**Catholic Funerals:** Every baptized Catholic has a right to the prayers of the church at the time of life threatening illness and death even if they have not been practicing their faith up until that time. The parish provides a guide for funeral planning and is prepared to assist at the time of a death in the family. Ordinarily the funeral home will contact the parish to schedule a funeral though families are always welcome to contact the office. Customarily a Catholic funeral has three distinct moments: the vigil prayers, funeral and rite of committal at burial.

**Sacrament of Baptism:** The Catholic custom of baptizing infants is founded upon the testimony of Scripture and Tradition and demonstrates the priority of grace as a gift in the Christian life. Customarily baptism occurs as soon as possible after birth. Please contact the parish office with requests for dates prior to selecting godparents for whom there are some requirements that need documentation.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** Please contact the parish office at least six months prior to a desired wedding date and prior to committing to a reception facility. Parish wedding dates can only be confirmed after meeting with the priest and completing initial documentation establishing a person's freedom to marry as a Catholic. The parish offers marriage preparation which is required in anticipation of the wedding.

The repair of the granite steps at St. Rose as a cooperative effort with staff and volunteers on the one hand is a practical improvement to the property and on the other hand is an example of the spirit of the parish. Firstly, the repair of the steps leading to the street last fall shed some light on the construction of the front steps as well. The granite steps had become uneven partly because of the corrosion of salt over the decades as well as the wooden shims and imprecision of the original construction. It is fair to say that the newly repaired stairs are better than they were. As one person said, modestly, "when you first looked at the steps it looked like a big job but when you got into it the job was not too bad." Special thanks to Robert St. Pierre, Dennis Couture, Larry Castonguay, Gary Couture, Gary Bryant, Mark DeMillo and Scott Taylor.



Secondly, the large granite blocks used to build the original structure presumably came from the Jay quarry. The ingenuity in the extraction of the granite and the practical skills to use the blocks are expressive of the character of the local people and culture. When you think of the massive undertaking of the reconstruction of the church after the fire of 1946 which consumed the old wooden structure, you cannot but be moved by the motivation, determination and technical expertise involved. This same character was on display in those who assisted with this project. For example the use of manual tools to remove and reset granite blocks weighing approximately 500 pounds is impressive and represents skills locals have acquired in the building of homes and industry. The careful planning and completion of the project in an orderly and timely way is impressive and indicative of intelligent craftsmanship. The motivation to serve the community and those who come to Mass at St. Rose is also impressive. I am grateful. We are grateful for the skill and virtue demonstrated in a project of this magnitude. Thank you. And the guys are grateful for the offer of Donald from Castonguay Meats to smoke a prime rib for a thank you dinner along with some County potatoes and ployes.

May the virtues of this project be a source of inspiration and encouragement for all of us as we look to a renewed participation in parish life as a result of the grace of the season of Easter. Parish life is a kind of work that requires character and skill that both parishes possess. We do well to acknowledge the opportunities for work and prayer within the common life of the parishes as well as the great blessing the parishes are to the surrounding communities.

**Parking notice:** The town of Jay has generously established Church Street as a one way during Mass times. As a result people are able to park diagonally on the north side of Church Street as well as parallel parking on the south side of Church Street. We are grateful for this option throughout the year. Please do not park along Church Street between the Church and the Community Center during the week. Funerals are a reasonable exception. Thanks you for your consideration to the neighbors and public safety.

Recall that parking along Middle Street in front of St. Joseph church is only permitted on one side of the street otherwise public safety vehicles may not be able to pass. Please observe the town parking signs.

## HOLY CROSS CEMETERY

Please be reminded of the rules and regulations that were established a few years ago in an ongoing effort to improve maintenance practices and insure the continued quality and general appearance of Holy Cross Cemetery.

**11-G Urns and Flower Vases** - Placement of approved urns, vases, baskets, boxes and potted plants is restricted to the following locations: one item on either end of the main above-ground monument only. In the event that there is no above ground monument on the lot, one of the items described above may be placed where the above ground monument would be located so as not to obstruct mowing operations.

**11-H Ornaments** - The use of shells, crushed or bleached stones, lawn ornaments, glass containers vigil or perpetual lights, shepherds crooks and tin cans is strictly prohibited. No lawn ornament of any kind as defined shall be allowed. The staff reserves the right to remove without notice any planting or object that is in violation of these regulations, is a hazard to its employees or detrimental to the general appearance of the cemetery.

**12-B Rubbish** - Throwing of rubbish on roads, driveways, paths, walks, or any part of the ground of any cemetery, or its buildings, is prohibited. All rubbish (including organic) must be removed from the cemetery by those persons generating the rubbish.

Please note that there is no water at the cemetery. Needed changes were made regarding the electricity, which means we are not able to run the pump that provides the water.

In our continuing effort to keep our staff and visitors safe, please remember the new rules and regulations that were adopted. All items that are deemed unsafe, such as solar lights and shepherds crooks will be placed by the shed for owners to pick up.

For a copy of the rules & regulations, please contact the parish office or copies are available at the work shed at the cemetery.

Thank you for your cooperation in helping the staff maintain the beauty and dignity of our cemetery.

## Prison Ministry Gathering in Waterville and Online on June 10

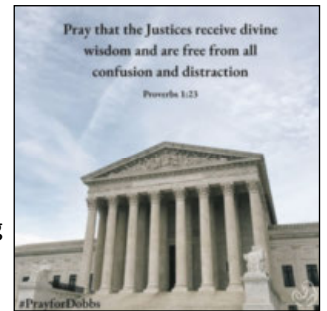
