

**Catholic Funerals:** Every baptized Catholic has a right to the prayers of the church at the time of life threatening illness and death even if they have not been practicing their faith up until that time. The parish provides a guide for funeral planning and is prepared to assist at the time of a death in the family. Ordinarily the funeral home will contact the parish to schedule a funeral though families are always welcome to contact the office. Customarily a Catholic funeral has three distinct moments: the vigil prayers, funeral and rite of committal at burial.

**Sacrament of Baptism:** The Catholic custom of baptizing infants is founded upon the testimony of Scripture and Tradition and demonstrates the priority of grace as a gift in the Christian life. Customarily baptism occurs as soon as possible after birth. Please contact the parish office with requests for dates prior to selecting godparents for whom there are some requirements that need documentation.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** Please contact the parish office at least six months prior to a desired wedding date and prior to committing to a reception facility. Parish wedding dates can only be confirmed after meeting with the priest and completing initial documentation establishing a person's freedom to marry as a Catholic. The parish offers marriage preparation which is required in anticipation of the wedding.

## Sisters of Life Visit

We are so very grateful for the opportunity to host the Sisters of Life for a time of parish mission. The heart of the time was spent as a day of recollection for women on Saturday which was well attended.

More importantly the spirit of cooperation among the staff and volunteers was effective and hospitable. A special thank you to Louise and Stephanie, who coordinated the lunch volunteers. Also, thanks to Penny for working with others to provide lunch. Pam worked with others to provide a sample of tasty fudge while Annie, a summer missionary, provided a taste of a new coffee product line from the Catholic Company. It was good to be together. The image in my mind was that of *Mary traveling in haste to visit Elizabeth*. There is a sense in which the Sisters came here motivated by the same love that moved Mary. And there is a sense in which all the women present were likened to Elizabeth being visited. The joy was palpable. One of the takeaways from the day is the way in which the sisters speak about the love and mercy of God to a broken world. One of the reasons they are able to do so is that their active work is built on the foundation of prayer—both liturgical and personal. We can learn from this dynamic of action and contemplation as we continue to pursue parish priorities and goals. We have seen the beautiful witness of these consecrated women and are encouraged to *announce the gospel of the Lord*.

## Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Thanks to prioritizing the development of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) for the benefit of families with young children, we were well positioned to host two training sessions this summer. Thanks to Lisa for pulling the details together to be able to host the level one training for local volunteers and others who have traveled to complete their training begun last year in Brunswick. I encourage parishioners and families to learn more about the wisdom and method of CGS atrium (unique classroom) at the St. Rose faith formation center. We have enjoyed the level one opportunity that serves three to six-year-olds. In order to continue to provide an integral opportunity for families and children as they develop, we are hosting a level two training. We are very fortunate to be able to host this training locally as we seek to grow our capacity to serve children six to nine-years-old. CGS creates an environment of freedom that encourages a vital encounter between Jesus, the Good Shepherd, and children who listen to the gospel parables with their minds and hearts using physical materials that support imagination and nurture prayer.

### PARISH SOCIAL MINISTRY COMMISSION

The St. Joseph's/St. Rose of Lima Parish Social Ministry Commission met on June 28 with nine in attendance. Among the items on the agenda was the "post-Covid response to 'feeding the hungry.'" After much thought and discussion, we are pausing the take-out meal effort for the months of July and August in order to assess the practical aspects as well as the pastoral/spiritual components of our activities. To grow our parish response – that is, good works done by the parish as a whole, not simply by a group of individuals – we are seeking deeper volunteer engagement, which doesn't necessarily mean more work, but does translate to a deeper engagement in the spiritual aspects of the work. Food will still be available at both parishes for folks in need as we explore the ways in which we can continue to provide meals for the public in September.
