Catholic Funerals: Every baptized Catholic has a right to the prayers of the church at the time of life threatening illness and death even if they have not been practicing their faith up until that time. The parish provides a guide for funeral planning and is prepared to assist at the time of a death in the family. Ordinarily the funeral home will contact the parish to schedule a funeral though families are always welcome to contact the office. Customarily a Catholic funeral has three distinct moments: the vigil prayers, funeral and rite of committal at burial. Bear in mind that funerals in the churches are limited to 50 people at this time.

Sacrament of Baptism: The Catholic custom of baptizing infants is founded upon the testimony of Scripture and Tradition and demonstrates the priority of grace as a gift in the Christian life. Customarily baptism occurs as soon as possible after birth. Please contact the parish office with requests for dates prior to selecting godparents for whom there are some requirements that need documentation.

Sacrament of Marriage: Please contact the parish office at least six months prior to a desired wedding date and prior to committing to a reception facility. Parish wedding dates can only be confirmed after meeting with the priest and completing initial documentation establishing a person's freedom to marry as a Catholic. The parish offers marriage preparation which is required in anticipation of the wedding.

Christ is Risen! Alleluia! Christ is Risen Indeed! Alleluia! At the procession for Mass on Palm (Passion) Sunday we are reminded that *since the beginning of Lent until now we have prepared our hearts by penance and charitable works.* And now we find ourselves enveloped with the grace of Easter commemorating the Paschal Mystery—the suffering, death and bodily resurrection of Jesus Christ born of the Blessed Virgin Mary *in the fullness of time.* The liturgical feasts make present the graces signified by the mysteries celebrated. For this lived reality of the grace won for us by Christ's Passion and Resurrection, we are most grateful. The *paschal mystery* remains the pattern of the life of the Church and our lives too. We have in so many ways suffered *deaths* in the past months. For those who have, alone and together, persevered in prayer we cling to the grace and promise of new life in Christ. May we who have followed Him also rise with Him and look to the promised descent of the Holy Spirit in the days of Easter.

Beauty is an important dimension to the faith because beauty conveys attraction. The faith expressed well is attractive. A special thank you to Philip Fournier and the quiet though generous work of providing beautiful music. The skill and devotion that yields the array of music from the Roman Catholic tradition we witnessed throughout the Triduum is not to be underestimated. We are grateful. The combination of Gregorian chant, hymns, organ and polyphony greatly enhances the *sense of the sacred* that serves the mysteries of the faith and the grace of liturgical and personal prayer.




ST. ROSE COMMUNITY GARDEN

Divine Mercy Sunday



The Sunday after Easter, April 11, is Divine Mercy Sunday. Eucharistic Adoration will continue as usual at St. Joseph's Church from after the 10:30 Mass until Benediction at 4:45. In honor of this feast day, there will be extra time for confessions and the Divine Mercy Chaplet will be recited at 3:00.

In St. Faustina's Diary, entry 699, Jesus tells us, "The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy."



PARISH SOCIAL MINISTRY

Matthew 25:37,40 Then the righteous will answer him and say, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, thirsty and give you drink?...And the King will say to them in reply, 'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me.'

Throughout the Easter season, many of our readings are taken from the Acts of the Apostles, which gives an account of the first days of Christianity. The infant Christian faith spread like wildfire, gaining 3000 members on its first day of public witness after Christ's Ascension, and grew rapidly from there. The aspect of Christian life we are calling "Parish Social Ministry" was an immediate instinct of the first Christians who shocked the world with their love which was exhibited not only in common worship, but in unprecedented acts of communal charity. Their love did not consist merely in "individual good works", they were highly organized and made it a top priority to ensure that the widow, orphan, sick and outcast were cared for.

Revisiting an article posted here a few months ago from Plough Quarterly, the author reminds contemporary Christians that we may have relegated too much of our communal charity out of our churches and into the state.

*"And he [Jesus] redefined the bonds of kinship: "Who is my mother, and who are my brothers?... Whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother, and sister, and mother." The biological family, evidently, matters greatly; but in the order of our loves, it should come a distinct second. The care we owe our relatives remains, but now we're called to extend it to a vast new throng of siblings – a family of many ethnicities and cultures that includes the widowed, the unmarried, the outsider, and the stranger. **As the early Christians showed, this mutual care must go beyond mere spiritual fraternity to include a degree of economic sharing that makes today's socialism seem weak beer.** Family values of the Christian sort ought to make onlookers exclaim (in Tertullian's words): "See how they love one another."*

Can we give economic and practical aid to people and families in need, while ministering to both body and soul? Can we give them something state agencies are unable to give? Would state assistance agencies even be necessary if every Christian church looked like that of the first Christians? How might God be calling you and your family this Easter season to participate in this essential aspect of our faith, so integral to the first expressions of Christianity?


