

**Catholic Funerals:** Every baptized Catholic has a right to the prayers of the church at the time of life threatening illness and death even if they have not been practicing their faith up until that time. The parish provides a guide for funeral planning and is prepared to assist at the time of a death in the family. Ordinarily the funeral home will contact the parish to schedule a funeral though families are always welcome to contact the office. Customarily a Catholic funeral has three distinct moments: the vigil prayers, funeral and rite of committal at burial. Bear in mind that funerals in the churches are limited to 50 people at this time.

**Sacrament of Baptism:** The Catholic custom of baptizing infants is founded upon the testimony of Scripture and Tradition and demonstrates the priority of grace as a gift in the Christian life. Customarily baptism occurs as soon as possible after birth. Please contact the parish office with requests for dates prior to selecting godparents for whom there are some requirements that need documentation.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** Please contact the parish office at least six months prior to a desired wedding date and prior to committing to a reception facility. Parish wedding dates can only be confirmed after meeting with the priest and completing initial documentation establishing a person's freedom to marry as a Catholic. The parish offers marriage preparation which is required in anticipation of the wedding.

## Relic of the True Cross

Within the days of Lent, we *take up our cross daily* and follow Jesus as an intentional time that mirrors the entire Christian life. Occasionally you will find relics of the True Cross venerated at churches like the Cathedral of the Holy Cross in Boston or at retreat centers like Arnold Hall. St. Rose at some point in its history has come into possession of a relic of the True Cross. If anyone is aware of some details about when or how this relic came to be at St. Rose, your recollections would certainly be welcome. The relic which has the semblance of authenticity is not accompanied by any documentation. The relic reads XXX. Presently the relic is located on the main altar at St. Rose. Veneration of relics can be offered in a variety of ways; for example, by standing near the relic and offering a prayer or simply making the sign the cross. Another fitting gesture would be to touch the relic within its brass cross shaped reliquary. Yet another gesture of veneration would be to take up the relic and make a sign of the cross like a person would normally do with their hand. While some may find cause to be incredulous about relics in general or a relic like this one, we do well to appreciate the familiarity with which Catholics associate with holy artifacts of a long and venerable tradition.

## ST. ROSE RECTORY

In our effort to make increasingly good use of our ample (and underutilized) buildings, we have asked Bishop Deeley to accept lease agreements for guests at St. Rose rectory. One of the conditions for hospitality within the rectory is segregation from the office and privacy for the priest. This week we are beginning a construction project at St. Rose to complete the apartment (adjacent to the garage) in a way that will make it self-contained. Presently there are doors both to the office (on the ground floor) and rectory (on the second floor). These doors will become walls. We will add a small kitchen like might be in an apartment in what was previously an office. We will also add a small laundry area in the large bathroom upstairs. The present arrangement is for Fr. Paul to live in the apartment. While the current leases at St. Rose are short term we want to continue to assess and utilize parish property, including available living spaces, to support the mission of the parish.

## Recall the Catholic customs for fasting and abstinence

*Good Friday, April 2* are days of fast and abstinence (from meat) in the universal Church.

*Every Friday of Lent:* All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (from meat) in the Church in the United States.

*The Law of Abstinence:* Binds Catholics aged 14 and older.

*The Law of Fasting:* Binds Catholics aged 18 and over, until the beginning of their 60th year (through age 59). When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

### Local Nursing Homes

One of the under told stories of the pandemic effects is the sense of isolation and separation among residents and parishioners at local nursing homes. The parish relationship with area nursing homes has been disrupted in a significant way. Fr. Paul and the parish staff needs your help. Would you be willing to help restore communication with area nursing homes by making phone calls on behalf of the parish to nursing home administrators. We have several facilities in the area: Harris House, Sandy River, Woodlands, Pinewood Terrace, Oak Park, Pierce House and Edgewood. The purpose of the calls would be to identify who is the current contact responsible for coordinating pastoral and emergency visits. Likewise it would be good for us to know what the restrictions and protocols are for each facility. This work would be done from home and by phone. Each phone call may take up to a half hour. The information retrieved would be communicated to the parish staff in an email so we could follow up about the possibility of updating the census and making visits.

## St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Head of the Holy Family

Mary knew that she and her Son, Jesus, were secure in the custody of Good St. Joseph, strong, gentle, chaste, and protective, a sacrificial man. Eastern Rite Catholics refer to him as St. Joseph, the Chosen One. Just as Mary was chosen to be the Mother of the Redeemer, St.

Joseph was chosen to be the legal guardian of the Son of God, to be his father-figure on earth.

Although we do not know much about St. Joseph from the Gospels- he never utters a word- we can know him by looking at Jesus. St. Joseph raised Jesus. He showed him how to be a man, how to be a faithful Jew, and how to be a tradesman. We know what Joseph was like because we can see what Jesus was like. St. Joseph was chosen to be the guide and role model for Jesus as he grew in wisdom, age, and grace, and to be the head of the Holy Family.

The Litany of St. Joseph refers to our patron as Joseph, most chaste. In the battle for purity, everyone can have recourse to this holy saint. Cling to Joseph. Your spiritual father is capable of increasing the virtue of chastity in your heart and leading you to true, virtuous love of God and neighbor. St Joseph will fight for you if only you invoke his holy name. (Consecration to St. Joseph by Fr. Don Calloway)

# PARISH SOCIAL MINISTRY

*Matthew 25:37,40 Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, thirsty and give you drink?...And the King will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.'*

As we move through the second week of Lent, take a moment to read the words below from Pope Francis in his Lenten message for this year. Pope Francis has a deep heart for the poor, and identifies love as a "leap of the heart" which brings us out of ourselves and toward our brothers and sisters in Christ who need us. His reflection moves through the three theological virtues of faith, hope and love. He saves love for the end, and identifies it as the "highest expression of our faith and hope."

*"Love, following in the footsteps of Christ, in concern and compassion for all, is the highest expression of our faith and hope. Love rejoices in seeing others grow. Hence it suffers when others are anguished, lonely, sick, homeless, despised or in need. Love is a leap of the heart; it brings us out of ourselves and creates bonds of sharing and communion.*

*"Social love" makes it possible to advance towards a civilization of love, to which all of us can feel called. With its impulse to universality, love is capable of building a new world. No mere sentiment, it is the best means of discovering effective paths of development for everyone.*

*Love is a gift that gives meaning to our lives. It enables us to view those in need as members of our own family, as friends, brothers or sisters. A small amount, if given with love, never ends, but becomes a source of life and happiness. Such was the case with the jar of meal and jug of oil of the widow of Zarephath, who offered a cake of bread to the prophet Elijah (cf. 1 Kings 17:7-16); it was also the case with the loaves blessed, broken and given by Jesus to the disciples to distribute to the crowd (cf. Mk 6:30-44). Such is the case too with our almsgiving, whether small or large, when offered with joy and simplicity.*

*To experience Lent with love means caring for those who suffer or feel abandoned and fearful because of the Covid-19 pandemic. In these days of deep uncertainty about the future, let us keep in mind the Lord's word to his Servant, "Fear not, for I have redeemed you" (Is 43:1). In our charity, may we speak words of reassurance and help others to realize that God loves them as sons and daughters."*
