

Catholic Funerals: Every baptized Catholic has a right to the prayers of the church at the time of life threatening illness and death even if they have not been practicing their faith up until that time. The parish provides a guide for funeral planning and is prepared to assist at the time of a death in the family. Ordinarily the funeral home will contact the parish to schedule a funeral though families are always welcome to contact the office. Customarily a Catholic funeral has three distinct moments: the vigil prayers, funeral and rite of committal at burial.

Sacrament of Baptism: The Catholic custom of baptizing infants is founded upon the testimony of Scripture and Tradition and demonstrates the priority of grace as a gift in the Christian life. Customarily baptism occurs as soon as possible after birth. Please contact the parish office with requests for dates prior to selecting godparents for whom there are some requirements that need documentation.

Sacrament of Marriage: Please contact the parish office at least six months prior to a desired wedding date and prior to committing to a reception facility. Parish wedding dates can only be confirmed after meeting with the priest and completing initial documentation establishing a person's freedom to marry as a Catholic. The parish offers marriage preparation which is required in anticipation of the wedding.

A few years ago the parishes undertook a process, assisted by the Catholic Leadership Institute, resulting in the parish pastoral plan. The three-part focus has been a helpful way, it appears, to direct out efforts in productive manner. Inevitably this pastoral planning will have to be renewed as what was envisioned was a three year period which is now complete. Obviously this past year was not so conducive to convening parish groups to planning purposes though we look forward to the opportunity moving forward. I once heard of a simplified pastoral plan, so called, attributed to St. John Vianney. Saints have a way of simplifying things. By *pastoral plan* the Cure Ars, as he is known, was to feed the hungry children at the orphanage named *La Providence* and then to beautify the churches. It strikes me that we, amid our own more detailed plan, have gravitated in the direction of *feeding the hungry* and contributing to the beauty as well as the functionality of the churches. After some conversation with the Liturgy and Devotions Commission, consultation with the Parish Council and the recommendation from the Finance Council to delay the project, we have decided to move ahead with the painting of the sanctuary ceiling at St. Rose. We have received a generous gift that allows this project to be scheduled for June. The approach will be to accentuate the *marian blue* associated with the statue of Our Lady of Grace as well as the blue of the stained glass windows and also the blue façade pipes of the new organ. The ceiling will be blue with gold stars. This way of representing the sanctuary ceiling can be seen in many churches and expresses the analogy among the beauty of creation as God's original temple, the ancient temple of Jerusalem itself and the beauty of that place where the holy sacrifice of the Mass is offered. Thank you for your patience with the process and thanks to Seth Goepel for accepting the challenge. Seth has worked professionally in other churches in Maine including the Basilica of Sts. Peter and Paul as well as the Cathedral in Portland.

Diocese of Portland Updates Protocols for Maine Churches

The Diocese of Portland has announced major updates to the pandemic protocols currently in place at all 141 Catholic churches in Maine.

The following actions took effect on **Monday, May 24**:

- Masks are no longer required for any person at any time, inside or outside the churches.
- Capacity limits, advance registration, and the gathering of contact tracing information for those attending Masses are eliminated.
- Pew seating arrangements to establish six or more feet of distance between each person/family are eliminated. Those attending Masses are welcome to sit where they are comfortable. All pews will be available for seating.
- The distribution of Holy Communion to the homebound is restored
- Indoor choir practices can be held without distancing.

The extensive livestreaming schedule at Maine parishes will also remain in place. Moving forward, adjustments to the schedule will be made in the "Parishes and Mass Times" section of www.portlanddiocese.org. We are grateful to Randy and Steve for their generous help and are evaluating our limited use of livestreaming going forward. The obligation to attend Mass will continue to be dispensed for the foreseeable future.

PARISH SOCIAL MINISTRY

Human Equality, Part 5

Last week we read the *Compendium* about the paradoxical yet complimentary difference between Man and Woman, which are two equal, concrete expressions of the Image of God, existing in mutual harmony, but not "static sameness." It takes wisdom to avoid confusing equality with sameness. Sameness is a very limited, mathematical manner of describing equality, and human nature is governed by more than mathematics, since we are not merely bodily extensions of material, but spiritual beings with a soul made for God.

Sometimes it can help to hear a layman's explanation of Church principles, so I quote here from Dr. William Newton's book *A Civilization of Love*.

Since every human being is created in the image of God, this doctrine gives a solid foundation to the essential equality that exists between all human beings, and by extension between all nations. In particular, it affirms the essential equality between men and women. Founded in the doctrine of the image of God, the equality of all persons is powerfully reaffirmed by the realization that God became man and died for all men and nations, without exception (1 Tim 2:4). It is, however, important to remember that equality does not mean 'sameness.' authentic equality is not opposed to diversity, just as in God there is unity in diversity of Persons.

This is an especially important point to remember when we consider the equality that exists between the sexes. This difference has often been the cause of tension between the sexes, but revelation indicates that it is a difference of complementarity (Gen 2:18). Men and women bring to each other, and therefore to society, different gifts that fit together and enhance each other. Ultimately, their differences are an opportunity, not for strife, but for collaboration and communion.


