

#### THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

We also celebrate, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on Sunday, February 2nd. Here is a brief refresher about this feast day from simplycatholic.com

"Under Mosaic law found in the Old Testament Book of Leviticus. a Jewish woman who gave birth to a child was considered unclean (see 12:1-8). The mother of a newborn could not routinely go out into public and had to avoid all things sacred, including the Temple. If her



child was a male, this exclusion lasted for 40 days. If the child was female, the period lasted 80 days. This was a ceremonial seclusion and not the result of sin or some kind of wrongdoing on the part of the mother.

At the end of the 40 or 80 days the woman presented herself at the Temple to be purified. If the baby was her firstborn male child, the infant was brought along to the Temple to be dedicated to the Lord. The law in Exodus specifies that the first male child belongs to God (see 13:2-16). This law is a tribute to God for His sparing the firstborn Israelite males during the time of the Exodus from Egypt. The firstborn Egyptian male children, of course, were not spared.

The mother's purification ritual obliged her to bring, or purchase at the Temple, a lamb and a turtledove as sacrificial offerings. The lamb was offered in thanksgiving to God for the successful birth of the child; the turtledove was a sin offering. Families that could not afford a lamb could bring two pigeons or two turtledoves. After these animals were sacrificed, the Temple priest prayed over the woman and she could once again resume her normal role or status.

Mary, the ever spotless Mother of God, certainly did not have to comply with this ritual, but did so to honor God and observe all the rules handed down by Moses. She was the holiest of all women, but she still submitted to the humbling requirements of the law. She remained at home for 40 days,

denied herself all association with sacred things and on the day required walked the five miles from Bethlehem to the Temple in Jerusalem. Arriving at the Temple, Mary likely stood in line and waited her turn to see the priest.

"Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that the boats were in danger of sinking. When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him, and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon. Jesus said to Simon. "Do not be afraid: from now on you will be catching men." When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him.



# February 8: International Day of Prayer and Awareness Against Human Trafficking



February 8th is the feast day of Saint Josephine Bakhita, patron saint of victims of human trafficking.

Bakhita was born in 1869 in a small village in Darfur. As a child, she was kidnapped and sold into slavery in the Sudan where she endured torture and beating at the hands of multiple owners.

Eventually Bakhita found herself serving as a caretaker for a young girl at a school in Venice, Italy run by the Canossian Sisters. She became intrigued by the Catholic faith and felt called to learn more about the Church. She was eventually baptized by the name Josephine Margaret and was also eventually declared a free woman by the Italian courts as slavery had become illegal in both Italy and Sudan. Bakhita, which means "fortunate" in Arabic, entered the Canossian Sisters where she served for 45 years dedicating her life to sharing her testament of deliverance and to comforting the poor and suffering. Saint Josephine was beatified in 1992 and canonized shortly after on October 2000 by Pope John Paul II. She is the first person to be canonized from Sudan and is the patron saint of the country.
