

**Catholic Funerals:** Every baptized Catholic has a right to the prayers of the church at the time of life threatening illness and death even if they have not been practicing their faith up until that time. The parish provides a guide for funeral planning and is prepared to assist at the time of a death in the family. Ordinarily the funeral home will contact the parish to schedule a funeral though families are always welcome to contact the office. Customarily a Catholic funeral has three distinct moments: the vigil prayers, funeral and rite of committal at burial.

**Sacrament of Baptism:** The Catholic custom of baptizing infants is founded upon the testimony of Scripture and Tradition and demonstrates the priority of grace as a gift in the Christian life. Customarily baptism occurs as soon as possible after birth. Please contact th parish office with requests for dates prior to selecting godparents for whom there are some requirements that need documentation.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** Please contact the parish office at least six months prior to a desired wedding date and prior to committing to a reception facility. Parish wedding dates can only be confirmed after meeting with the priest and completing initial documentation establishing a person's freedom to marry as a Catholic. The parish offers marriage preparation which is required in anticipation of the wedding.


# DAILY MASS SCHEDULE

SYNOD ON SYNODALITY

The Synod on Synodality is a two-year process of listening and dialogue beginning with a solemn opening in Rome on October 9 and 10, 2021. Pope Francis has asked Catholic dioceses all over the world to take part in the preparations for the Synod on Synodality that will culminate with its

celebration in Rome in October 2023. # St. Blaise | February 3

You may be familiar with the annual "blessing of throats" that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by taking two candles, crossing them against the throat, and saying the following prayer:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

In honor of those who comfort and care for the sick, Bishop Robert Deeley will celebrate the White Mass for health care professionals and caregivers on Sunday, February 13, at 10:30 a.m. at the Basilica of Saints Peter & Paul on 122 Ash Street in Lewiston. The White Mass blesses and



thanks doctors, nurses, emergency medical technicians, lab technicians, therapists, pharmacists, and others. People of all faiths are encouraged to attend and join in showing our gratitude to this community.

In many dioceses around the country, the White Mass is celebrated on or around February 11, the Memorial of Our Lady of Lourdes and the World Day of Prayer for the Sick. Since 1992, the Catholic Church has celebrated the World Day of Prayer for the Sick to remind the faithful to pray intensely for the sick, reflect on and respond to human suffering, and to recognize and honor all persons who work in health care and serve as caregivers. The White Mass is named for the color of the vestments worn on the day. White is associated with the medical profession.

# **Fuel Assistance Programs**

Once again, this year, there are fuel assistance programs available in both parish communities.

# FOR FRANKLIN COUNTY

The ECU HEAT SHARE program provides <u>one</u> 50-gallon fuel delivery (or equivalent in solid fuel) per household per heating season (November 1 – March 31). Oil, kerosene, wood, pellets, propane are all delivered by the applicant's regular fuel vendor. Each applicant fills in the "\$50 for Heat" application with needed information, attaches a \$50 money order payable to the fuel vendor, and mails or delivers the form to Western Maine Community Action (WMCA) for processing. A delivery is made as soon as the fuel vendor is in the neighborhood again. The balance due for that delivery is paid by ECU HEAT, using funds raised by FAEM for that purpose.

# FOR LIVERMORE AND LIVERMORE FALLS

The FOOD, FUEL AND FIBER FUND provides <u>one</u> 50-gallon fuel delivery (or equivalent in solid fuel) per household per year (October 1—April 30). Oil, kerosene, wood, pellets, propane are all delivered by the applicant's regular fuel vendor. Each applicant fills in the Food, Fuel and Fiber application with needed information, attaches a \$50 money order payable to the fuel vendor, and mails or delivers the form to St. Rose or calls Stephanie Crowe 897-2173 ext 1203 for processing. A delivery is made as soon as the fuel vendor is in the neighborhood again. The balance due for that delivery is paid by St. Rose Food, Fuel and Fiber Fund. If you would like to help a neighbor in need, donations to this program can be sent to St. Rose of Lima – Fuel fund.

There are no income guidelines for either of these programs and applications are available at the entrances of both parish halls.
