and deeply rooted in Your love.

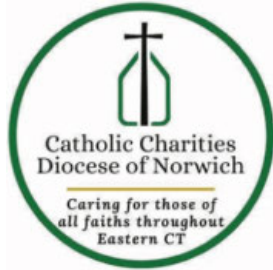
Through the intercessions of Mary, the Mother of the Church,

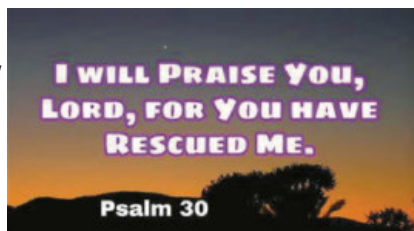
Acts, 5:27-32 40b-41, Psalm 30, "I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me." Revelation 5:11-14 John 21:1-19 or 21:1-14

In the days and weeks that followed the Resurrection, the risen Lord kept appearing to his disciples when and where they least expected: in a locked room in Jerusalem, on the road to Emmaus, on the shore of the Sea of Tiberias. Each time, it took a while for them to recognize him. We often fail to recognize him as well, even though we know he continues to appear in our midst today. Whether in the person in need, in God's word, in the Eucharist, or in each other, let us be reminded that he continues to offer his presence to us every day.

It is not a surprise to see Peter out on the sea fishing. He was, after all, a fisherman. Without Jesus to lead him, Peter returns to his old vocation. It is also unsurprising to see him fishing at night. From the middle of the sea, he won't be able to hear the rooster crowing at dawn, that daily reminder of his betrayal on that fateful morning. Finally, it was inevitable that their labor produce nothing; the same thing happened before they encountered Jesus the first time. Symbolically, the contrast between their catch without Jesus (zero) and with Jesus (one hundred fifty-three, thought to represent all the known species) cannot be starker. At last, Peter realizes that his true vocation is to "catch" disciples from every place on earth.

After Jesus had been arrested and taken away, Peter stood by a charcoal fire to warm himself when he was accused three times of being one of Jesus' disciples. Now, after Jesus has died and risen and returned to reveal himself to his disciples, he and Peter are again surrounding a charcoal fire when Jesus asks him three times if he loves him. Jesus had known that Peter would deny him three times. Now he gives him the opportunity to reconcile with him three times. By allowing Peter to make amends, Jesus forgives him. Though we do not hear the cock crow at all, we are told all this happens after dawn. With dawn, a new day for Peter and all the disciples arises.

We hear Peter answer Jesus in the Gospel, but we see him show his love and loyalty to Jesus in the first reading. The Sanhedrin were determined to prevent any mention of Jesus, let alone preaching and teaching in his name. Not only does Peter *not deny Jesus, he proudly and courageously testifies to Jesus' glory and declares that he will follow God's orders and not theirs. Peter has put his convictions into action. He has given his fellow disciples, then and now, a model to follow.*



How to Evangelize

Sharing the gospel isn't a one-time event. It's something we ought to do every chance we get. We should always be prepared to take advantage of the unplanned opportunities we have to speak about the gospel to the people in our lives.

It was the apostle Peter who told us to be "ready at any time to give a defense to anyone who asks [us] for a reason for the hope that is in [us]" (1 Peter 3:15)—and that applies to the everyday conversations we have with others. Inevitably, during a car ride, talking over coffee, or in response to an injustice they've observed, people will ask, "Why?" and "How?" and "Why me?" And when they do, make sure you're ready to engage them truthfully and compassionately, pushing them—graciously and by the Spirit—to Jesus and his gospel, which can make sense of all they're experiencing. Be the person in their life who has the answer-FAITH!
