## Pastor's Page

This week we celebrate Holy Week, in particular the Sacred Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday), the holiest time of the year. We come to the core mysteries of our faith of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Let us ask the Holy Spirit to help us enter into this week the best we can. I strongly encourage everyone to not treat this as any other week but seize time every day for some more focused prayer.

We might want to pick up the Gospels and read the last few chapters of each one, focusing on the detail of what Our Lord underwent and how others responded. We could reflect on many dynamics that are manifested throughout the week. We might want to reflect on praying about the Eucharist and our response to this most precious gift (if possible, pray in the presence of the Lord in the Eucharist in Adoration). We might want to read and reflect on the priesthood of Jesus Christ, how we share in the royal priesthood of Christ, and the importance of the ministerial priesthood so we can live what we have received in baptism. We may reflect on the call to serve others and the new commandment of Christ to love one another as he has loved us.

The gospel accounts bring to light different dynamics of temptation and sin, especially how we see the falling of Judas and Peter, and their different responses to their falling. Of course, this week we will ponder the mystery of suffering, humility, trust in God's will, the cross, how Our Lady accompanied Jesus in his cross and death. Ultimately, we want to ponder the heart of Jesus Christ and what he underwent through his Passion, Death and Resurrection and that he is alive (his life has conquered death).

Along with personal prayer, we should try to participate in the different liturgies offered this week. Participating in them not only gives us opportunities to reflect on these many mysteries and


dynamics of Christ's victory over sin and death, but by praying with others in the liturgies the Holy Spirit can stir our hearts by these experiences. If you have conflicts in your schedules with some of these liturgies, wherever you are during that time, do the best you can to meditate on these mysteries.

**Adoration ends Thursday morning, resumes on Easter:** Adoration will end on Thursday morning, April 1, at 9 a.m. (we have carpet and upholstery being cleaned that morning) and resume on Easter Day at 8:45 a.m. On Good Friday and Holy Saturday, there is no adoration, so there is that experience of the absence of Christ's presence just as when he died on Good Friday and the emptiness until Easter morning.

**Congratulations:** Congratulations to our newly baptized member of the parish. Last Sunday we celebrated the baptism of Harper Avery Holden. Please keep her in your prayers as she begins this new life in Christ, and keep her parents and godparents in your prayers as well, that they will be the best instruments they can be to foster the gift of faith that God has given this wonderful child.

**New Administrative Assistant for the Parish:** After carrying out interviews with several applicants for the position of Administrative Assistant, I am happy to announce we hired Theresa Duquette. Theresa comes with past experience of working in this position at a previous parish for four years. She brings with her not only experience and needed skillsets, but a deep faith and love for Christ and his Church. I believe you will find her a joy to meet, talk, and work with.


opportunity to come to the office during the week.

**Good Friday a day of Fasting and Abstinence:** Don't forget that Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstinence. Those who are 14 and older are obliged to observe the laws of abstinence, to abstain from meat. All adults 18 and older, up to the beginning of their 60th year, are also bound by the laws of fasting on Good Friday. We are limited to a single full meal (meatless). Two other meals sufficient to maintain strength may be taken, according to one's needs, but these two meals together should not equal another full meal. It is always very uplifting knowing everyone is trying to carry out a united sacrifice throughout the Church.

**Consecration to St. Joseph begins this Tuesday:** The Diocese of Fall River encourages all Catholics to take part in the Consecration to St. Joseph during this Year of St. Joseph. It is suggested that you purchase "Consecration to St. Joseph: The Wonders of our Spiritual Father," by Fr. Donald Calloway, a 33-day spiritual preparation and reflection. If you begin the Preparation for the Consecration on March 30, you can complete the reflections and make the Consecration to St. Joseph on May 1, the feast day of St. Joseph the Worker. For those who wish to participate with others in the parish, we will offer in the church, each Monday during April (as well as livestream) at 7 p.m., the prayers that we would be doing that day in our preparation for the Consecration. On Saturday, May 1, at noon, we will make the Consecration together.

All youth in Grades 8-12 are invited to join us for our monthly Youth Nights on Fridays in the Church from 7-8:30 p.m.


Boys will meet on March 5, April 9, and May 7.

## PALM SUNDAY



**Palm Sunday** Masses are at the regular times and we will distribute and bless the palms at the Masses.

On **Tuesday, March 30**, the Bishop will celebrate the **Chrism Mass** with the priests of the diocese at the Cathedral at 2 p.m. Because of the pandemic, it will not be open to the public but will be livestreamed on the Diocesan Facebook site. Fr. Kevin will not be available for Confessions on Tuesday evening.

On **Wednesday, March 31**, we will have the **Tenebrae Service** at 7 p.m. This entails a reading of a series of Scripture and writing of Church Fathers on the death of the Lord. At the conclusion of each reading, lights are extinguished, so by the final reading there is only one candle lit, which is then removed, symbolizing the light of world entering the tomb. It is a very peaceful and prayerful experience.

On **Holy Thursday, Mass of the Lord's Last Supper** is at 7 p.m. Because of the pandemic we have been instructed not to have the washing of the feet and no Eucharistic procession. At the end of the Mass we will simply have exposition of the Eucharist in the ciborium and then repose in the tabernacle. We will leave the church open for silent prayer until 11 p.m. From 9-10 p.m. there will be some prayers led by Fr. Kevin.

On **Good Friday**, from noon to 1 p.m., there will be the reflection of the Seven Last Words of Christ. At 3 p.m. we will have the Good Friday Service. We were instructed not to have the individual veneration of the cross, so we will all kneel for a period of silent prayer while music is being sung to help us reflect on the Passion and Death of the Lord. After the Good Friday Service, Fr. Kevin will be available in the chapel confessional for the sacrament of Reconciliation until 6 p.m. At 7 p.m. we will have the praying of the Stations of the Cross in the church.

On **Holy Saturday**, April 3, at 9 a.m. we will have the praying of the Office of Readings and Morning Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours. If you are interested in joining us, please notify Fr. Kevin so he can print a copy for you. The **Easter Vigil** will be in the church at 8 p.m. (two teenage boys will receive first communion and Confirmation at the Vigil). On **Easter Sunday**, Masses are at 7:30 a.m., 9 a.m., and 10:45 a.m.



### **If you are sick and in the hospital**

If you are facing grave illness or going in for surgery at which they will be giving you anesthesia, please let Fr. Kevin know so he can come give you Confession, the Anointing of the Sick, and Communion (but only for a person who is dying, called Viaticum). Please know if you are admitted to the hospital for grave health, you should let them know that you are Catholic and would like the Anointing of the Sick or Confession (and please let your family know, if for some reason you are admitted to the hospital and unable to communicate, so your family can convey your wishes to the hospital). Currently at Rhode Island Hospital there is a priest chaplain, but some hospitals such as Sturdy do not have priest chaplains anymore, so ask them to contact Fr. Kevin, since you are a parishioner here.

### **Divine Mercy Sunday Holy Hour**

On Sunday, April 11, Divine Mercy Sunday, there will be a holy hour in the church at 2:30 p.m. (the hour of mercy). We will have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, a talk, praying of the Divine Mercy Chaplet, and opportunity for Confession and silent Adoration, and Benediction. It is always a beautiful experience, so please mark it in your calendar to come.




