

Catholic Funerals: Every baptized Catholic has a right to the prayers of the church at the time of life threatening illness and death even if they have not been practicing their faith up until that time. The parish provides a guide for funeral planning and is prepared to assist at the time of a death in the family. Ordinarily the funeral home will contact the parish to schedule a funeral though families are always welcome to contact the office. Customarily a Catholic funeral has three distinct moments: the vigil prayers, funeral and rite of committal at burial. Bear in mind that funerals in the churches are limited to 50 people at this time.

Sacrament of Baptism: The Catholic custom of baptizing infants is founded upon the testimony of Scripture and Tradition and demonstrates the priority of grace as a gift in the Christian life. Customarily baptism occurs as soon as possible after birth. Please contact the parish office with requests for dates prior to selecting godparents for whom there are some requirements that need documentation.

Sacrament of Marriage: Please contact the parish office at least six months prior to a desired wedding date and prior to committing to a reception facility. Parish wedding dates can only be confirmed after meeting with the priest and completing initial documentation establishing a person's freedom to marry as a Catholic. The parish offers marriage preparation which is required in anticipation of the wedding.

The gospel reading for Ash Wednesday pertains to almsgiving, prayer and fasting. Jesus asks for these virtuous acts while at the same time offering a caution: *take care not to perform righteous deeds in order that people may see them.* The goal of a well ordered spiritual life is the integration of *right intention* and *right action.* The *false righteousness* of the Scribes and Pharisees is unmasked by Jesus who insists that the virtue of religion is not just in the external observance of the law much less in the mere appearance of piety. At the same time Jesus insists on the outward demonstration of the love of God and neighbor. According to the wise counsels of St. Francis DeSales, *we tend to color devotion according to our own preferences and dispositions. One person sets great value on fasting, and believes oneself to be leading a very devout life, so long as he fasts rigorously, although his heart is full of bitterness; and while he will not moisten his lips with wine, perhaps not even with water, in his great abstinence, he does not hesitate to steep them in his neighbor's ill fortune through slander, gossip and detraction. Another person reckons herself as devout because she repeats many prayers daily, although at the same time she does not refrain from all manner of angry, irritating, conceited or insulting talk among her family and friends. One may freely open his finances in almsgiving, but closes his heart to all gentle and forgiving feelings towards those who are opposed to him; while that one is ready enough to forgive his enemies, but will never pay his rightful debts save under pressure. Meanwhile all these people are conventionally called religious, but nevertheless they are in no true sense really devout.* St. Francis goes on to note, in the spirit of the Beatitudes: *The ostrich never flies, the hen rises with difficulty, and achieves but a brief and rare flight, but the eagle, the dove, and the swallow, are continually on the wing, and soar high; even so sinners do not rise towards God, for all their movements are earthly and earthbound. Well-meaning people, who have not as yet attained a true devotion, attempt a manner of flight by means of their good actions, but rarely, slowly and heavily; while those who desire and have 'true devotion' rise up to God frequently, and with a swift and soaring wing. In short, devotion is simply a spiritual activity and liveliness by means of which Divine Love works in us, and causes us to work briskly and lovingly; and just as charity leads us to a general practice of all God's Commandments, so devotion leads us to practice them readily and diligently.* May we continue to pursue this pathway to holiness as *true devotion* in context of the season of grace—Lent—that provides us an opportune time for renewal in this worthy pursuit.

Good Friday, April 2 are days of fast and abstinence (from meat) in the universal Church.

Every Friday of Lent: All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (from meat) in the Church in the United States.

The Law of Abstinence: Binds Catholics aged 14 and older.

The Law of Fasting: Binds Catholics aged 18 and over, until the beginning of their 60th year (through age 59). When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Food, fuel, fiber fund

As briefly described in the handout a few Sundays ago, Parish Social Ministry has taken the torch from the Good Neighbor Fuel Fund in the Tri-Town area to offer fuel assistance to residents of Livermore and Livermore Falls. The GNFF provided fuel assistance for years to residents of Jay, Livermore and Livermore Falls. With the formal closure of the fund, residents of Jay are able to apply to the Farmington area ECU HEAT program, which is not able to serve residents of Livermore and Livermore Falls since they are not in Franklin County. Parish Social Ministry's new Food, Fuel, and Fiber fund seeks to fill the void left by the GNFF by focusing specifically on these two communities.

For more information, please see the parish website, or call Stephanie Crowe from the number on the front of the bulletin. We are accepting both donations and applications for the fuel fund, which also supplies other necessities such as food and clothing if needed. The fund provides 50 gallons of fuel for a \$50 contribution, which corresponds to the practices of the neighboring ECU HEAT fund. The fund will be administered on a first come first serve basis until funds are exhausted. Please keep this ministry in your prayers.

The Year of St. Joseph

During the liturgical year, St. Joseph has two major feast days. March 19 is the Solemnity of St. Joseph, the Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and May 1 is the feast of St. Joseph the Worker, who is the patron of our Farmington parish. In addition, the Church also has monthly and daily dedications. The month of March and Wednesdays are dedicated to St. Joseph.

During the month of March, at the end of each daily Mass in both parishes, the Litany of St. Joseph will be recited. On Sunday, May 2, we will consecrate the parish of St. Joseph to our beloved patron, as we consecrated St. Rose of Lima to the Immaculate Conception in 2019. We would also like to encourage parishioners in both parishes to consider consecrating themselves to St. Joseph. Fr. Don Calloway has authored *Consecration to St. Joseph*, a 33-day preparation guide to personal consecration, based upon the model of the popular Marian consecration by St. Louis de Monfort. There will be an opportunity to make personal consecrations at the Mass on May 2. We also plan to have an example of our traditional St. Joseph Table that weekend as well.

Those interested in making the personal consecration based on Fr. Don's method would need to purchase *Consecration to St. Joseph*. People interested in a May 2 consecration should begin the preparation on March 30. Limited quantities of the book are available at the parish office.
