# Priest's Corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we enter the month of June which is devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, we ought to give thanks to have our parish named after such a wonderful image of the love of God for us. I feel extremely blessed to have had an assignment here at Sacred Heart, because from my college years I have had a very deep devotion to this apparition. Rather than recount the history of the Lord revealing His Heart to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, I want to focus on the characteristics of the image that I think are worth bringing to prayer.

The first thing to meditate upon is that the Sacred Heart isn't just a singular image, but comes in several forms. Much like our Blessed Mother has shown herself in various ways and in various cultures (e.g., Our Lady of Guadalupe, Lourdes, Fatima), the Sacred Heart comes with slight varieties. Even in our own parish, we have an image at the front with the Heart alone, but in the stained glass above the altar the Heart is situated in the body of Christ. It doesn't mean one is incorrect, just different ways to get to a deeper reality.

But a few characteristics are always true of an image of the Sacred Heart including that is always pierced, always has the crown of thorns, and is always crowned.

The pierced nature of the Heart is the invitation to enter into Heart of God. The historical reality of the pierced side of Christ that allows blood and water to pour out as a "fount of mercy for us" (see the Divine Mercy chaplet). From that side His Love is poured out on us and we can be drawn closer to Him.

The crown of thorns is always present somewhere in an image of the Sacred Heart. To remind us of the mockery that Christ underwent on the Cross so that we also know that there is no shame that cannot be overcome. His great Love suffered through it and all the physical sufferings for our sake.

The final quality is that the Heart is always crowned. This shows His Kingship over Heaven and Earth. It cannot be overstated that it is from His great Love of the World that He has conquered all things (John 16:33).

In this simple image we can meditate on so much. How blessed are we to be immersed in this image in our parish!

### Pentecost Voice



The Holy Spirit, who came on Pentecost, gave voice to the apostles to proclaim the truth of the Gospel. The Spirit, the Soul of the Church, continues to enable the Church to speak, and enables us to speak in our individual capacity. As the late Cardinal Elio Sgreccia, former President of the Vatican's

Pontifical Academy for Life once said, "The Church must speak out in today's context on fundamental rights, the right to life. If the Church did not speak, did not proclaim the truth, it would be abandoning its duty; it would be unfaithful to society, to the good of society. Therefore, its precise duty is the very liberty to intervene with word, and also with example-the example of promoting human life, of intervening for the salvation of mankind."

The Holy Spirit, the "Lord and Giver of Life", brings us back to our truest selves as He illumines us regarding the sanctity of life. The Spirit brings many gifts, and one of them is to enable us to see creation in its proper relationship to God, including the crowning of His creation, the gift of human life.

When we do not have this light of the Holy Spirit, the law we have to follow seems like an imposition from the outside that limits our freedom. That's what people in the world sometimes feel about our attitude toward abortion and euthanasia. They think we are "restricting rights". But when the Holy Spirit fills us, He gives us an inner attraction to all that is right and good, so that we do not feel pushed where we would rather not go, but rather pulled by the attractiveness of what is good and right.

The Holy Spirit is also the Advocate who pleads our cause. When He fills us, He makes us advocates for all our brothers and sisters in need, including the most vulnerable, the unborn.
