Divine Mercy Sunday

Question: Where did the feast of Divine Mercy come from?

Answer: If you were born well before the year 2000, you know the feast of Divine Mercy has not always been celebrated in the Church. In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers — the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world.

Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young women, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, "a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind with experience in the years to come."

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Priest's Corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord,

Happy Easter! As we celebrate the 2nd Sunday of Easter more popularly known as Divine Mercy Sunday. We conclude today the Divine Mercy novena begun on Good Friday. We see the Divine Mercy image is the Resurrected Christ. In the Divine Mercy Image we see the two rays pouring out of the side of Christ, one red and the other blue. These two rays spring forth from the open heart of Christ, much like the blood and water which came forth from His pierced side.

This devotion comes from a private revelation to Sr. Faustina, a young Polish nun in Krakow. Her convent is not particularly large and if not for her presence and this apparition it would not be particularly important. I have been blessed to visit the Shrine several times and it is noteworthy that is a little out of the way in the city. Krakow is a beautiful and ancient city, but her convent isn't by the Cathedral or main square or the university or the cultural hubs. No, the convent is in a more industrial area, up on a hill out of the way. Much like the message of Divine Mercy it is humble but powerful.

Sr. Faustina received this image and mission to spread devotion to Divine Mercy between 1931 and her death at 33 years old in 1938. The call for Divine Mercy Sunday was given to her in 1936 in Krakow. What is so striking is that not 2 hours away is the site of one of the greatest atrocities the world has ever seen, Auschwitz. Divine Mercy stands in stark contrast with such awful death and despair. The Lord prepared her, and the world, to receive life and hope from Him.

But what are those promises that provide such hope. Christ gave 14 to St. Faustina, but I'm going to copy four here:

"The two rays denote Blood and Water...These two rays issued from the very depths of My tender mercy when My agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross. These rays shield souls from the wrath of My Father...I desire that the first Sunday after Easter be the Feast of Mercy...whoever approaches the Fount of Life on this day will be granted complete remission of sins and punishment. Mankind will not have peace until it turns with trust to My mercy." (Diary of St. Faustina, 299-300)

"I desire that the Feast of Mercy...be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter...The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion (in a state of grace on this day) shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." (Diary of St. Faustina, 699)

"The souls that say this chaplet will be embraced by My mercy during their lifetime and especially at the hour of their death." (Diary of St. Faustina, 754)

"The prayer most pleasing to Me is prayer for the conversion for sinners. Know, my daughter, that this prayer is always heard and answered." (Diary of St. Faustina, 1397)

We should take these words seriously and place our trust in them.

Who Can Offer Anointing of the Sick?

Question: Can anyone offer the Anointing of the Sick to a sick or dying person, or is that only something a priest can do?

Answer: The Letter of James speaks to us of the ancient tradition of a special anointing and blessing of those who are sick: "Is there anyone sick among you? Let him send for the presbyters of the Church and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord ... If he has committed any sins, they will be forgiven him" (5:14, 15b). This passage forms the foundation for the theology of the sacrament that we call "Anointing of the Sick." In keeping with what we read in the Letter of James and the ancient tradition of the Church, the anointing of a person of who sick or dying many only be performed by a priest or bishop.

Although deacons and other members of the Church are not able to celebrate the sacrament with a person who is sick, we can read Sacred Scripture and pray with and for those who are ill. Resources like the Book of Blessings also contain special blessings that can be celebrated by deacons or lay ministers. In the end, we want to be sure that we show a special care and concern for the sick, helping them to always experience God's loving comfort through made tangible through our acts of charity and service.
