Pastor's Page

St. Joseph: This Friday, March 19, is the Solemnity of St. Joseph (so it is a day we are not bound to our Lenten fasts/sacrifices). St. Joseph is such an extraordinary saint who appeared so ordinary to others. He is silent in the gospels, but his silence speaks volumes about a man who is contemplative. The gospels say he is a just man (meaning holy or righteous) and he is a contemplative who acts as soon as he recognizes what he must do. He is sacrificial, as we see in his willingness to bring shame on himself by divorcing Mary quietly. He is a man of courage, willing to take up his family at a moment's notice to go to Egypt, a land he does not know, and provide for them as they face living in poverty. St. Joseph is the most chaste spouse of Our Lady, a model for men in particular today to show us the hearts of purity we are called to live in every aspect of our lives. He was a man of work, known as the carpenter, who we know worked hard. He was the perfect father, a man who helped form Jesus Christ in his character (God humbled himself to be obedient to Joseph and Mary). I hope you can join us for the Triduum this week where we will spend time praying about St. Joseph and to St. Joseph and his intercession.



Triduum for Solemnity of St. Joseph: Pope Francis declared that from Dec. 8, 2020, through Dec. 8, 2021, we would be celebrating the Year of St. Joseph for the first time in the history of the Church. The Solemnity of St. Joseph is on Friday,

March 19. Here at the parish to celebrate this great saint and his solemnity, on the evenings of Wednesday, March 17, to Friday, March 19, we will have a triduum honoring St. Joseph. Each evening at 7 p.m. we will have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, a guided meditation on some aspect of St. Joseph, prayers to St. Joseph, and conclude with benediction just before 8 p.m. On Friday, since there will be the holy hour at 7 p.m., the Stations of the Cross will be prayed at 6:30 p.m. that week. Please come join us whatever evenings you can.

Mass with the Bishop for Solemnity of St. Joseph: Please join Bishop daCunha at a special Mass on Friday, March 19, at 7 p.m. at St. Mary's Cathedral in Fall River to commemorate the Solemnity of St. Joseph. Consecration to St. Joseph: The Diocese of Fall River is promoting for all Catholics to consider during this Year of St. Joseph to take part in making the Consecration to St. Joseph. What is being recommended is for people to purchase the "Consecration to St. Joseph: The Wonders of our Spiritual Father" by Fr. Donald Calloway. This, like St. Louis deMontfort's True Devotion to Mary, is a 33-day spiritual preparation and reflection on St. Joseph. For those who wish to carry this out on a particular feast day of St. Joseph and who have not started, plan to begin the Preparation for the Consecration on March 30 and complete the reflections and make the Consecration to St. Joseph on May 1, the feast day of St. Joseph the Worker. You can make it at any time during the year (some people may want to do it in connection with the Consecration falling on their wedding anniversary) but it can always be a special way of remembering

it when we connect it to a day dedicated to St. Joseph. For more information on where to get the book "Consecration to St. Joseph," go to www.consecrationtostjoseph.org. For those who wish to participate with others in the parish, each Monday during April (as well by livestream) we will offer in the church the prayers that day in preparation for the Consecration. On Saturday, May 1, at noon in the church we will make the Consecration together.

Diocesan Opportunities and Suggestions for Year of St. Joseph: The Diocese is offering many suggestions and information on different ways to celebrate the Year of St. Joseph. There are things suggested for families and individuals, as well as different information regarding indulgences involved in celebrating this Year of St. Joseph. Diocesan Catholic Men and Women's Conference: Once again the Diocese of Fall River will hold its annual Catholic Men and Women's Conference. Because of the pandemic it is being held virtually. The event will be on Saturday, March 20, from 1-5 p.m. The event kicks off on the evening before with the Bishop celebrating Mass at the Cathedral in celebration of the Solemnity of St. Joseph at 7 p.m. Using Zoom video teleconferencing technology, parishioners from across the Diocese will be able to take part in a program of engaging presentations, prayer, music, and Mass to help them experience Lent and prepare well for the Triduum. If you are sick and in the hospital

If you are facing grave illness or going in for surgery at which they will be giving you anesthesia, please let Fr. Kevin know so he can come give you Confession, the Anointing of the Sick, and Communion (but only for a person who is dying, called Viaticum). Please know if you are admitted to the hospital for grave health, you should let them know that you are Catholic and would like the Anointing of the Sick or Confession (and please let your family know, if for some reason you are admitted to the hospital and unable to communicate, so your family can convey your wishes to the hospital). Currently at Rhode Island Hospital there is a priest chaplain, but some hospitals such as Sturdy do not have priest chaplains anymore, so ask them to contact Fr. Kevin, since you are a parishioner here.
