What is Pentecost?

On the Feast of Pentecost, we commemorate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles as they gathered around the Mother of the Lord (Acts 2). The signs of the Holy Spirit were the "sound ... from heaven like the rush of a mig



the "sound ... from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind" (Acts 2:2) and "tongues as of fire" over the disciples' heads (Acts 2:3). The Greek word *pentekoste* means "fiftieth." Pentecost is celebrated on the 50th and final day of the Easter season. When the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples, they immediately began proclaiming the Gospel. In fact, three thousand people were baptized that day. The disciples, through the gift of the Holy Spirit, were answering Jesus' call to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19). The Holy Spirit is vital in the mission and witness of the Church, so we consider Pentecost the birthday of the Church. -ewtn.com

The liturgical color on June 7/8 is red. So all are invited to wear some red as a way of trying to unite an inward openness to the workings and gifts of the Holy Spirit in your life with an external expression of faith.






