

Catholic Funerals: Every baptized Catholic has a right to the prayers of the church at the time of life threatening illness and death even if they have not been practicing their faith up until that time. The parish provides a guide for funeral planning and is prepared to assist at the time of a death in the family. Ordinarily the funeral home will contact the parish to schedule a funeral though families are always welcome to contact the office. Customarily a Catholic funeral has three distinct moments: the vigil prayers, funeral and rite of committal at burial.

Sacrament of Baptism: The Catholic custom of baptizing infants is founded upon the testimony of Scripture and Tradition and demonstrates the priority of grace as a gift in the Christian life. Customarily baptism occurs as soon as possible after birth. Please contact the parish office with requests for dates prior to selecting godparents for whom there are some requirements that need documentation.

Sacrament of Marriage: Please contact the parish office at least six months prior to a desired wedding date and prior to committing to a reception facility. Parish wedding dates can only be confirmed after meeting with the priest and completing initial documentation establishing a person's freedom to marry as a Catholic. The parish offers marriage preparation which is required in anticipation of the wedding.

SANCTUARY CEILING

I would like to thank St. Rose of Lima parish and Fr. Dumais for the opportunity to add to the beauty of this church building - painting the sanctuary ceiling was an experience in combining prayer, labor, and art into a single work; I am grateful for the time I spent there. A quick word about the actual design itself: we selected the same blue for the sky color as the new organ pipes. This will tie the front and back of the church together in harmony: the music of the Mass with the sacrifice at the altar. As for the arrangement of stars, there are a few sources of inspiration. One is the double imagery of rising and congregating - such as the smoke from incense symbolizes the prayers of the faithful mounting up to heaven - or descending and dispersing - as the rain reminds us of the blessings of God, or the manna descending on the Israelites prefigures the Eucharist. A second inspiration for the placement of stars comes from the apparition of Mary to the town of Pontmain, France in 1871. There the Virgin appeared as a woman in the sky, clothed in blue, with stars on her dress. She was visible only to children, but as the villagers gathered at their request and prayed, the children saw the stars multiply and fill her robes until they were almost solid gold. And the final inspiration of course is the wild variety of the night sky itself - throughout the large and small stars on the ceiling at St. Rose there are large dots plotting out various constellations, a homage to the profound and untouchable beauty of the cosmos, as well as man's imagination and inspiration in responding to that beauty. Once again I would like to express my gratitude, and leave you with the words of Dostoevsky, quoted by Pope Saint John Paul II in his challenging "Letter to Artists" - "beauty will save the world." -Seth Goepel

The Year of St. Joseph

We have reflected on a number of Good St. Joseph's titles and virtues this year, but one important aspect that we do not consider enough is the hidden, quiet life of St. Joseph. The Bible records no words that Joseph spoke. Yet God entrusted Joseph, from all the men who have ever lived, with the Incarnate Son of God, to raise, love, and mold into the man He became. The Eastern Catholic Churches refer to God the Father as "The Hidden One." Joseph, in his hidden life, reflected the "hiddenness" of God the Father.

This is an important reminder to us, who live quiet, hidden lives. Perhaps we feel we have no importance. But Good St. Joseph played an incomparable role in salvation history. It is not always those in the spotlight or who have the loudest voice who have the greatest

A few years ago I took in the awe-inspiring sight of the sun dancing like a billion diamonds off of Lake Tahoe with the backdrop of the majestic Sierra Nevada mountains! And now I see the daily beauty here in Maine, lakes, rivers, hills, and mountains! Such beauty reminds us of the Divine Artist's handiwork! **"Creation is the footprint of God"** proclaims St. Bonaventure.

It is easy to forget to connect the living realities present at our Mass with our daily walk of life. During Mass there is always a Psalm response—the psalmist is often calling all of heaven and earth to Praise the Lord. Today's readings highlight God's interaction with Creation—especially the Gospel where Jesus calms the storm (and also calms the fears of his apostles). Each Sunday we profess in the Nicene Creed that God is the "Maker of heaven and earth."

As we move towards the summer and its restorative periods of rest by the shore or in the mountains, or by a pool, recall such truths as:

- God is the origin of all things;
- In creation we see God's "footprints" so we can discover his magnificence and his creative love;
- Life springs forth, the world exists, because all things obey the divine Word—God is still active and always creative;
- We, you and I, are the summit of all creation;
- We—the human person—are the only being in God's entire creation who are consciously "able to know and love his creator."

Take time to worship God who holds you in the "palm of his hand." Worship God at Mass—through Word and Sacrament—recognizing God's holy presence. And remember to praise God as you reflect on the beauty of his Creation. All that we have is pure gift from a loving God! **God loves you!**




