

Catholic Funerals: Every baptized Catholic has a right to the prayers of the church at the time of life threatening illness and death even if they have not been practicing their faith up until that time. The parish provides a guide for funeral planning and is prepared to assist at the time of a death in the family. Ordinarily the funeral home will contact the parish to schedule a funeral though families are always welcome to contact the office. Customarily a Catholic funeral has three distinct moments: the vigil prayers, funeral and rite of committal at burial. Bear in mind that funerals in the churches are limited to 50 people at this time.

Sacrament of Baptism: The Catholic custom of baptizing infants is founded upon the testimony of Scripture and Tradition and demonstrates the priority of grace as a gift in the Christian life. Customarily baptism occurs as soon as possible after birth. Please contact the parish office with requests for dates prior to selecting godparents for whom there are some requirements that need documentation.

Sacrament of Marriage: Please contact the parish office at least six months prior to a desired wedding date and prior to committing to a reception facility. Parish wedding dates can only be confirmed after meeting with the priest and completing initial documentation establishing a person's freedom to marry as a Catholic. The parish offers marriage preparation which is required in anticipation of the wedding.

Pope Emeritus Benedict was fond of referring to the Holy Spirit as *the forgotten Person of the Most Holy Trinity*. I suspect because of the visible nature of the Incarnation and the human analogy to God as *Father*, we are more challenged by ways of recalling the presence of the Holy Spirit in our daily lives. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* offers a few insights about the symbols of the Holy Spirit in the scriptures and traditions of prayer and art. *Water*: Just as in gestation of our first birth took place in water, so the water of Baptism truly signifies that our birth into the divine life is given to us in the Holy Spirit. *Anointing*: The action of anointing with oil signifies the Holy Spirit. The full force can only be fully grasped in relation to the primary anointing accomplished by the Holy Spirit of Jesus Christ, which literally means *messiah*—anointed by God's Holy Spirit. *Fire*: While water signifies birth and the fruitfulness of life given in the Holy Spirit, fire signifies the transforming energy of the Holy Spirit's action. *Cloud and light*: These two images often occur together and communicate the both what is obscure and what is luminous about God the Holy Spirit—cloud and light according to their natural characteristics signify both the revelation of the living God while also veiling the transcendence of God.

SAVE THE DATE - PENTECOST VIGIL - MAY 22 & 23

HOLY CROSS CEMETERY

Please be reminded of the rules and regulations that were established a few years ago in an ongoing effort to improve maintenance practices and insure the continued quality and general appearance of Holy Cross Cemetery.

11-G Urns and Flower Vases - Placement of approved urns, vases, baskets, boxes and potted plants is restricted to the following locations: one item on either end of the main above-ground monument only. In the event that there is no above ground monument on the lot, one of the items described above may be placed where the above ground monument would be located so as not to obstruct mowing operations.

11-H Ornaments - The use of shells, crushed or bleached stones, lawn ornaments, glass containers vigil or perpetual lights, shepherds crooks and tin cans is strictly prohibited. No lawn ornament of any kind as defined shall be allowed. The staff reserves the right to remove without notice any planting or object that is in violation of these regulations, is a hazard to its employees or detrimental to the general appearance of the cemetery.

12-B Rubbish - Throwing of rubbish on roads, driveways, paths, walks, or any part of the ground of any cemetery, or its buildings, is prohibited. All rubbish (including organic) must be removed from the cemetery by those persons generating the rubbish.

Please note that there is no water at the cemetery. Needed changes were made regarding the electricity, which means we are not able to run the pump that provides the water.

In our continuing effort to keep our staff and visitors safe, please remember the new rules and regulations that were adopted. All items that are deemed unsafe, such as solar lights and shepherds crooks will be tagged and placed by the shed for owners to pick up.

For a copy of the rules & regulations, please contact the parish office or copies are available at the work shed at the cemetery.

Thank you for your cooperation in helping the staff maintain the beauty and dignity of our cemetery.

Franklin Memorial Hospital

The current Covid protocol at Franklin Memorial Hospital (FMH) is to treat visits from a priest like the one visitor permitted to see a person at the hospital. Patients admitted to the FMH are permitted to have one guest, and only one person, visit them each day from 3:00-7:00 PM. Currently the hospital policy treats a pastoral visit from the parish priest like the one permitted visit. Families may need to account for this policy when requesting the Sacrament of the Sick. As family members or friends are admitted to the FMH it would be helpful to know that a person has been admitted. With the permission of the patient please contact the parish office with a name and room number. A phone call may be one way to reach out. A similar initiative from families may be helpful with respect to rehab or long term stays at local nursing homes.


May Crowning at St. Joseph
