



## “For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission”

This year Pope Francis called for another Synod of Bishops to be held for the Church. The next Synod of Bishops is entitled: "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission." Its long-term goal is to re-orient the local Church toward an inherent synodal attitude in decision-making processes through communion, participation, and mission. Literally speaking, the word “synod”, derived from two Greek words *syn* meaning “together” and *hodos* meaning “road” or “way”, means a “coming together.” The Synod of Bishops was instituted by Pope Saint Paul VI on September 15, 1965. In a synod, the point is discerning, not the will of the people, but the will of the Holy Spirit, for the Spirit in that context is sovereign, or in the language of Pope Francis, the “protagonist.” In particular, a synod is understood as a process divided into three phases: the preparatory phase, in which the consultation of the People of God on the topics indicated by the Roman Pontiff takes place; the celebratory phase, characterized by the assembly of the Bishops; and the implementation phase, in which the conclusions of the synod approved by the Roman Pontiff are implemented in the Church.

The Diocesan Synodal phase is the first step within the preparatory phase, inviting the local Church to gather, listen, and share so that we are able to better “journey together” as Church in living our baptismal mission. Our involvement in the Synodal process comes from the fact that each parish family is part of a diocesan family, which is in turn part of a universal, Catholic family. The Synod's long-term goal is to re-orient the local Church toward an inherent synodal attitude in decision making processes through communion, participation, and mission. In a general way, we should utilize this time as an opportunity to take stock of where we are as a Church after the past year and discern, through the guidance of the Holy

Spirit, the best path forward to proclaim the Gospel.

In September 2021, the Vatican's General Secretariat for the Synod of Bishops released directions on the Diocesan phase which entails: every parish have two “Parish Ambassadors” who will undergo a diocesan training in early November. After that, working with the pastor, the two parish ambassadors will help hold listening session, or sessions, with small groups or larger parish gathering, to hear from the faithful of areas of where we can work on areas of renewal (especially considering how parishes have been affected by the pandemic much work ahead is needed). This is not about looking at Church teaching, but what are areas we can more effectively proclaim the faith. After compiling the thoughts and insights by February, those will be sent to the Diocese. The Diocese will then create a 10-page synthesis from all the feedback and send it to the USCCB by April 1 which in turn will compile a synthesis from all the Dioceses in the United States and send them to the Vatican for its preparatory documents for next year's synod.

Parish Ambassadors are individuals, who serve at the Pastor's discretion, to aid in renewal efforts specific to that parish. They are meant to be a support system to parish clergy and personnel. They will serve as the Group Coordinators asked for in the Diocesan Synodal phase. In this way, they help take on the work the Synod asks of parishes, aiding to organize and implement the participatory process at the local level, and offering relief to parish clergy and personnel in this process.

As for our parish, I will be appointing our two Parish Ambassadors in the next few days. Also, I will be starting up again shortly a new Parish Council and new Finance Council. When I came three years ago in the midst of the parish dealing with serious issues and some division because of those issues, I realized I needed to focus on the spiritual life of the parish and give time for some tensions to settle (and part of that was holding off on the councils). That following summer, after we had a three-day mission on mercy (which I believed helped the parish tremendously), I started to give more thought to the Finance and Parish Councils. But I waited too long and that following winter the concerns about Covid began to arise and then everything in Parish life came to a screeching halt. It is time to get these councils up and running with new members, while trying to get others things going now (such as the Families of Nazareth gatherings, Young Disciples, new altar servers and lectors, ways to enrich the liturgies, etc.).

## No to Physician Assisted Suicide

Just a reminder from last week's insert, there are two bills being presented in the Massachusetts Legislature seeking to legalize Physician Assisted Suicide (which would be the direct killing of a person who is very sick). Physician Assisted Suicide is killing and can never be justified. Along with recognizing it is the evil of killing, but these two bills would allow a physician to provide a deadly drug mixture to an individual diagnosed with less than six months to live that, when consumed would cause death. Many times diagnoses can be wrong and many have long outlived a six months or less diagnosis. Second, there are no real safeguards in place so a vulnerable person who is depressed or feels like a burden may be subject to undue influence by others to take the drug mixture, especially if there is a financial benefit for the ones influencing them. Third, the primary focus of elected officials should be dedicated to legislation providing quality health care, mental health care, and palliative care to the sick and dying, in particular for the poor and underserved. When someone is gravely ill, our focus should be how to be there for them to love them and know they are worth loving rather than giving into the fear of suffering and seeking to hasten a person's death. Also, though there are many emotions involved, we have to be objective about our sadness or a person's pain cannot justify killing them (we should be fostering palliative care which seeks ways to ease their pain in moral ways and being attentive to their spiritual needs).

To take action, please call or email your legislators to let them know you are a Massachusetts voter and say NO to Physician Assisted Suicide. **January 1st - June 30th**
