

Catholic Funerals: Every baptized Catholic has a right to the prayers of the church at the time of life threatening illness and death even if they have not been practicing their faith up until that time. The parish provides a guide for funeral planning and is prepared to assist at the time of a death in the family. Ordinarily the funeral home will contact the parish to schedule a funeral though families are always welcome to contact the office. Customarily a Catholic funeral has three distinct moments: the vigil prayers, funeral and rite of committal at burial. Bear in mind that funerals in the churches are limited to 50 people at this time.

Sacrament of Baptism: The Catholic custom of baptizing infants is founded upon the testimony of Scripture and Tradition and demonstrates the priority of grace as a gift in the Christian life. Customarily baptism occurs as soon as possible after birth. Please contact the parish office with requests for dates prior to selecting godparents for whom there are some requirements that need documentation.

Sacrament of Marriage: Please contact the parish office at least six months prior to a desired wedding date and prior to committing to a reception facility. Parish wedding dates can only be confirmed after meeting with the priest and completing initial documentation establishing a person's freedom to marry as a Catholic. The parish offers marriage preparation which is required in anticipation of the wedding.

Traditionally the final two weeks of Lent in the Roman Rite are used as an immediate preparation for the sorrowful events of the Easter drama. It is a period of time to focus more and more on the Passion and death of Jesus and so accompany him on his way to Calvary. The custom of veiling the images during the last two weeks of Lent originates from the traditional Roman liturgical calendar in which the Passion was read on the Fifth Sunday of Lent. For this reason the period following the Fifth Sunday of Lent is called Passiontide. A remnant of this custom is the obligatory use of the first Preface of the Lord's Passion during the Fifth Week of Lent as we did last Sunday. Palm Sunday was seen as the "Second Sunday in Passiontide," and is currently listed in the liturgical calendar as "Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion." It is on this day that the Passion narrative is read. The Church beckons us on Palm Sunday to look toward the cross and see Christ's immense love for us, sacrificing himself for our sins. It is a preview of what is to come on Good Friday. During this time the Church's liturgy became more somber and a sorrowful mood was reflected in the various practices that occurred in the liturgy. The custom of veiling crosses and images has much to commend it in terms of religious psychology, because it helps us to concentrate on the great essentials of Christ's work of Redemption. The presentiment of that awful hour leads the afflicted mother to veil the image of her Jesus: the cross is hidden from the eyes of the faithful. The statues of the saints, too, are covered; for it is but just that, if the glory of the Master be eclipsed, the servant should not appear. The interpreters of the liturgy tell us that this ceremony of veiling the crucifix during Passiontide, expresses the humiliation to which our Savior subjected Himself, of hiding Himself when the Jews threatened to stone Him, as is related in the Gospel account.

Good Friday, April 2 are days of fast and abstinence (from meat) in the universal Church.

The Law of Abstinence: Binds Catholics aged 14 and older.

The Law of Fasting: Binds Catholics aged 18 and over, until the beginning of their 60th year (through age 59). When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Matthew 25:37,40 Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, thirsty and give you drink?...And the King will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.'

St. Laurent update: Mercifully, the pandemic has not been as devastating in Haiti as many feared; against all odds, the death toll has been relatively low (although testing/reporting are not always available). Sadly, however, Haiti has been experiencing a different “plague” since mid-2018: political unrest, economic instability, and increasing violence. Travel to Haiti is still unsafe for political reasons.

Nonetheless, our sister parish in St. Laurent and its neighbor St. Anthony of Padua have made progress. Through your support, the new parish school in St. Laurent is open and has 80 students in grades one through six. A new chapel was dedicated in one of the parish’s mission communities, and a seminarian who was serving in the parish was recently ordained to the priesthood. Father Lima received a donation of beans and rice from Caritas, which allowed him to provide lunch for children at the primary school three times each week. And, through a collaboration with the Parish Twinning Program, we will be providing food for Father Lima to distribute to those who need it most. Our \$1,500 donation was matched dollar for dollar by Food for The Poor, so our friends will receive \$3,000 worth of food!

Sea container shipment: Many of you have helped in the past when we collected items to send to St. Laurent via container shipment. Last year, the Parish Twinning Program suspended the shipment because of the pandemic and the unrest. This year, however, they are going ahead with it, and we are going to participate. Tags with specific requests are available in both churches and parish halls. **Please note:** for medications, the expiration date must be **later than** June 30, 2022. We are also identifying specific, more durable, brands of school supplies. Rosaries, medals, and other small religious articles are always welcome.

Please bring items to Mass no later than Easter Sunday; this will allow time for shipment to Nashville, where they will be processed for the sea journey to Haiti.

When we see what our friends in Haiti are able to accomplish with the help of two small – albeit very generous – parishes in rural Maine, we can give thanks. Even during this extraordinarily difficult time, you continue to support our neighbors to the south, while also generously providing for our neighbors down the street and across town. And in every single message received from Father Lima and Father Ducè, they express their gratitude and the gratitude of their parishioners. Mèsi anpil, tout moun, e ke Bondye beni nou tout. 

A reminder: On Sunday, May 2, at the 10:30 AM Mass, we will consecrate the parish of St. Joseph to our beloved patron, as we consecrated St. Rose of Lima to the Immaculate Conception in 2019. **We would also like to encourage parishioners in both parishes to consider consecrating themselves to Good St. Joseph.** Fr. Don Calloway has written *Consecration to St. Joseph*, a 77-day preparation guide to personal consecration, based upon the model of the popular Marian consecration by St. Louis de Monfort. There will be an opportunity to make personal consecrations at the 10:30 Mass on May 2. We also plan to

have an example of our traditional St. Joseph Table that weekend as well.

Those interested in making the personal consecration based on Fr. Don's method would need to purchase *Consecration to St. Joseph*. **People interested in a May 2 consecration should begin the preparation on March 30.** There are still a few copies of the book available at the parish office.
