and pray with the Scriptures so as to better discern the Word of God in our lives. The groups are involved in two studies each year, one begins in February or March and the other begins in September. Each study delves into either a book of the Bible or a Biblical theme and entails 6-9 bi-weekly meetings that take place either in the St. Paul Parish Center or Sacred Heart Rectory. We follow the Little Rock Scripture Study curriculum (littlerockscripture.org). It is designed to have each person do a personal reading of the assigned chapters, reflect on it with some suggested questions, and then meet with a small group to pray and share those reflections. At the conclusion of each study, Father Michael provides the entire group with a wrap-up summary lecture in the Church Hall. The readings at Mass take on a whole new perspective as we come to know the books' authors, their intended audience and the connections between the Old and New Testaments. 




