




The Shroud is believed to be the cloth in which Jesus' body was wrapped after his Crucifixion. The linen sheet features the image of a man who bears the marks of flagellation and crucifixion. And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him. "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them. "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.





Blessed Carlo Acutis will soon be Saint Carlo Acutis!

Carlo Acutis will become the Catholic Church's first millennial saint at a canonization Mass on April 27 in St. Peter's Square in Rome.

Carlo Acutis was born in 1991, in London to a wealthy Italian family, and he grew up in Milan. His precocious faith journey took off after he received First Communion at the young age of 7, and he regularly attended daily Mass, prayed the rosary and participated in eucharistic adoration.

While he enjoyed regular pastimes for his age - hiking, video games, and joking around with friends - he also taught catechism in a local parish and did outreach to the homeless. Acutis used his computer savvy to create an online exhibit about more than 100 eucharistic miracles recognized by the church over many centuries, focused on the real presence of Christ. At the age 15, Carlo fell ill. Ten days later, he died of acute leukemia at a hospital in northern Italy. His body was later transferred to an Assisi cemetery as Acutis had asked, because of his devotion to the hometown medieval saint. St. Francis. from apnews.com


