

**Catholic Funerals:** Every baptized Catholic has a right to the prayers of the church at the time of life threatening illness and death even if they have not been practicing their faith up until that time. The parish provides a guide for funeral planning and is prepared to assist at the time of a death in the family. Ordinarily the funeral home will contact the parish to schedule a funeral though families are always welcome to contact the office. Customarily a Catholic funeral has three distinct moments: the vigil prayers, funeral and rite of committal at burial.

**Sacrament of Baptism:** The Catholic custom of baptizing infants is founded upon the testimony of Scripture and Tradition and demonstrates the priority of grace as a gift in the Christian life. Customarily baptism occurs as soon as possible after birth. Please contact the parish office with requests for dates prior to selecting godparents for whom there are some requirements that need documentation.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** Please contact the parish office at least six months prior to a desired wedding date and prior to committing to a reception facility. Parish wedding dates can only be confirmed after meeting with the priest and completing initial documentation establishing a person's freedom to marry as a Catholic. The parish offers marriage preparation which is required in anticipation of the wedding.



Have you also noticed that the demeanor of passengers varies depending on whether you are traveling by train, airplane or bus? Of course in these days there is an added dynamic but over the years (I can say that

now that I am fifty) I have observed that travel on buses has a certain quality. The quarters are tight and people may be on a budget. People seem to move to the back of the bus and take the aisle seat to try to mark their territory and minimize interaction, I suppose, because personal space bubble can be pretty small in a coach bus. Comparatively, the bus seems the least congenial of the three. Airplane travel is sort of stressful for many. While it is arguably the most efficient it can be high stress, expensive, hurried and I wonder if that is why people seem polite but not so talkative—business like—in my experience. Something about traveling by train seems more humane, efficient yet leisurely. People seem more comfortable and congenial by train which conduces to a kind of conversation whereby people are traveling alongside each other—accompanying each other. Train travel is a good analogy for parish life. And as we exit the Easter season and (God willing) emerging from the covid cloud. As we do so we want to be in conversation that is open, honest and congenial about where we are at with staffing, budgeting, volunteers, parishioners, guests, parish life for the summer and pastoral planning for the future. Thank you for your commitment to parish life and activity these days and let us draw on the grace of Easter as we walk along the Way.

# Prison Ministry Gathering in Waterville and Online on June 10



### St. Norbert | June 6



Born to nobility, St. Norbert of Xanten, was ordained as a subdeacon and served in the court of Henry V, Emperor of Germany, however, at court it was easy to be distracted by wealth, power and luxury and he lived a worldly and corrupt life there. By the grace of God while traveling in a storm he was nearly struck by lightning and almost ORBERT killed. This experience changed St. Norbert and he became penitent, left his court post, and after a period of discernment in a monastery, felt called

to be a priest.

Norbert became an itinerant preacher, preaching against worldly attitudes but at the Pope's request finally settled in northern France and founded the Norbertine order established according to the rule of St. Augustine. The order grew rapidly and soon founded women's branch. Norbert traveled and preached across Germany where he also founded a lay branch of the Norbertines. In Belgium he preached against heresies which denied the Blessed Sacrament.

Eventually he was made Archbishop of Magdeburg, Germany, and later he traveled to Rome in support of Pope Innocent II, against the antipope. Afterward he returned to Germany to court of Emperor Lothar as advisor, at end of life, in failing health, St. Norbert was carried back to Magdeburg where he

# **Corpus Christi Processions**



On the weekend of June 18-19, Corpus Christi Sunday (the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ), we will have outside Eucharistic Processions in both parishes.

At St. Rose, on Saturday, June 18, the Procession will begin immediately after the 4:00 PM Mass.

At St. Joseph, on Sunday, June 19, the procession will begin immediately following the 10:30 AM Mass. Adoration will continue in the main church following the procession until Benediction at 4:45 PM.

Processions on Corpus Christi began in the 14<sup>th</sup> century and are approved and recommended as a public profession of the Catholic faith in the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. These processions are reverent and sacred, with the priest carrying the monstrance containing the Blessed Sacrament, accompanied by altar servers with lighted candles and incense, followed by parishioners in solemn procession. Children scatter flower petals before the Blessed Sacrament and the priest stops at altars decorated with candles and flowers along the processional route, to pray and adore the Blessed Sacrament.

Please consider joining us for this special devotion on this Feast honoring the Real Presence of Our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament.


