

Catholic Funerals: Every baptized Catholic has a right to the prayers of the church at the time of life threatening illness and death even if they have not been practicing their faith up until that time. The parish provides a guide for funeral planning and is prepared to assist at the time of a death in the family. Ordinarily the funeral home will contact the parish to schedule a funeral though families are always welcome to contact the office. Customarily a Catholic funeral has three distinct moments: the vigil prayers, funeral and rite of committal at burial.

Sacrament of Baptism: The Catholic custom of baptizing infants is founded upon the testimony of Scripture and Tradition and demonstrates the priority of grace as a gift in the Christian life. Customarily baptism occurs as soon as possible after birth. Please contact the parish office with requests for dates prior to selecting godparents for whom there are some requirements that need documentation.

Sacrament of Marriage: Please contact the parish office at least six months prior to a desired wedding date and prior to committing to a reception facility. Parish wedding dates can only be confirmed after meeting with the priest and completing initial documentation establishing a person's freedom to marry as a Catholic. The parish offers marriage preparation which is required in anticipation of the wedding.

Most people, rightly refer to hiking Tumbledown, while those who ascending the Loop or Brook trail used the language of *pilgrimage*. The group convened at the trailhead and paused for silent prayer to articulate an intention for the walk. Those gathered prayed a decade of the rosary and headed out. All those walking up the trails for Mass had an opportunity to carry the marble altar stone to be used at *Mass on the Mountain*. After a refreshing swim in the high elevation pond Mass was offered in the company of about fifty generous people who made the pilgrimage. The notion of a pilgrimage is an important one for Catholics who understand ourselves to be *pilgrims* in this lifetime making our way to our true homeland—heaven. To undertake a pilgrimage is in truth a prayer—a walking prayer that facilitates vocal and meditative prayer. The repetition of steps is likened to the repetition of vocal prayers; for instance, *Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me a sinner*. In the spirit of pilgrimage, the summer missionaries (St. Isidore Corps) have also organized a walking pilgrimage to visit the churches of Lewiston and Auburn culminating at the Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul. It was fitting to observe the feast day in this way as the lives of St. Peter, who traveled to Rome to announce the gospel, and St. Paul, who made extensive apostolic journeys, exemplify the sacrifice and spirit of pilgrimage.

The parishes of St. Rose and St. Joseph welcome the Sisters of Life this weekend.

The St. Joseph's/St. Rose of Lima Parish Social Ministry Commission met on June 28 with nine in attendance. Among the items on the agenda was the "post-Covid response to 'feeding the hungry.'" After much thought and discussion, we are pausing the take-out meal effort for the months of July and August in order to assess the practical aspects as well as the pastoral/spiritual components of our activities. To grow our parish response – that is, good works done by the parish as a whole, not simply by a group of individuals – we are seeking deeper volunteer engagement, which doesn't necessarily mean more work, but does translate to a deeper engagement in the spiritual aspects of the work. Food will still be available at both parishes for folks in need as we explore the ways in which we can continue to provide meals for the public in September.



