

Dear Parishioners,

Continuing the Points on Conscience, the Mandates, and Vaccine
Finishing up with some points that people are weighing regarding whether to

take the vaccine, I continue to use some points from a series written by Fr. Tad Pacholczyk called "Making Sense of Bioethics" (found on www.fathertad.com). Today we look at the question of religious and conscience exemptions. Father Tad addresses this in his article from September, 2020 titled: "Is Mandating a COVID-19 Vaccine Ethical?" Fr. Tad points out: "How would a religious exemption differ from a conscience exemption? A religious exemption would apply if the teachings of the faith of the individual to be vaccinated held that vaccines in general were immoral and contrary to God's will, as might be the case for members of the Christian Science Church founded by Mary Baker Eddy. Since there is no Catholic teaching that the reception of vaccines, including those that rely on fetal cell lines from abortions that happened long ago, is sinful, Catholics cannot claim a religious exemption from the requirement of immunization.

A conscience exemption, meanwhile, would refer to the situation in which an individual in conscience believed that it was immoral to be vaccinated. Some individuals might claim a conscience exemption if they were convinced, even following extensive safety and efficacy testing, that the risks of being inoculated outweighed the potential benefits. It is Catholic teaching that one must follow one's informed judgment of conscience even if one is in error because the conscience is our last best judgment about what is right or wrong. Some Catholics might claim a conscience exemption out of a mistaken but sincerely held conviction that vaccinations themselves are always wrong, or that it is always immoral to receive vaccines made out of cell lines from abortions when that is the only option available. Some states and jurisdictions do not distinguish between religious and conscience exemptions. They only make available a religious exemption, by which they often intend to include and subsume under the same heading the exercise of conscientious objection. In sum, state-sponsored or legislative coercion through a universal vaccine mandate raises ethical concerns, especially when appropriate exemptions are unavailable. Health officials should instead seek to educate

those under their authority, through careful and patient explanation, about the importance of receiving a vaccine, so they might freely choose to do so on their own initiative."

All of us have many things for us to look at when it comes to the question of getting the vaccination for COVID-19 or not. As I mentioned previously, our Holy Father has pointed out receiving the vaccine can be a great act of charity and response to the concern for the common good (especially for the most vulnerable). We have to factor in the concerns of by not being vaccinated do we take the increased risk of possibly getting the virus (while knowing some vaccinated can still get it), and possibly put more of a drain on the ability of hospitals to care for not only those struggling with COVID but also care for those who are sick or injured in so many other ways. Knowing the majority that contracted the virus recovered and developed anti-bodies, there still is the unpredictability of the virus and that for so many others (whether with underlying conditions or good health) contracted the virus and became gravely ill (and some have had continual side effects even after treatments) and the continued innumerable amounts of deaths from it. We have to weigh in the factors of the effectivity of the vaccines and concerns of whether there is the risk of side effects from the vaccines. People have to weigh what they know about their own individual health and especially if they have underlying health conditions that make them more vulnerable, or do they have health conditions that they could have an allergic reaction to the ingredients in the vaccinations. We want to be as well informed as we can be, especially trying to get insights from the experts in these areas, yet knowing there is the struggle of trying to get clarity through a wide range of information, and knowing there can be pressure from those who push for, or oppose, the vaccination for their own political or financial gain.

We want to, and need to, strive to have a well-formed conscience through all of this so we can make a decision that is truly good. Ultimately, in all of this, we need to be led by the love of God in facing the pandemic with trust in the Lord's will, living in his peace, courageously moving forward, respecting situations where others are more vulnerable and not putting them in possible danger, and especially being mindful in how we are responding to one another in charity no matter what a person's stance on the vaccine and attitude to the pandemic may be.

Next week I want to get into what does the Church teach about the conscience because our understanding of having a well-

formed conscience and acting on it is so important. To understand the conscience more fully, one should read points 1776-1802 from the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Our Novena for the Immaculate Conception continues this week. Each evening of the novena has been saved on our parish Facebook site for those who missed them and would like to hear the talks. The remaining speakers for the novena will be: on Saturday, Dec. 4th myself (was supposed to be Fr. John Grieco for Saturday, but since Fr. Steve Booth could not come Friday Fr. Grieco switched to Friday and I am covering Fr. Booth's talk this Saturday evening); on Sunday, Dec. 5th will be Fr. Ryan Healy; Monday, Dec. 6th Deacon Matt Sweeney, and on Tuesday, Dec. 7th Fr. Chris Peschel. The last evening of the Novena will be at 7:00PM, celebrated in the context of the Mass as we celebrate the holy day (prior to the 7:00PM Mass on Wednesday we will recite the rosary at 6:30PM in the church). The format for every evening is there will Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, a talk by be a different priest or deacon on a particular theme for the novena, the praying of the Rosary, an opportunity for Confession, and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. The main purpose of the novena is to help us honor Our Lady and prepare spiritually for the great celebration of Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception on December 8th. The theme for this year's reflections will be on the Beatitudes. The novena can be a way to not only deepen our love for Mary, but also help us enter into the Advent Season and help direct our hearts in a peaceful way during the craziness and stresses of preparing for Christmas. *Please note that due to the novena, this week's Advent Book Club is cancelled. Please see our back page announcement for more information.

In addition, our Mass schedule for the Holy Day of Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception is as follows:

It is such a wonderful occasion for us to celebrate when Our Lady was conceived without original sin as God prepared her to be the worthy ark of the covenant of the incarnate word. It is a holy day of obligation for us as Catholics so we do have a moral obligation to attend and participate in the Mass. Also, December 8th is the last day of our novena so we will be praying the rosary at 6:30PM in the church before Mass begins at 7:00PM.
