## Jesus reveals God as Merciful Father

The Old Testament speaks frequently and with great tenderness about God's mercy. Yet, it was Jesus, who through His words and actions, revealed to us in an extraordinary way God as a loving Father, rich in mercy and abounding in great kindness and love. In Jesus' merciful love and care for the poor, the oppressed, the sick, and the sinful, and especially in His freely choosing to take upon Himself the punishment for our sins (a truly horrible suffering and death on the Cross), so that all may be freed from destructive consequences and death, He manifested in a superabundant and radical way the greatness of God's love and mercy for humanity. In His person as God-Man, one in being with the Father, Jesus both reveals and is God's Love and Mercy Itself.

## The message of God's Love and Mercy is especially made known by the Gospels.

The good news revealed through Jesus Christ is that God's love for each person knows no bounds, and no sin or infidelity, no matter how horrible, will separate us from God and His love when we turn to Him in confidence, and seek his mercy. God's will is our salvation. He has done all on our behalf, but since He made us free, He invites us to choose Him and partake of His divine life. We become partakers of His divine life when we believe in His revealed truth and trust Him, when we love Him and remain true to His word, when we honor Him and seek His Kingdom, when we receive Him in Communion and turn away from sin; when we are mutually caring and forgiving.


## The History of the Chaplet of The Divine Mercy

In 1935, St. Faustina received a vision of an angel sent by God to chastise a certain city. She began to pray for mercy, but her prayers were powerless. Suddenly she saw the Holy Trinity and felt the power of Jesus' grace within her. At

the same time she found herself pleading with God for mercy with words she heard interiorly: *Eternal Father, I offer You the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your dearly beloved Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world; for the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us.* (Diary, 475) As she continued saying this inspired prayer, the angel became helpless and could not carry out the deserved punishment (see 474). The next day, as she was entering the chapel, she again heard this interior voice, instructing her how to recite the prayer that our Lord later called "the Chaplet." This time, after "have mercy on us" were added the words "and on the whole world" (476). From then on, she recited this form of prayer almost constantly, offering it especially for the dying. In subsequent revelations, the Lord made it clear that the Chaplet was not just for her, but for the whole world.

Prayed on ordinary rosary beads, The Chaplet of The Divine Mercy is an intercessory prayer that extends the offering of the Eucharist, so it is especially appropriate to use it after having received Holy Communion at Holy Mass. It may be said at any time, but our Lord specifically told St. Faustina to recite it during the nine days before the Feast of Mercy (the first Sunday after Easter). He then added: *"By this Novena, [of Chaplets] I will grant every possible grace to souls."* (796) It is likewise appropriate to pray the Chaplet during the "Hour of Great Mercy" — three o'clock each afternoon (recalling the time of Christ's death on the cross). In His revelations to St. Faustina, Our Lord asked for a special remembrance of His Passion at that hour.

**Divine Mercy Sunday Holy Hour:** On this Sunday, April 11, Divine Mercy Sunday, there will be a holy hour in the church at 2:30 p.m. (falling within the hour of mercy of 3 p.m.). During that time we will have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, a talk, praying of the Divine Mercy Chaplet, an opportunity

for Confession and silent Adoration, and Benediction. It is always a beautiful experience so please mark it in your calendar to come. All are welcome to join us.



All youth in Grades 8-12 are invited to join us for our monthly Youth Nights on Fridays in the Church from 7-8:30 p.m.


Boys will meet on March 5, April 9, and May 7.

### General Rule Regarding COVID-19 Vaccination

In January I did an extensive write up (and TNT session) on the morality questions about receiving the vaccination for COVID-19. A basic guideline is this: different types of vaccinations are offered. The ones by Moderna and Pfizer are morally fine (the ones that require two shots). The other vaccinations, such as Jensen (aka Johnson and Johnson) and AstraZeneca, have more moral issues at stake because of the direct use of the fetal cell line from aborted babies several decades ago in the creation of the vaccine. Moderna and Pfizer did test their vaccination on the fetal cell line but did not use them in their production (so any cooperation in an evil by those receiving this vaccination is remote and material – meaning the cooperation in the evil of testing on the fetal cell line is solely by those scientists who tested on them). As for Johnson and Johnson (Jensen) and AstraZeneca there is more cooperation in the evil because of their use of the fetal cell line in the creation of it.

The Vatican and the Bishops in the United States have said one can take morally compromised vaccination **if there is no other opportunity to receive the other vaccination**. They said if one does receive the Johnson and Johnson vaccine (or in the future others produced in a similar fashion) then one should write to the pharmaceutical company to express disapproval with creating it using the fetal cell line from an aborted child. As a priest I cannot say it is a sin to receive this vaccination since the Holy Father and bishops are saying one can receive it if there is not another option (but for me personally, I cannot in good conscience receive the morally compromised vaccine since it appears to me the logic in saying it is all right is saying the ends justify the means ... the means being using a fetal cell line from children who were killed by abortion). But we should pray and give serious thought about how receiving the vaccination can help towards the common good.

Lastly, a person does not have a moral obligation to receive the vaccine. Would it help in lessening the spread of the virus? Though it is not a guarantee, it will help people who have received it from being affected by the virus (though apparently those vaccinated can still be carriers of the virus to others though they are not infected by it). Those who have compromised health conditions should consider receiving it and should be given the priority of place to receive it. But people do have to weigh their own health concerns as to whether they should take it or not. There are obviously the questions some people rightly have as to whether there could be an unintended long-term negative affect from the vaccination (since it is a new vaccination) so they have every right to choose not to receive it, especially if they have concerns about whether it could affect them or their child long-term (so they may choose not to have their child receive the vaccination). Finally, none of us has a right to know whether someone has been vaccinated. That is a choice between someone and their doctor (so if you find yourself asking others if they have received it, please stop asking and furthermore putting pressure on them if they have chosen not to receive it).
